“And whereas new conditions have been introduced by Your Majesty's Board of Trade for the examinations for Officers' Certificates in the Mercantile Marine, which materially affect the recruitment of Executive Officers, R.N.R.:

“And whereas we consider that the situation necessitates provision for the entry of Officers holding Board of Trade Second Mate's Certificates by the institution of an appropriate new rank in the R.N.R.:

“We beg leave humbly to recommend that Your Majesty may be graciously pleased by Your Order in Council to approve the establishment of a new rank entitled 'Probationary Acting Sub Lieutenant, R.N.R.' subject to such regulations as we may deem advisable and to the following conditions:—

“(1) Full pay while under training or during service in the Royal Navy to be at the rates from time to time current for Acting Sub Lieutenants, R.N.R., and

“(2) Until promoted to the confirmed rank of Sub Lieutenant, R.N.R., disability retired pay to be at the rates provided from time to time for Midshipmen, R.N.R., and to be governed generally by the regulations applicable to such retired pay.

“The Lords Commissioners of Your Majesty's Treasury have signified their concurrence in this proposal.”

His Majesty, having taken the said Memorial into consideration, was pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to approve of what is therein proposed.

And the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty are to give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

“And whereas we consider that all such Officers should receive adequate notice of our intention to relegate them to the half pay list under the said Order:

“And whereas it may not always be practicable to give such adequate notice to an Officer permanently passed over on the occurrence of an unexpected vacancy:

“We beg leave humbly to recommend that Your Majesty may be graciously pleased, by Your Order in Council, to authorize us in such cases to delay the relegation of a Senior Major, Royal Marines, to half pay under the aforesaid Order in Council for a period not exceeding two months, reckoned as under:—

“(1) For an Officer serving at home, from the date of the receipt of the notice by his Commanding Officer;

“(2) For an Officer serving abroad, from the date of disembarkation in the United Kingdom if he returns thereto, or from the date of the receipt of the notice by his Commanding Officer if he is permitted to remain abroad.

“The Lords Commissioners of Your Majesty's Treasury have signified their concurrence in this proposal.”

His Majesty, having taken the said Memorial into consideration, was pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to approve of what is therein proposed.

And the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty are to give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

“We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, acting under the provisions of the Act of the 7th and 8th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 94, the Act of the 13th and 14th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 94, and the Act of the 32nd and 33rd years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 94, have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council, the following Scheme or Representation for altering the boundaries of the New Parish of Saint John the Evangelist, East Dulwich, and the New Parish of Saint Saviour, Champion Hill, both in the County of Surrey and in the Diocese of Southwark:

“Whereas by the authority of an Instrument bearing date the 18th day of May, 1865, and being under our Common Seal and under the hand and seal of the Right Reverend Charles Richard, then Bishop of Winchester, a Particular District was assigned to the consecrated Church of Saint John the Evangelist, East Dulwich, and the said Particular District was named ‘The Particular District of Saint John the Evangelist, East Dulwich’:

“And whereas by the authority of an Order of Her said late Majesty in Council bearing date the 26th day of August, 1881, and published in the London Gazette on the 2nd day of the following month, a District Chapelry was assigned to the consecrated Church of Saint Saviour, Champion Hill, and the said District Chapelry was named ‘The District Chapelry of Saint Saviour, Champion Hill’:

“And whereas the said Particular District of Saint John the Evangelist, East Dulwich, and the said District Chapelry of Saint Saviour, Champion Hill, have become New Parishes of the character contemplated by the Act of the 6th and 7th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 37, by the Act of the 19th and 20th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 104, and by the above-mentioned Act of the 32nd and 33rd years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 94:

“And whereas it has been represented to us, and it appears to us to be expedient that the boundaries of the said New Parish of Saint John the Evangelist, East Dulwich, and the said New Parish of Saint Saviour, Champion Hill, should be altered in the manner which is hereinafter mentioned:

