which has not been removed from a bonded warehouse before that date, shall be exempt from the duty imposed by Section one of the Safeguarding of Industries Act, 1921, as amended by the Finance Act, 1926, for a period ending on the 31st day of December, 1931.

2. This Order may be cited as the Safeguarding of Industries (Exemption) No. 2 Order, 1931.
