WORKMEN'S COMPENSATION ACTS, 1925 TO 1930.

The Secretary of State for the Home Department announces that in response to an application from the Scottish Master Plasterers' Association, he proposes to make a Special Scheme under Section 47 of the Workmen's Compensation Act, 1925, as extended by the Workmen's Compensation (Silicosis and Asbestosis) Act, 1930, providing for compensation in respect of the disease known as Silicosis for workmen employed in the Scottish Plastering Industry. This Scheme would supersede the Various Industries (Silicosis) Scheme, 1931, so far as it applies to the Scottish Plastering Industry, and would provide for payment of the compensation out of a Special Trade Compensation Fund and generally would follow the lines of Compensation Schemes for the Refractories and Sandstone Industries. For the purposes of the Scheme, the Scottish Plastering Industry is defined to mean all the processes involving exposure to silica dust carried on in Scotland in or incidental to the preparation for and application of (a) lime or patent plaster or cement plaster finishes, (b) cement pre-cast products, (c) concrete construction, (d) granolithic or other trowel finished paving surfaces.

The draft Scheme has been issued for the consideration of employers or others affected and any observations in regard to it should

be submitted in writing to the Under Secretary of State, Home Office, Whitehall, London, S.W. 1, by the 15th August.

REFERENCE TO STANDING COMMITTEE.

FLUSH PIPES.

In accordance with the provisions of Section 2, Sub-section (4) of the Merchandise Marks Act, 1926, the Board of Trade give notice that in pursuance of an application received by them for the making of an Order in Council to require imported iron or steel flush pipes (whether galvanised or not) to bear an indication of origin, they have made a reference to the Standing Committee appointed by them under the Act in respect thereof.

Attention is called to the fact that, while, under the provisions of the above Act, the Committee must in every case referred to them consider whether the goods should bear an indication of origin at the time of sale or exposure for sale, they may also at their discretion consider and report upon the question whether such goods should bear an indication of origin at the time of importation.

The Civil Service Commissioners hereby give notice that the following Regulations are published with the approval of the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury, viz.:—

REGULATIONS FOR THE COMPETITIVE SELECTION OF SECOND CLASS CLERKS FOR SERVICE UNDER THE SUPREME COURT OF NORTHERN IRELAND.

N.B.—These Regulations are liable to alteration from time to time. Competitions do not take place at fixed intervals, but are held as occasion arises on the occurrence of vacancies.

1. Candidates must have attained the age of 20 and must not have attained the age of 22 on a date to be fixed in respect of the competition in which they are to take part. The upper age limit may, however, be extended to 30 in the case of candidates who possess professional legal qualifications or have had actual experience of legal business, and may further be extended to 50 in the case of candidates who were employed prior to 1st January, 1929, in a temporary capacity as a clerk in any of the offices of the Supreme Court of Judicature of Northern Ireland, and are still so employed at the date of the vacancy.

2. Every candidate must be a natural-born British subject, the child of a person who

is or was at the time of death a British subject: provided that exception may be made:—

(a) In the case of candidates serving in a civil situation to which they were admitted with the certificate of the Civil Service Commissioners.

(b) In the case of natural-born British subjects who served in His Majesty's Armed Forces in the Great War between 4th August, 1914, and 11th November, 1918.

(c) In the case of natural-born British subjects who have satisfactorily completed a period of not less than five years' service on full pay in His Majesty's Regular Forces.

Provided also that if the Civil Service Commissioners are satisfied, in the case of any candidate who is a British subject but does not fulfil all the requirements of the rule as to nationality and descent, that the candidate is so closely connected by ancestry and upbringing with His Majesty's dominions that an exception may properly be made to that rule, they may accept such candidate as eligible provided that this discretion shall not be exercisable unless (a) the father or the paternal grandfather of the candidate was a natural-born British subject, and (b) neither the father nor the paternal grandfather had acquired any other nationality by naturalisation or by any other voluntary and formal act.

