

of 3½ chains or thereabouts to its junction with Ayton Street, and extending thence eastward along the middle of Ayton Street for a distance of 21½ chains or thereabouts to its junction with Clifford Road, and extending thence northward along the middle of Clifford Road for a distance of 2 chains or thereabouts to a point opposite to the middle of the roadway leading into Allendale Street, and extending thence eastward to and along the middle of such roadway for a distance of 6 chains or thereabouts to its junction with Allendale Street, and extending thence southward along the middle of Allendale Street (thereby following in part the boundary which divides the said New Parish of Byker from the said New Parish of Saint Anthony, Byker) for a distance in all of 26 chains or thereabouts to its junction with Walker Road opposite to the northern end of the fence forming the eastern boundary of certain allotment gardens and extending thence southward to and along such fence for a distance of 6½ chains or thereabouts to the point where such fence reaches the northern side of the roadway or footpath leading from the premises known as Bird's Nest into Gibb Street, and extending thence in a straight line due south (thereby crossing the said roadway or footpath and the said Riverside Branch Line of the London and North Eastern Railway) for a distance of 7¾ chains or thereabouts to a point in the middle of the River Tyne upon the boundary which divides the said New Parish of Saint Anthony, Byker, from the said New Parish of Saint James, Gateshead."

And whereas the said Representation has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said Representation, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts.

And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of Newcastle.

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Union of Benefices Measure, 1923, duly prepared, and laid before His Majesty in Council, a Supplementary Scheme bearing date the 25th day of June, 1931, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, acting in pursuance of the Union of Benefices Measure, 1923, have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council, the following Supplementary Scheme, under the 11th Section of that Measure, with

reference to the Order of Your Majesty in Council dated the 14th day of August, 1928, and published in the London Gazette upon the same day, for effecting the unions (a) of the Benefice of Bromyard and part of the Benefice of Avenbury, and (b) of the Benefice of Stoke Lacy and the remaining part of the said Benefice of Avenbury, all which Benefices are situate in the County of Hereford and in the Diocese of Hereford:

"Whereas by the said Order of Your Majesty in Council it was directed (a) that the said Benefice of Bromyard and a part of the said Benefice of Avenbury should be united under the style of 'The Benefice of Bromyard' (hereinafter referred to as the United Benefice of Bromyard) and (b) that the said Benefice of Stoke Lacy and the remaining part of the said Benefice of Avenbury should be united under the style of 'The Benefice of Stoke Lacy' (hereinafter referred to as the United Benefice of Stoke Lacy) and further that with the consent of the said Philip Austen Lushington (such consent being duly testified) the said unions should take effect upon the then next avoidance of that one of the said two Benefices of Avenbury and Stoke Lacy which should last be avoided after the date of the publication in the London Gazette of the said Order of Your Majesty in Council:

"And whereas on the day of the date of the said Order of Your Majesty in Council all of the said Benefices of Bromyard, Avenbury and Stoke Lacy were full, the Reverend Prebendary Philip Austen Lushington being Incumbent of the said Benefice of Bromyard, the Reverend Edward Henry Archer-Shepherd being Incumbent of the said Benefice of Avenbury, and the Reverend Prebendary Henry George Morgan being Incumbent of the said Benefice of Stoke Lacy:

"And whereas the said Philip Austen Lushington and the said Henry George Morgan are still Incumbents of the said Benefices of Bromyard and Stoke Lacy respectively but the said Benefice of Avenbury is now vacant:

"And whereas it has been represented to us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, and it appears to us to be expedient that the event upon the happening of which the said unions would become effective as aforesaid should be altered as hereinafter recommended and proposed:

"And whereas the said Philip Austen Lushington and the said Henry George Morgan are consenting to this Scheme:

"Now, therefore, we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, with the consent of the Right Reverend Lisle, Bishop of Hereford (in testimony whereof he has signed this Scheme), and with the consents of the said Philip Austen Lushington and Henry George Morgan (in testimony whereof they have respectively signed this Scheme), do humbly recommend and propose to Your Majesty as follows, that is to say:—

"That the provisions of the said Order in Council of the 14th day of August, 1928, in regard to the taking effect of the said unions shall be altered as follows, that is to say, the said unions shall take effect immediately upon the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council affirming this present Scheme, and the said Philip
