The Secretary of State for India in Council has appointed Mr. John Thomas Cullen, Deputy Superintendent, Mercantile Marine Office, Manchester, to superintend the transfer of lascars or other persons, and to grant the certificate required under Section 125 of the Merchant Shipping Act, 1894 (57 & 58 Vict., cap. 60).

The fee to be paid for every lascar, or other person, in respect of whom such certificate is applied for, is limited to three shillings, and in no case is the total amount of fees in respect of one crew to exceed five pounds.

ORDER OF THE MINISTER OF AGRICULTURE AND FISHERIES.

(DATED 25TH MARCH, 1931.)

ANIMALS (LANDING FROM IRELAND, CHANNEL ISLANDS AND ISLE OF MAN) (AMENDMENT) ORDER OF 1931.

The Minister of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in him under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1927, and of every other power enabling him in this behalf, hereby orders as follows:—

Transhipment.

1. The transhipment at a port in Great Britain of animals brought from Ireland, the Channel Islands and the Isle of Man, is hereby prohibited, unless such transhipment is authorised by a licence granted by an Inspector or other Officer of the Ministry, and subject to such conditions if any as may be prescribed therein.

Short Title.

2. This Order may be cited as the Animals (Landing from Ireland, Channel Islands and Isle of Man) (Amendment) Order of 1931, and shall be read with the Animals (Landing from
