WHEREAS there was this day read at the Board a Memorial from the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, dated the 7th day of July, 1931, (C.W. 3384/31), in the words following, viz.:—

"Whereas by Section 3 of the Naval and Marine Pay and Pensions Act, 1865, it is enacted, inter alia, that all pay, pensions, or other allowances in the nature thereof payable in respect of services in Your Majesty's Naval or Marine Force to a person being or having been an Officer, Seaman, or Marine therein, shall be paid in such manner and subject to such restrictions, conditions, and provisions as are from time to time directed by Order in Council:

"And whereas by Your Majesty's Order in Council bearing date the 5th day of November, 1929, we are authorized to place Senior Majors, Royal Marines, on half pay immediately when they are permanently passed over for promo-

tion:

"And whereas we consider that all such Officers should receive adequate notice of our intention to relegate them to the half pay list under the said Order:

"And whereas it may not always be practicable to give such adequate notice to an Officer permanently passed over on the occur-

rence of an unexpected vacancy:

"We beg leave humbly to recommend that Your Majesty may be graciously pleased, by Your Order in Council, to authorize us in such cases to delay the relegation of a Senior Major, Royal Marines, to half pay under the aforesaid Order in Council for a period not exceeding two months, reckoned as under:—

"(1) For an Officer serving at home, from the date of the receipt of the notice by his

Commanding Officer;

"(2) For an Officer serving abroad, from the date of disembarkation in the United Kingdom if he returns thereto, or from the date of the receipt of the notice by his Commanding Officer if he is permitted to remain abroad.

"The Lords Commissioners of Your Majesty's Treasury have signified their concurrence in this proposal."

His Majesty, having taken the said Memorial into consideration, was pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to approve of what is therein proposed.

And the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty are to give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Act of the 7th and 8th years of Her

late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 94, of the Act of the 13th and 14th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 94, and of the Act of the 32nd and 33rd years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 94, duly prepared, and laid before His Majesty in Council, a Scheme or Representation, bearing date the 25th day of June, 1931, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, acting under the provisions of the Act of the 7th and 8th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 94, the Act of the 13th and 14th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 94, and the Act of the 32nd and 33rd years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 94, have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council, the following Scheme or Representation for altering the boundaries of the New Parish of Saint John the Evangelist, East Dulwich, and the New Parish of Saint Saviour, Champion Hill, both in the County of Surrey and in the Diocese of Southwark:

"Whereas by the authority of an Instrument bearing date the 18th day of May, 1865, and being under our Common Seal and under the hand and seal of the Right Reverend Charles Richard, then Bishop of Winchester, a Particular District was assigned to the consecrated Church of Saint John the Evangelist, East Dulwich, and the said Particular District was named 'The Particular District of Saint John the Evangelist, East Dulwich':

"And whereas by the authority of an Order of Her said late Majesty in Council bearing date the 26th day of August, 1881, and published in the London Gazette on the 2nd day of the following month, a District Chapelry was assigned to the consecrated Church of Saint Saviour, Champion Hill, and the said District Chapelry was named 'The District Chapelry of Saint Saviour, Champion Hill':

"And whereas the said Particular District of Saint John the Evangelist, East Dulwich, and the said District Chapelry of Saint Saviour, Champion Hill, have become New Parishes of the character contemplated by the Act of the 6th and 7th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 37, by the Act of the 19th and 20th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 104, and by the above-mentioned Act of the 32nd and 33rd years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 94:

"And whereas it has been represented to us, and it appears to us to be expedient that the boundaries of the said New Parish of Saint John the Evangelist, East Dulwich, and the said New Parish of Saint Saviour, Champion Hill, should be altered in the manner which is hereinafter mentioned:

"Now, therefore, with the consent of the Right Reverend Cyril Forster, Bishop of Southwark (in testimony whereof he has signed and sealed this Scheme or Representation), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, humbly represent recommend and propose that from and after the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme or Representation and without any assurance in the law other than such duly gazetted Order, the boundaries of the said New Parish of Saint John the Evangelist, East
