

framing is the device of a lion's head in face view in pewter-coloured metal; the whole of the scroll work being bordered in gold.

(2) *Badge for Honorary Male Members.*

This consists of a double scroll framing, the upper scroll with its ends inturned and the lower scroll suspended from such inturned ends, the upper scroll bearing the word "British" and the lower scroll the word "Legion" in gold lettering on a blue enamel ground. Within the scroll framing is a crossbar extending from side to side of the upper scroll, the ends filleted into the border of the scroll, an upward projection at the centre of the crossbar in the shape of the top of a shield and a lower projection of lozenge shape, the crossbar bearing the word "Honorary," in gold lettering on a white enamel ground; the whole of the scroll work and crossbar being bordered in gold.

(3) *Badge for Members of the Women's Section.*

This consists of a double scroll framing, the upper scroll with its ends inturned and the lower scroll suspended from such inturned ends, the upper scroll bearing the word "British" and the lower scroll the word "Legion" in gold lettering on a blue enamel ground. Within the scroll framing is the device of a lion's head in face view in pewter-coloured metal. The whole surmounted by an additional scroll with upturned ends bearing the words "Women's Section" in gold lettering on a blue enamel ground; the whole of the scroll work being bordered in gold.

(4) *Badge for Honorary Members of the Women's Section.*

This consists of a double scroll framing, the upper scroll with its ends inturned and

the lower scroll suspended from such inturned ends, the upper scroll bearing the word "British" and the lower scroll the word "Legion" in gold lettering on a blue enamel ground. Within the scroll framing is a crossbar extending from side to side of the upper scroll, the ends filleted into the border of the scroll, an upward projection at the centre of the crossbar in the shape of the top of a shield and a lower projection of lozenge shape, the crossbar bearing the word "Honorary" in gold lettering on a white enamel ground; the whole surmounted by an additional scroll with upturned ends bearing the words "Women's Section" in gold lettering on a blue enamel ground; the whole of the scroll work being bordered in gold.

And notice is hereby further given that any person or Society considering they are affected or likely to be affected by the Order applied for may by notice in writing addressed to the Under-Secretary of State, Home Office, Whitehall, London, S.W., specify their objections to such application within one month from the 31st day of March, 1931, being the date of the first publication in England and Wales and the 3rd day of April, 1931, being the date of the first publication in Scotland and that in the absence of any such objection being made and received by the said Under-Secretary of State within the time aforesaid an Order in Council sanctioning the same application will be made.