“Now, therefore, with the consent of the Right Reverend Cyril Forster, Bishop of Southwark (in testimony whereof he has signed and sealed this Scheme or Representation), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, humbly represent recommend and propose that from and after the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme or Representation and without any assurance in the law other than such duly gazetted Order, the boundaries of the said New Parish of Saint John the Evangelist, East

Dulwich, and the said New Parish of Saint Saviour, Champion Hill, shall be altered so that all those portions of the said New Parish of Saint John the Evangelist, East Dulwich, and of the Parish of Camberwell, in the said County and Diocese, which are described in the Schedule hereunder written and are delineated and set forth upon the map or plan hereunto annexed and are thereon coloured pink shall be dissevered from such New Parish and Parish respectively and shall be annexed to and shall in future form part of the said New Parish of Saint Saviour, Champion Hill.

“And we further represent, recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from representing, recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them, in accordance with the provisions of the hereinbefore mentioned Acts, or of any of them, or of any other Act of Parliament.

“THE SCHEDULE to which the foregoing Scheme or Representation has reference.

“The territory to be annexed to the New Parish of Saint Saviour, Champion Hill, in the County of Surrey and in the Diocese of Southwark, comprising:—

“I. All that portion of the New Parish of Saint John the Evangelist, East Dulwich, in the said County and Diocese, which is bounded upon the north east by the said New Parish of Saint Saviour, Champion Hill, upon the north west by the Parish of Camberwell, upon the south west by the New Parish of Saint Paul, Herne Hill, upon part of the south east by the New Parish of Saint Barnabas, Dulwich, all in the said County and Diocese, and upon the remaining part of the south east by an imaginary line commencing upon the boundary which divides the said New Parish of Saint Barnabas, Dulwich, from the said New Parish of Saint John the Evangelist, East Dulwich, at the centre of the bridge which carries the London and Sutton Line of the Southern Railway across Dogkennel Lane, and extending thence north eastward along the middle of the said line of railway for a distance of 13 chains or thereabouts to the boundary which divides the said New Parish of Saint John the Evangelist, East Dulwich, from the said New Parish of Saint Saviour, Champion Hill.

“II. And also all that contiguous portion of the said Parish of Camberwell which is bounded upon the north east and upon the south east by the above described portion of the New Parish of Saint John the Evangelist, East Dulwich, upon the south west by the said New Parish of Saint Paul, Herne Hill, upon part of the north west partly by the last mentioned New Parish, partly by the New Parish of Saint Matthew, Denmark Hill, in the said County and Diocese, and partly by an imaginary line commencing at the point where the boundary which divides the said New Parish of Saint Matthew, Denmark Hill, from the said Parish of Camberwell diverges north westward from following the middle of the road called Champion Hill, and extending thence north eastward along the middle of Champion Hill for a distance of 10½ chains or thereabouts to its junction with Upper Grove Lane, and extending thence north westward

along the middle of Upper Grove Lane for a distance of 10 yards or thereabouts to its junction with Grove Hill Road, and extending thence north eastward along the middle of Grove Hill Road for a distance of 6½ chains or thereabouts to the boundary which divides the said Parish of Camberwell from the said New Parish of Saint John the Evangelist, East Dulwich.”

And whereas drafts of the said Scheme or Representation have been transmitted to the Patrons and to the Incumbents of the Cures affected by the arrangements which are contemplated by such Scheme or Representation and such Patrons and Incumbents have with the exceptions hereinafter mentioned respectively signified their assent thereto:

And whereas the Patrons and the Incumbent of the said Parish of Camberwell have offered certain objections to the said Scheme or Representation:

And whereas notwithstanding the said objections the said Scheme or Representation has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said Scheme or Representation, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts.

And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of Southwark.

