WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Union of Benefices Measure, 1923, duly prepared, and laid before His Majesty in Council, a Scheme bearing date the 25th day of June, 1931, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, acting in pursuance of the Union of Benefices Measure, 1923, have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council, the following Scheme for effecting the union of the Benefice (being a Rectory) of Michelmersh, the Benefice (being a Vicarage) of Timsbury, and the Benefice (being a Rectory) of Eldon, all of which Benefices are situate in the County of Southampton and in the Diocese of Winchester:

"Whereas Commissioners appointed at our request by the Right Reverend Theodore, Bishop of Winchester, pursuant to the provisions of the said Union of Benefices Measure, 1923, to inquire into and report upon the union of the said three Benefices of Michelmersh, Timsbury and Eldon duly made their Report to the said Bishop of Winchester and therein recommended the union of the said three Benefices and the terms for effecting the union including certain alterations of boundaries affecting the Parishes of the said Benefices of Michelmersh and Timsbury and the Parish of the Benefice of Romsey, in the same County and Diocese, and the said Bishop of Winchester signified in writing his approval of the said Report:

"And whereas we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, have prepared

this Scheme for the said union of Benefices based upon the terms recommended in the said Report:

"And whereas the said Benefices of Michelmersh and Eldon are now full, being held in plurality by the Reverend William Charles Hawksley under the authority of a Dispensation, and the said Benefice of Timsbury is at present vacant:

"And whereas the share of the Patronage of the United Benefice when the union which is hereinafter recommended and proposed shall take effect which upon a fair and just apportionment would be assignable in respect of the respective interests of the Patrons of the said Benefices of Timsbury and Eldon would in our opinion be negligible:

"Now, therefore, we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, with the consent of the said Theodore, Bishop of Winchester (in testimony whereof he has signed this Scheme), and with the consent of the said William Charles Hawksley (testified by his signing this Scheme), do humbly recommend and propose to Your Majesty as follows, that is to say:—

"1. That the said Benefice of Michelmersh the said Benefice of Timsbury and the said Benefice of Eldon shall be permanently united together and form one Benefice with cure of souls under the style of 'The United Benefice of Michelmersh with Timsbury and Eldon' but the Parishes of the said Benefices shall continue distinct in all respects.

"2. That upon the day when any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme shall be published in the London Gazette the union shall forthwith take effect and the said William Charles Hawksley if he is then Incumbent of the said Benefices of Michelmersh and Eldon shall be the first Incumbent of the United Benefice.

"3. That upon the said union taking effect the Parsonage House at present belonging to the said Benefice of Michelmersh shall become and be the house of residence for the Incumbent of the United Benefice.

"4. That after the said union has taken effect the Patronage of the United Benefice shall belong wholly to the Patron of the said Benefice of Michelmersh.

"5. That upon the first vacation of the United Benefice provision shall be made by the Incumbent of the United Benefice for obtaining the services of a Curate or occasional clerical or lay assistance and a portion of the endowments of the United Benefice namely the whole of the Tithe Rent Charge and other endowments of the said Benefice of Michelmersh shall be charged with a sum of £100 per annum as a fund to meet the expenses of providing for the services of a Curate or for occasional clerical or lay assistance as aforesaid which said fund of £100 per annum shall be held and administered by the Incumbent of the United Benefice but shall be applicable only to the purposes aforesaid, provided that it shall be lawful for the Bishop of the Diocese if he thinks proper at any time and from time to time to direct that the said charge of £100 per annum shall be paid by the Incumbent of the United Benefice to the Diocesan Board of Finance of the Diocese as trustees to apply the same for the purpose of paying the stipend of a Curate or

the expense of occasional clerical or lay assistance as aforesaid.

"6. That with the consent of the said Theodore, Bishop of Winchester (testified as aforesaid), as Patron of the said Benefice of Romsey and with the consent of the Reverend William Henry Birch Corban as the present Incumbent of the said Benefice of Romsey testified by his signing this Scheme), upon the union taking effect there shall be transferred and annexed for all ecclesiastical purposes to the Parish of the said Benefice of Romsey (a) all that detached portion of the Parish of the said Benefice of Timsbury containing 24 acres or thereabouts which lies to the east of the stream called Fish Lake at an approximate average distance of 36 chains to the north of Romsey Railway Station; (b) all that detached portion of the Parish of the said Benefice of Michelmersh containing 8 acres or thereabouts which lies to the south east of the Duke's Head Public House; (c) all that detached portion of the Parish of the said Benefice of Michelmersh containing 19 acres or thereabouts lying at an approximate average distance of 13 chains to the east of Great Bridge; and (d) all that detached portion of the Parish of the said Benefice of Michelmersh containing 6 acres or thereabouts lying about a quarter of a mile to the south east of Palmer's Copse.