3. Persons holding situations in the Civil Service must obtain the permission of the authorities of their Department to apply for appointment.

No person actually serving in the Army, Navy or Air Force will be eligible for consideration unless he produces, when called upon to do so, the permission of his Commanding Officer to apply for appointment, dated before his appearance before the Selection Board, and given in accordance with such orders as may from time to time be issued.

Persons upon whose training for the occupation of teacher public money has been spent cannot be appointed until the consent of the appropriate education authority has been notified to the Civil Service Commissioners.

4. The Lord Chief Justice will take such steps as he thinks most appropriate to make known the existence of any vacancy or vacancies which he desires to fill on any one occasion, and the Civil Service Commissioners will satisfy themselves that the steps taken have been such as to secure all desirable publicity.

5. Application shall be addressed in the first instance to the Secretary of the Supreme Court of Northern Ireland, and shall be made on a form to be obtained from that office, which must be stamped by the applicant with a "Civil Service" stamp or stamps to the value of two shillings and sixpence; this fee is payable in respect of the application and will not be returned in any circumstances. The Lord Chief Justice will examine the candidates' credentials and will submit to the Civil Service Commissioners the names of such candidates as appear to be qualified and to be best fitted for appointment. The Civil Service Commissioners, if dissatisfied with the number or quality of candidates for any vacancy, may require further search to be made for qualified

candidates. The Civil Service Commissioners may, if they think fit, assist in the scrutiny of the application forms of the candidates.

6. Candidates who are recommended by the Lord Chief Justice and are accepted by the Civil Service Commissioners will be summoned to an interview before a Selection Board sitting in Northern Ireland, who will recommend for the vacancies existing those candidates who appear to them to possess the highest qualifications; the decision of the Selection Board will be final. The Selection Board will be nominated by the Commissioners in consultation with the Lord Chief Justice, who will be represented on the Selection Board in the proportion of one in three or two in five; they will take into consideration the candidate's record of experience and education, any recommendations that they may receive from persons named by candidates as having direct knowledge of their work in the past, and the personal qualities of the candidates as shown at the interview; and on their estimation of all the above evidence they will frame their decisions.

Until further notice, preference will be given to candidates who served in His Majesty's Forces in the Great War between the 4th August, 1914, and the 11th November, 1918.

7. Candidates recommended for appointment by the Selection Board may be required before appointment to pass a qualifying examination in (1) English, Arithmetic and General Knowledge, (2) Law; but the Civil Service Commissioners may at their discretion exempt from examination under (1) any candidate who possesses the Senior Certificate of the Ministry of Education of Northern Ireland or has passed any other examination which in their opinion is of equivalent or higher standard; and they may exempt from examination under (2) any candidate who possesses legal qualifications which in their opinion justify such exemption; and they may exempt entirely from a qualifying examination any candidate who has been employed prior to 1st January, 1929, in a temporary capacity as a clerk in any of the offices of the Supreme Court of Judicature of Northern Ireland, and is still so employed at the date of the vacancy, if so recommended by the Lord Chief Justice.

8. In addition to the fee of two shillings and sixpence payable on application (Clause 5), each candidate admitted to the written examination (Clause 7) will be required to pay a fee of £4 2s. 6d., being the balance of the prescribed fee of £4 5s. A candidate exempted from both parts of the written examination would be required to pay the balance of the prescribed fee before appointment.

9. Candidates must satisfy the Civil Service Commissioners as to their health and character.

Female candidates must be unmarried or widows and will be required to resign their appointments on marriage.

10. Any attempt on the part of candidates to enlist support for their applications through Members of Parliament or other influential persons will disqualify them for appointment. The Selection Board will disregard spontaneous recommendations from persons who are not personally acquainted with the candidate's work, whether at school, at the university, in industry or business, or otherwise.

IMPORTATION OF CANADIAN CATTLE
ORDER OF 1931.