“We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of the Act of the 59th year of His late Majesty King George the Third, Chapter 134, of the Act of the 2nd and 3rd years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 49, and of the Act of the 19th and 20th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 55, have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council, the following Representation as to the assignment of a District Chapelry to the consecrated Church of Saint James, Pokesdown, situate in the New Parish (sometime District Chapelry) of Pokesdown, in the County of Southampton and in the Diocese of Winchester:

"Whereas it appears to us to be expedient that a District Chapelry should be assigned to the said Church of Saint James, Pokesdown, situate as aforesaid:

"Now, therefore, with the consent of the Right Reverend Frank Theodore, Bishop of Winchester (testified by his having signed and sealed this Representation), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, humbly represent, that it would, in our opinion, be expedient that all that part of the said New Parish of Pokesdown which is described in the Schedule hereunder written, all which part, together with the boundaries thereof, is delineated and set forth on the map or plan hereunto annexed, should be assigned as a District Chapelry to the said Church of Saint James, Pokesdown, situate as aforesaid, and that the same should be named 'The District Chapelry of Saint James, Pokesdown'.

"And with the like consent of the said Frank Theodore, Bishop of Winchester (testified as aforesaid), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, further represent, that it appears to us to be expedient that banns of matrimony should be published, and that marriages, baptisms, churchings, and burials should be solemnized or performed at the said Church of Saint James, Pokesdown, situate as aforesaid, and that the fees or dues to be received in respect of the publication of banns and of the solemnization or performance of marriages, churchings, and burials should be paid and belong to the Minister of the same Church for the time being.

"THE SCHEDULE to which the foregoing Representation has reference.

"The District Chapelry of Saint James, Pokesdown, being:—

"All that part of the New Parish (sometime District Chapelry, of Pokesdown, in the County of Southampton and in the Diocese of Winchester, which is bounded upon the north west partly by the New Parish of Saint John the Evangelist, Holdenhurst, and partly by the District of Saint Mary, Bournemouth, upon the south west partly by the said District of Saint Mary, Bournemouth, and partly by the New Parish of Saint Andrew, Boscombe, all in the said County and Diocese, and upon the remaining sides, that is to say, upon the south east and upon the north east, by an imaginary line commencing upon the boundary which divides the said New Parish of Saint Andrew, Boscombe, from the said New Parish of Pokesdown, at the junction of Parkwood Road with Darracott Road, and extending thence north eastward along the middle of Darracott Road for a distance of 23½ chains or thereabouts to its junction with Seabourne Road and Ashbourne Road and extending thence north eastward along the middle of Ashbourne Road for a distance of 7½ chains or thereabouts to its junction with Cromwell Road and extending thence eastward along the middle of Cromwell Road for a distance of 2½ chains or thereabouts to its junction with Southbourne Road and extending thence northward along the middle of Southbourne Road for a distance of 9 chains or thereabouts to the centre of the bridge which carries Southbourne Road across the Bournemouth Direct Line of the Southern Railway, and extending thence north eastward along the middle of the said line of railway for a

distance of 22 chains or thereabouts to a point opposite to the middle of Hambledon Road and extending thence north westward to and along the middle of Hambledon Road for a distance of 10½ chains or thereabouts to its junction with Christchurch Road, and continuing thence north westward in precisely the same direction and in a straight line for a distance of 47 chains or thereabouts to the boundary which divides the said New Parish of Pokesdown from the said New Parish of Saint John the Evangelist, Holdenhurst."

BARKING URBAN DISTRICT COUNCIL.

TO THEIR MOST EXCELLENT MAJESTIES—KING GEORGE V AND QUEEN MARY.

MAY IT PLEASE YOUR MAJESTIES:

In the name of the Inhabitants of this ancient town of Barking, We, the Chairman and Councillors of the Urban District of Barking Town in the County of Essex humbly extend to Your Majesties a hearty welcome on this the third visit of Your Majesties to the District, the first of these visits being to open one of the largest Housing Estates in the realm (part of which is situated in Barking) and

the second, to open at Creeksmouth in Barking what will be the largest Generating Station in the World.

We particularly wish to express our great pleasure for the renewed health and strength vouchsafed to Your Majesty, the King.

