1931 REVIEW OF STANDARD CHARGES AND
EXCEPTIONAL CHARGES.

NOTICE is hereby given that the Railway Rates Tribunal will sit at 10.30 a.m. on Monday, 11th May, 1931, in Court "B", Judges Quadrangle, Royal Courts of Justice, London, W.C. 2, to review the Standard Charges and Exceptional Charges of each of the Amalgamated Companies pursuant to the provisions of Section 59 of the Railways Act 1921.

Notice is further given that the Accounts and Statements relative to such Review lodged with the Tribunal by the said Amalgamated Companies may be inspected at the Office of the Registrar, 2, Clement's Inn, London, W.C. 2, at any time during office hours. Copies of the Statements lodged by each of the four Amalgamated Companies (price 7s. 6d. each, or £1 10s. per set, post free) may be obtained, on prepayment, from Mr. G. Cole Deacon, 35, Parliament Street, Westminster, S.W. 1.

Any body or person desiring to make any Objection or Submission relative to the Review must file a Notice of their or his Objection or Submission with the Registrar of the Court on or before Tuesday, 28th April, 1931. A separate Notice must be filed in relation to each Amalgamated Company.

Each Notice must be on foolscap size paper and must state concisely the ground or grounds of such Objection or Submission, and must be stamped with an adhesive fee stamp for 2s. 6d. (which can only be purchased at the office of the Tribunal). If sent by post each Notice must be accompanied by a Postal Order for 2s. 6d. payable to the Railway Rates Tribunal, when a stamp will be affixed at the office. Five additional copies of each Notice must be lodged with the original at the office of the Registrar.

Only the Amalgamated Companies and any body or person filing such Notice of Objection or Submission as aforesaid will be entitled to apply to be heard on the Review.

NORTH KILLINGHOLME (ADMIRALTY
PIER).

NOTICE is hereby given that application is intended to be made to Parliament in the present Session for an Act for all or some of the following purposes (that is to say):—

Construction and maintenance in Parish of North Killingholme in rural district of Glandford Brigg in the Parts of Lindsey in the County of Lincoln, of two open pilework dolphins and two gangways at or near the head of the pier or jetty authorised by the North Killingholme (Admiralty Pier) Act, 1912 (in this Notice called "the Pier"), a vertical fender or vertical fendering along, and an extension or widening of the head of the Pier for its whole length and a row of raking piles

along the whole of the south-western side of the head of the Pier.

Acquisition by compulsion or agreement and use of lands, rights or easements, in the said parish and elsewhere and easements or rights in the River Humber and the bed shores and channel thereof.

Deepening dredging scouring cleansing alteration and improvement of the bed shores and channel of the River Humber adjoining or near to the before mentioned works.

Agreements between the Admiralty, the Humber Conservancy Board and the Board of Trade or any two or more of them as to the construction maintenance and user of the before mentioned works and other works or operations affecting the bed shores and channel of the River Humber.

Amendment or incorporation of the Lands Clauses Acts, Acquisition of Land (Assessment of Compensation) Act, 1919, Admiralty Lands and Works Act, 1864, the said Act of 1912 or any Act amending any of those Acts.

On or before the 21st day of April next plans and sections of the intended works and plans of the lands which may be taken compulsorily with a book of reference to such plans will be deposited with the Clerk of the County Council for the Parts of Lindsey in the County of Lincoln at his office at Lincoln, with the Clerk of the Rural District Council of Glandford Brigg at his office and with the Clerk of the Parish Council of the Parish of North Killingholme at his office, or, if he have no office, at his residence, or if there be no Clerk, with the Chairman of that Council at his residence.

A notice stating more fully the objects of the intended Act has been published or sent for publication in the Lincolnshire Echo of the 31st March and 7th April, 1931.

CHARTERED ASSOCIATIONS (PROTECTION OF NAMES AND UNIFORMS) ACT, 1926.

NOTICE is hereby given that the British Legion being an Association incorporated by Royal Charter dated the 21st February, 1925, and not being an Association representative of any profession or business have applied to His Majesty that an Order in Council may be made under Section 1 subsection 1 of the above Act to protect:—

(a) The name British Legion.

(b) The following badges to be worn without uniform:—

(1) *General Badge for Male Members.*