The Minister of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in him under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1927, and of every other power enabling him in this behalf, hereby orders as follows:—

Temporary modification of the provisions of the Schedule to the Importation of Animals Act, 1922 (Session 2).

1. The provisions of the Schedule to the Importation of Animals Act, 1922 (Session 2), as altered and modified by an Order of the Minister dated the 27th March, 1923, are hereby altered and modified, and the Importation of Canadian Cattle Order of 1923 (herein referred to as "the said Order") is hereby amended in relation to Canadian cattle landed at any landing place which is for the time being also used for the landing of animals from Ireland or the Isle of Man in the manner following, that is to say:—

(1) No licence shall be granted for the movement of such cattle from such landing place to an authorised market.

(2) The period of detention specified in paragraph 3 of the said Schedule and in Article 37 of the said Order shall, for such animals, be a period of ten days instead of the period of six days therein mentioned.

(3) Such cattle, if moved under a licence from such landing place to a slaughterhouse, shall be slaughtered therein within a period of ten days from their arrival thereat.

(4) No licence shall be granted for the movement of such cattle out of such landing place to premises other than a slaughterhouse until after midnight on the twenty-first day of July, nineteen hundred and thirty-one.

Short Title.

2. This Order may be cited as "THE IMPORTATION OF CANADIAN CATTLE ORDER OF 1931," and shall be read as one with the said Order.

ANIMALS (LANDING FROM IRELAND
AND ISLE OF MAN) ORDER OF 1931
(No. 3).

The Minister of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in him under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1927, and of every other power enabling him in this behalf, hereby orders as follows:—

Revocation of Existing Orders.

1. The Animals (Landing from Ireland and Isle of Man) Order of 1931, and the Animals (Landing from Ireland and Isle of Man) Order of 1931 (No. 2), are hereby revoked.

Regulations of Landing.

2. Cattle, sheep, goats or swine shipped from Ireland or the Isle of Man shall not, unless and until it is otherwise ordered by the Minister, be landed at any port or place in Great Britain except in accordance with the provisions of the Animals (Landing from Ireland, Channel Islands, and Isle of Man) Order of 1923, as amended by any subsequent Order and this Order:

Provided that this Article shall not be deemed to authorise the landing in Great Britain of any animal brought from County Down or the City of Belfast or from any other place in Northern Ireland or the Irish Free State situate within any premises or area subject for the time being to restrictions on the movement of animals imposed in con-

nection with foot-and-mouth disease; nor authorise the movement of any animal contrary to the provisions of the Foot-and-Mouth Disease (Infected Areas Restrictions) Order of 1925 where the animal is landed at a landing place situate within a Foot-and-Mouth Disease Infected Area to which that Order for the time being applies.

Port in Ireland from which animals may not be shipped.

3. The landing in Great Britain of any cattle, sheep, goats or swine shipped from the port of Belfast is hereby prohibited.

Movement from Landing Place of Animals intended for immediate slaughter.

4. Cattle, sheep, goats or swine landed as from the commencement of this Order and intended for immediate slaughter shall not be moved from the landing place unless they are accompanied by a licence granted by an Inspector of the Ministry and subject to the following conditions:—

(i) The animals shall be moved to the place of detention specified in the licence and not elsewhere and shall be there detained and slaughtered within a period of ten days after the date of their arrival thereat. Whilst so detained animals moved with a licence under this Article shall not be permitted to come in contact with animals not being moved with a licence under this Article.

(ii) Animals moved under this Article shall be moved by the nearest available route, and during such movement shall not be permitted to come in contact with animals not being moved under this Article.

Movement from Landing Place of Animals not intended for immediate slaughter.

5. Cattle, sheep, goats or swine landed as from the commencement of this Order and not intended for immediate slaughter shall not be moved from the landing place unless they are accompanied by a licence granted by an Inspector of the Ministry and subject to the following conditions:—

(i) The animals shall be moved to the place of detention specified in the licence and not elsewhere and shall be there detained and isolated from other animals for a period of ten days after the date of their arrival thereat unless previously slaughtered thereon.