Your Majesties' careful thought for the welfare of all your subjects is well known and highly esteemed and Your Majesties' presence here to-day is but a further demonstration of the anxious solicitude with which Your Majesties have by your never failing interest in the King George V Hospital anticipated the needs of Your subjects affected by the great development taking place in this district.

The gracious interest on the part of Your Majesties has encouraged the Urban District Council of Barking Town to provide further houses for the working classes, to institute a Development Committee for promoting (*inter alia*) the social welfare of the inhabitants and to petition Your Majesty the King for a Charter of Incorporation to unite in one body the inhabitants of Barking under the style of the Mayor Aldermen and Burgesses of the Borough of Barking.

In assuring Your Majesties of our unbounded affection and loyalty we devoutly pray that Your Majesties, secure in the affection of Your people, may long be spared to enjoy good health and strength to preside over the destinies of Your Great Empire.

To which Address His Majesty was pleased to return the following gracious Answer:—

I thank you for your loyal and dutiful Address and for the cordial welcome which you have given us. I am grateful for your congratulations upon my restoration to health, and for the expression of your attachment and good wishes.

The Queen and I are gratified that you retain an affectionate recollection of our previous visits to Barking for the opening of the Beacontree Estate and the Creeksmouth Generating Station, and we are very glad to be here again to-day. It is a matter of the utmost importance that the great increase of population in your neighbourhood should not be allowed to outrun the provision of those social services essential to a well ordered modern community; and I am happy that the public-spirited efforts which have been made in the face of great difficulties to meet the primary necessity of hospital accommodation have been crowned with well-deserved success.

I am glad to learn that the Council are working actively and zealously to promote the progress of the town and the physical and moral welfare of the people. I pray that the guidance and blessing of Divine Providence may be with them, and that the ancient town of Barking may enter upon a new era of happy and prosperous growth.

The following Address was presented to The KING on the occasion of His Majesty's visit to Dagenham on the 18th July, 1931:—

DAGENHAM URBAN DISTRICT COUNCIL.

MAY IT PLEASE YOUR MAJESTY:

On behalf of the inhabitants the Dagenham Urban District Council desires to convey to You and to Her Majesty the Queen on the occasion of Your visit to the district in con-

nection with the opening of the King George Hospital (in which Your Majesty is pleased to be interested) its respectful welcome and loyal greetings.

The Dagenham Urban District Council has been in existence since the year 1926 only and Your Majesty is most respectfully reminded of the tremendous problems of Local Government set up by the large influx of Population into what was in 1921 a district of a purely rural character, containing less than 10,000 persons. No Town within your Overseas Dominions or in the new World can show such a record of phenomenal growth.

Referring, with Your Majesty's permission, to the general welfare of this large new Town of 100,000 inhabitants, the Council has, among many other activities, set up a modern Maternity and Child Welfare Service (including the erection of two fully equipped Clinics), Public Libraries and an Open Air Swimming Bath and purchased 228 acres of land for Parks, Playing Fields and Open Spaces and is hoping to build 475 houses. The Council has also promoted two Private Bills in Parliament, the first of which (The Dagenham Act, 1928) received Your Royal Assent in August of that year.

The Council trust, that Your Majesty and Her Majesty the Queen will enjoy good health and long life, and that you will honour Dagenham by a further personal visit in the near future.

To which Address His Majesty was pleased to return the following gracious Answer:—

I thank you for your loyal and dutiful Address, and for the warmth of the greeting which you have given us.

It is a great pleasure to The Queen and myself to visit Dagenham and to see for ourselves the development which has taken place in your neighbourhood. We have noted with great interest what you have said of the rapid transformation of Dagenham from a rural parish into a thickly populated urban district; we recognise, as everyone must, the special difficulties in the work of local government which so sudden and complete a change was bound to cause; and we congratulate the District Council on the courage and goodwill with which it has faced the duties thus cast upon it. We are particularly glad to learn that the Council is fully alive to the importance of playing fields and open spaces for a rapidly growing population, and that it has taken steps to provide before it is too late for these necessities of modern town life.

