FOOT-AND-MOUTH DISEASE (INFECTED AREAS) ORDER OF 1931 (No. 9).

The Minister of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in him under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1927, and of every other power enabling him in this behalf, hereby orders as follows:-

Declaration of Foot-and-Mouth Disease Infected Area.

1. The Area described in the Schedule to this Order is hereby declared to be a Footand-Mouth Disease Infected Area for the purposes of the Foot-and-Mouth Disease (Infected Areas Restrictions) Order of 1925.

Contraction of Foot-and-Mouth Disease Infected Area described in the Foot-and-Mouth Disease (Infected Areas) Order of 1931 (No. 7).

2. So much of the Area described in the Schedule to this Order as is contained in the Area described in the Schedule to the Footand-Mouth Disease (Infected Areas) Order of 1931 (No. 7) shall be excluded from and cease to form part of the Infected Area described in the Schedule to that Order.

Short Title.

3. This Order may be cited as the FOOT-AND-Mouth Disease (Infected Areas) Order of 1931 (No. 9) and shall be read with the Order referred to in Article 1.

FOOT-AND-MOUTH DISEASE (INFECTED AREAS) ORDER OF 1931 (No. 10).

The Minister of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in him under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1927, and of every other power enabling him in this behalf, hereby orders as follows:

Contraction of Menston (Leeds) Foot-and-Mouth Disease Infected Area.

1.-(1) The Foot-and-Mouth Disease (Infected Areas) Order of 1931 (No. 7) shall be read and have effect as if the Area described in the First Schedule to this Order were substituted for the Infected Area described in the Schedule to that Order, as amended by the Foot-and-Mouth Disease (Infected Areas) Order of 1931 (No. 9).

(2) This Article shall come into operation on the twenty-ninth day of March, nineteen
