WHEREAS on 1st August, 1930, the Secretary-General of the League of Nations communicated to His Majesty's Government a certified copy of a draft Convention concerning Forced or Compulsory Labour which had been adopted by the International Labour Conference at Geneva on 28th June, 1930:

And whereas it is provided in Article 405 of the Treaty of Versailles that in the case of a draft Convention so communicated each Member of the International Labour Organisation shall, if such draft Convention obtains the consent of the authority or authorities within whose competence the matter lies, communicate the formal ratification thereof to the Secretary-General of the League of Nations:

And whereas the said draft Convention has in respect of Great Britain and Northern Ireland obtained the consent of the authority or authorities within whose competence the matter lies and such action as is necessary to make the provisions of the said draft Convention effective therein has been taken:

And whereas it is intended to apply the provisions of the said draft Convention without modification to all the Colonies, Protectorates and Mandated Territories which are not fully self-governing, a list of which is subjoined:

Now, therefore, the Lords of the Council are pleased to order, and it is hereby ordered, that the said draft Convention be confirmed and approved.

And it is further ordered that formal communication thereof be made to the Secretary-General of the League of Nations.

Omnibus Company Limited, or Thomas Tilling Limited, who is maintaining at the date hereof a regular service in accordance with Section 6 of the London Traffic Act, 1924, on week-days upon any approved route, from using, for the purpose of plying for hire along a restricted street or part thereof in the maintenance of a regular service on the approved route on Saturday and Tuesday the 23rd and 26th days of May, 1931, in addition to the number of omnibuses which he may operate in that street or part thereof under the said Regulations a number equal to ten per cent. of the total number of omnibuses (excluding spare vehicles) scheduled by him at the date hereof for operation upon approved routes, provided that where such person ordinarily operates less than 10 omnibuses he shall be allowed so to operate one additional omnibus;

provided that nothing herein contained shall be deemed to affect or derogate from the powers of the Commissioner of Police of the Metropolis under the provisions of Section 52 of the Metropolitan Police Act, 1839, to give directions to constables for keeping order and for preventing any obstruction to the thoroughfares.