I thank you very sincerely for your good wishes to us, and I pray that the Divine Blessing may rest upon the work of the Council and that Dagenham may long continue to flourish.

The following Addresses were presented to The KING on the occasion of His Majesty's visit to Ilford and of the opening by Him of the King George Hospital on the 18th July, 1931:—

ILFORD BOROUGH COUNCIL.

TO THE KING'S MOST EXCELLENT MAJESTY.

MAY IT PLEASE YOUR MAJESTY:

We, the Mayor, Aldermen, Councillors and Burgesses of the Borough of Ilford, acting by the Town Council of the Borough, humbly beg

to offer to Your Majesty an expression of our devotion to Your Royal House and our whole-hearted and respectful welcome on the auspicious occasion of Your Majesty's presence here to-day.

As loyal and devoted subjects we are well aware of the deep interest Your Majesty displays in all matters concerning the welfare of the Community, and it is in consequence of Your Majesty's particular interest in all that appertains to the relief of sickness and suffering that we the Citizens of this loyal Parliamentary Borough have had the honour and privilege of naming our new Hospital the "King George" Hospital and we are deeply appreciative of the additional honour which you have conferred upon our Borough to-day by your presence for the purpose of declaring the Hospital open.

The Town of Ilford, as Your Majesty is aware, has on two previous occasions been honoured by your presence, first in May, 1909, when, as Prince of Wales, you declared open the Hainault Playing Fields which are situated on the north side of the Borough and have proved of the greatest value to the Town, and again in June, 1923, when you visited the London County Council's Housing Estate at Becontree, a portion of which Estate lies within our boundary. On the occasion of your first visit the population of this district was approximately 60,000. It is now estimated at 130,000 and is still rapidly increasing, an increase encouraged by the Council's activities under the Small Dwellings Acquisition Acts and their constant endeavours to facilitate the purchase of houses. A sum of approximately £1,000,000 has already been advanced under these Acts while a very substantial addition has been made to this figure by the various Building Societies operating in the district. In addition the Council has completed seven building estates comprising 772 houses in different parts of the Borough.

The Local Government administration of the Borough has of necessity increased correspondingly with the extraordinary growth in population and the Council, bearing in mind always its responsibilities to all classes of the Community, has directed its attention at all times to the provision and maintenance particularly of those vital services which tend to increase the health, happiness and well-being of the inhabitants. Chief amongst these services must be reckoned hospital accommodation and every inhabitant of this Borough appreciates to the utmost your gracious interest in all the efforts which have been made to meet this ever increasing demand.

The Council in the exercise of their Powers under the Public Health and other Acts have provided an Isolation Hospital with accommodation for 122 patients and equipped with every up-to-date device for the treatment and cure of infectious disease.

In addition they have provided a Maternity Home, one of the first in the Country to be erected and equipped for the express purpose of maternity needs, with accommodation for 23 patients. The Home occupies an excellent site immediately adjoining the Hospital which Your Majesty has been pleased to visit to-day and we recall with pleasant memories that the building was opened in 1925 by Her Royal Highness Princess Beatrice.

Child Welfare clinics have been established in various parts of the Borough where over 700 mothers receive attention and advice annually.

Whilst, however, thus directing every possible attention towards the relief of sickness and suffering amongst all classes of the Community, the Council has not neglected that all-important aspect of public health—which is summed up in the phrase "prevention is better than cure"—and with this object in view has endeavoured to provide means for every conceivable health giving exercise and sport.

New Public Swimming, Slipper and Vapour Baths of the very latest type equipped with every modern device for ensuring the purity of the water and the highest standard of excellence in every way were opened as recently as January of this year and have provided a long-felt want of which the fullest advantage has been taken by the Burgesses and potential Burgesses.

So far as concerns all other outdoor sports and pastimes, the policy of the Council has always been and remains directed towards the provision of parks and open spaces where every possible form of sport may be indulged in and beautiful and attractive surroundings provided for young and old.

