day preceding that on which the officer may become due for compulsory retirement, and provided also that the option, once exercised, shall be final.

'' The Commissioners of Your Lords Majesty's Treasury have signified their con-currence in this proposal."

His Majesty, having taken the said Memorial into consideration, was pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to approve of what is therein proposed.

And the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty are to give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

THEREAS there was this day read at the ♥♥ Board a Memorial from the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, dated the 21st day of April, 1931 (N. 496/31), in the words following, viz. :-

"Whereas by Section 3 of the Naval and Marine Pay and Pensions Act, 1865, it is enacted *inter alia* that all pay, pensions or other allowances in the nature thereof payable in respect of services in your Majesty's Naval or Marine Force to a person being or having been an Officer, Seaman or Marine therein shall be paid in such manner and subject to such restrictions, conditions and provisions as are from time to time directed by Order in Council:

"And whereas we consider that for greater efficiency it is expedient to take steps to amalgamate, as regards future entrants, the Officers' Cook and Ship's Cook branches of the Royal Navy, which now have separate systems of entry, training and advancement, by the creation of a new Naval Cook Branch:

"We beg leave humbly to recommend that Your Majesty may be graciously pleased, by Your Order in Council, to approve the establishment as from the first day of April, 1931, of a new branch of the Royal Navy, with titles and rates of pay as shown in the attached Schedule, and the immediate substitution of the new Officer titles for those at present in use by the corresponding ranks of the existing establishment.

" The Lords Commissioners of Your Majesty's Treasury have signified their concurrence in these proposals.