"Provided always that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them, in accordance with the provisions of the said Measure, or of any other Measure of the National Assembly of the Church of England, or of any Act of Parliament."

And whereas drafts of the said Scheme have been duly published in accordance with the provisions of the said Union of Benefices Measure, 1923, and Notices have been transmitted to the persons or bodies entitled under the same Measure to receive Notice requiring any objections to such draft Scheme to be stated or transmitted in writing to the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners within the time prescribed in the Statutory Rules applicable to proceedings under the said Union of Benefices Measure, 1923:

And whereas the prescribed time has elapsed and no such objections have been so stated or transmitted to the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners:

And whereas public notice of the certification to His Majesty in Council of the said Scheme and the consent thereto in writing of the Bishop of Winchester has been duly given in the manner and within the time prescribed in the Statutory Rules aforesaid:

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to affirm the said Scheme and to order that the Benefices therein recommended to be united shall be united to the extent and for the purposes recommended in the said Scheme, and further to order and direct that the said Scheme and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the date when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Measure.

And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of Winchester.

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Union of Benefices Measure, 1923, duly prepared, and laid before His Majesty in Council, a Scheme bearing date the 25th day of June, 1931, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, acting in pursuance of the Union of Benefices Measure, 1923, have prepared and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council the following Scheme for effecting the union of the Benefice (being a Vicarage) of Framsden and the Benefice (being a Vicarage) of Cretingham, both of which Benefices are situate in the County of Suffolk and in the Diocese of Saint Edmundsbury and Ipswich:

"Whereas Commissioners appointed at our request by the Right Reverend Walter Godfrey, Bishop of Saint Edmundsbury and Ipswich, pursuant to the provisions of the said Union of Benefices Measure, 1923, to inquire into and report upon the union of the said two Benefices of Framsden and Cretingham duly made their Report to the said Bishop of Saint Edmundsbury and Ipswich and therein recommended the union of the said two Benefices and the terms for effecting the union, and the said Bishop of Saint Edmundsbury and Ipswich signified in writing his approval of the said Report:

"And whereas we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, have prepared this Scheme for the union of the said two Benefices, based upon the terms recommended in the said Report:

"And whereas both the said Benefices of Framsden and Cretingham are now full, being held in plurality by the Reverend Bertram Henry Meeres under the authority of a Dispensation:

"Now, therefore, we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, with the consent of the said Walter Godfrey, Bishop of Saint Edmundsbury and Ipswich (in testimony whereof he has signed this Scheme), and with the consent of the said Bertram Henry Meeres (testified by his signing this Scheme), do humbly recommend and propose to Your Majesty as follows, that is to say:—

"1. That the said Benefice of Framsden and the said Benefice of Cretingham shall be permanently united together and form one Benefice with cure of souls under the style of 'The United Benefice of Framsden with Cretingham' and that such United Benefice shall be included in and form part of the Rural Deanery of Claydon, but the Parishes of the said Benefices shall continue distinct in all respects.

"2. That upon the day when any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme shall be published in the London Gazette, the union shall forthwith take effect, and the said Bertram Henry Meeres, if he is then the Incumbent of both of the said Benefices of Framsden and Cretingham, shall become the first Incumbent of the United Benefice, and his admission thereto shall be without any form or fee of or for presentation or nomination, and he shall not be required to pay any fees in respect of his collation, institution, licence, or induction to the United Benefice beyond such fees as he would have been liable to pay if his admission to the United Benefice had been an admission solely to that one of the said two Benefices for the holding of which in plurality with the other a Dispensation was heretofore granted to him, and for the purpose of the 5th Section of the Incumbents' Resignation Act, 1871, and of Schedule A thereto, his tenure of the said Benefices of Framsden and Cretingham shall be deemed to continue notwithstanding his admission to the United Benefice.

"3. That upon the said union taking effect the Parsonage House at present belonging to the said Benefice of Framsden shall become and be the house of residence for the Incumbent of the United Benefice.

"4. That after the said union has taken effect the course and succession in which the respective Patrons shall present or nominate to the United Benefice from time to time as the same shall become vacant shall be as follows, that is to say, that in every series of three successive turns of presentation or nomination to be made to the United Benefice after the union the Patrons of the said Benefice of Framsden shall have the first and the third turns and the Patron of the said Benefice of Cretingham shall have the second turn.

"Provided always that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them, in accordance with the provisions of the said Measure, or of any other Measure, or of the National Assembly of the Church of England, or of any Act of Parliament."