In 1926 our Charter of Incorporation was granted and in October of that year we were honoured by the presence of His Royal Highness The Duke of York who, accompanied by the Duchess, most graciously conveyed the Charter to Ilford.

Since that time we have been further honoured by the Duke's presence when in 1929 we had the felicity of enrolling him as our First Freeman.

We rejoice that Your Majesty has now been restored to health and devoutly pray that, secure in the affection of your People, you and your Illustrious Consort may long be spared to preside over the destinies of this Great Empire in whose prosperity and happiness every loyal subject of Your Majesties evinces such justifiable pride.

To which Address His Majesty was pleased to return the following gracious Answer:—

I thank you for your loyal and dutiful Address and for the enthusiastic welcome which you have given us. We retain pleasant recollections of our visit to Ilford eight years ago. I am happy to observe the progress which you have made since then, and in particular to congratulate you upon the elevation of your town to the position of a municipal borough.

It gives me great pleasure to visit Ilford again to-day, and all the more because the occasion is the happy one of opening the new Hospital which has been set up here. It was apparent to us when we first visited the Becontree Estate that there would be an urgent need of hospital accommodation for the large increase of population which was certain to come to Ilford and the neighbouring areas; and it is a particular gratification to me to find that effective steps have been taken to meet this requirement.

I note with pleasure that the Town Council, in addition to its share in the foundation of the King George Hospital, is fully alive to its

responsibility in respect of promoting the general health and well-being of the borough. The Queen is especially interested to learn of the attention which you have given to the important subject of maternity and child welfare. We congratulate you on your prudence and foresight in making liberal provision for open spaces and open air recreation for your large and increasing population.

It is our earnest hope and prayer that the Divine Blessing may rest in the fullest measure on all your labours for the benefit of the borough and people of Ilford.

MAY IT PLEASE YOUR MAJESTY:

As President of King George Hospital it is my honourable and grateful duty, on behalf of those who have created, and those who administer these new buildings, to tender to Your Majesty and to Her Majesty the Queen a most loyal welcome.

In June, 1923, Your Majesties inspected the housing developments at Becontree and Her Majesty expressed a desire that "Something should be done" to meet the hospital requirements of the new community. To-day Your Majesty views the result of our endeavours to erect a hospital which we trust gives expression to Her Majesty's wishes and will also meet with Your Majesty's gracious approval.

In December, 1924, the Council of King Edward's Hospital Fund, realising that the area of its activities, which then operated within a 9 mile radius of Charing Cross, would not include the new colony created by the London County Council in the Becontree Hundred of Essex, extended its area to an 11 mile radius from St. Paul's Cathedral, thus enabling the residents in this part of London over the Border to participate in the benefits of the Fund.

In February, 1927, Your Majesty being acquainted with the progress of the scheme for the conversion of the Ilford Emergency Hospital into a General Hospital with accommodation for 300 beds to serve the area of the Thames-side East of London, including the borough and parishes of Ilford, Barking and Dagenham, was pleased to intimate that an appeal for funds should be issued jointly by the Lord Mayor of London and the Chairman of the London County Council.

The Fund thus constituted was headed by the personal donations of Your Majesties.

In addition, on January 14th, 1930, Your Majesty was graciously pleased to allow your name to be identified with the Hospital under licence by Royal Charter.

Notwithstanding the munificent donations of King Edward's Hospital Fund, the London County Council and of private donors such as Captain Clifford Erskine-Bolst and the Directors of the Ford Motor Company, the collection of sufficient money to enable us to complete the hospital accommodation required for this populous area is a matter of no small concern. To quote the words of H.R.H. The Prince of Wales at our Inaugural Dinner at

the Mansion House, "This new hospital has no roots and both its creation and maintenance are full of difficulties."

We believe and trust that the presence of Your Majesties here to-day will serve as an inspiration and encouragement in our endeavour to meet the needs of suffering humanity in this locality.