(ii) Animals moved under this Article shall be moved by the nearest available route and during such movement shall not be permitted to come in contact with animals not being moved with a licence under this Article.

Conditions of Landing at any Landing Place.

6. The landing of any animals under this Order must be authorised by the Superintendent or person in charge of the Landing Place.

Offences.

7. Any person committing, or aiding, abetting, counselling or procuring the commission of any breach of the provisions of this Order, or of the conditions of a licence

granted thereunder is liable, on summary conviction, to the penalties provided by the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1927.

Local Authority to enforce Order.

8. The provisions of this Order, except where it is otherwise provided, shall be executed and enforced by the Local Authority.

Commencement.

9. This Order shall come into operation on the twenty-second day of July, nineteen hundred and thirty-one.

Short Title.

10. This Order may be cited as the ANIMALS (LANDING FROM IRELAND AND ISLE OF MAN) ORDER OF 1931 (No. 3).

In addition, the usual telephone number of the person required, and if possible the name associated with that number in the Telephone Directory, should be given. Where the New Zealand telephone number is not known by the caller an effort will be made to trace it, if the name and address of the person required is given. Calling subscribers should, if possible, intimate at the time of booking a "person-to-person" call, the name of an acceptable substitute at the receiving station.

WALLASEY CORPORATION TRAMWAYS (CESSER OF POWERS) ORDER, 1931.

Whereas the Wallasey Urban District Council were authorised by the Wallasey Tramways and Improvements Act, 1899 (hereinafter referred to as "the Act of 1899") to construct and have constructed and opened for traffic certain tramways situate in the County Borough of Wallasey including the part of the tramway described in the Schedule hereto and hereinafter referred to as "the abandoned tramway".

And whereas Parts II and III of the Tramways Act, 1870, are incorporated with the Act of 1899 and in the said Part III it is enacted by Section 41 inter alia as follows:—

"If at any time after the opening of any tramway in any district for traffic the promoters discontinue the working of such tramway, or of any part thereof, for the space of three calendar months (such discontinuance not being occasioned by circumstances beyond the control of such promoters, for which purpose the want of sufficient funds shall not be considered a circumstance beyond their control), and such discontinuance is proved to the satisfaction of the Board of Trade, the said Board, if they think fit, may by order declare that the powers of the promoters in respect of such tramway or the part thereof so discontinued shall, from the date of such order, be at an end, and thereupon the said powers of the promoters shall cease and determine, unless the same are purchased by the local authority in manner by this Act provided".

And whereas by virtue of the Ministry of Transport Act, 1919, and the Ministry of Transport (Board of Trade Exception of Powers) Order, 1919, the powers and duties of the Board of Trade under the said Section 41 of the Tramways Act, 1870, have been transferred to the Minister of Transport.

And whereas the Mayor Aldermen and Burgesses of the County Borough of Wallasey hereinafter referred to as "the Corporation") have applied to the Minister of Transport for an Order under the said Section 41 of the Tramways Act, 1870, declaring that the powers of the Corporation (as successors to the Wallasey Urban District Council) in respect of the abandoned tramway shall be at an end and it has been proved to the satisfaction of the Minister of Transport that the working of the abandoned tramway has been discontinued for the space of three calendar months.

Now therefore the Minister of Transport in exercise of the powers in that behalf conferred on him by the said Section 41 of the Tramways Act, 1870, hereby orders and declares that the

powers of the Corporation in respect of the abandoned tramway shall from the date of this Order be at an end.

This Order may be cited as the Wallasey Corporation Tramways (Cesser of Powers) Order, 1931.

SCHEDULE.

The abandoned tramway referred to in the foregoing Order is situate in Warren Drive and Victoria Road between Grove Road and Rowson Street and is a part of the tramway enumerated and described in Section 16 of the Act of 1899 as Tramway No. 3.