An auxiliary health centre has been established at Dagenham, which has already proved of immense value, especially for children, and another institution is under consideration for Barking.

Through the kind offices of the Presidents of the Royal Colleges of Physicians and of Surgeons, a distinguished visiting staff of Consultants has been appointed to the Hospital which is a complete Training School under the General Nursing Council.

Sire,

All those residing in the area served by this much-needed hospital join with us in expressing our humble duty and great gratitude for the signal favours bestowed by Your Majesty and particularly for the presence of Your Majesties here to-day.

It only remains for me respectfully to invite Our Royal Patron formally to open the King George Hospital.

To which Address His Majesty was pleased to return the following gracious Answer:—

It is a great pleasure to me to be present on this occasion, and I thank you for the loyal welcome given to the Queen and myself. We are glad to revisit this district and to renew our acquaintance with its residents.

Eight years ago, as you have reminded us, we foresaw that, with the development of Becontree and its evergrowing population, a demand for further hospital facilities must follow. To-day the King George Hospital will, I trust, serve the present needs of the neighbourhood.

These fine new buildings are the outcome of the Ilford Emergency Hospital. I am gratified to learn that in this scheme there has been the closest co-operation between the London County Council and the Council of King Edward's Hospital Fund, who have taken special steps to extend their valuable help to this locality.

The Hospital is in being, but the funds for its full completion are still lacking. It would be difficult to find a worthier object for benevolence.

I trust therefore that many, sympathising with the outstanding needs of the district, will emulate the example of those generous donors whose gifts, whether large or small, have contributed towards to-day's happy result.

The Queen and I have observed with much interest your reference to the Auxiliary Health Centres already established at Dagenham and being organised at Barking.

No appreciation can be too great for the assistance given by the leaders of the Medical Profession in the appointment of a distinguished visiting staff of Consultants to the Hospital, which will become a complete training school for nurses.

I am confident that all classes of the community will welcome in their midst this Hos-

pital, where the best medical treatment and up to date surgical equipment will be available for the sick and suffering.

Great as the benefits may be at present, they will be far greater in the years to come when the field of its noble work is extended.

I am happy to declare the King George Hospital open. I shall watch with interest the success of your efforts and cordially wish God-Speed to this great enterprise.

AND ISLE OF MAN) ORDER OF 1931
(No. 4.)

The Minister of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in him under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1927, and of every other power enabling him in this behalf, hereby orders as follows:—

Alteration of Existing Order.

1.—(i) The proviso to Article 2 of the Animals (Landing from Ireland and Isle of Man) Order of 1931 (No. 3) is hereby revoked and there shall be substituted therefor the following:—

Provided that this Article shall not be deemed to authorise the landing in Great Britain of any animal brought from any place in Northern Ireland or the Irish Free State situate within any premises or area subject for the time being to restrictions on the movement of animals imposed in connection with foot-and-mouth disease; nor authorise the movement of any animal contrary to the provisions of the Foot-and-Mouth Disease (Infected Areas Restrictions) Order of 1925 where the animal is landed at a landing place situate within a Foot-and-Mouth Disease Infected Area to which that Order for the time being applies.

(ii) Article 3 of the said Order is hereby revoked.

(iii) Article 4 of the said Order shall be read and have effect as if the following proviso were added thereto:—

Provided that where a licence has been granted under this Article authorising the movement of imported cattle, sheep, goats or swine to a specified slaughterhouse, the animals may, by virtue of that licence, be moved to adjacent lairs which are customarily used in connection with the said slaughterhouse for temporary detention while awaiting slaughter, and in every

such case notice in writing specifying the number of animals and the lair to which they have been moved shall forthwith be given by the owner or person in charge of the animals to the Local Authority. The movement of the animals from the lairs to the slaughterhouse shall take place within the period allowed for slaughter.

Commencement.

2. This Order shall come into operation on the twenty-seventh day of July, nineteen hundred and thirty-one.
