

SECOND SCHEDULE.

An Area comprising:—

In the county of Fife.

The burghs of Anstruther Wester, Pittenweem, and Elie and Earlsferry; the parishes of Anstruther Wester, Pittenweem, St. Monans, Elie, Newburn, Kilconquhar and Carnbee; and the parish of Largo (*except such part as lies to the west of the road from Ceres to Lower Largo and as also lies to the north of the Leven and East of Fife Railway*); so much of the parish of Cameron as lies to the

south of the road from Ceres to Dunino; and so much of the parish of Craill as lies to the west of the road from Dunino to Anstruther Easter; and so much of the parish of Dunino as lies to the west of the road from Anstruther Easter to Stravithie Mill and as also lies to the south of the road from Stravithie Mill to Kirkcaldy.

ORDER OF THE MINISTER OF AGRICULTURE AND FISHERIES.

(DATED 27TH JULY, 1931.)

The Minister of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in him under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1927, and of every other power enabling him in this behalf, hereby orders as follows:—

Application of Order.

1. The provisions of Part II (*Restriction on Movement of Sheep out of a Movement Area*) of the Sheep Scab Order of 1928 (hereinafter referred to as the principal Order) as applied to the Area described in the Schedule to the Order of the Minister No. 4893, dated the 20th May, 1931, shall not apply to the movement of sheep of the Kerry Hill Breed from the special Sales specified in the Schedule to this Order, provided that the following conditions are complied with.

Special Conditions applicable to Sheep Moved to the Sales referred to in this Order.

2. All sheep exposed at the special Sales specified in the Schedule to this Order shall comply with the following conditions:—

(a) The sheep shall be accompanied by a certificate of an Inspector of the Local Authority of the district from which the sheep are moved to the effect:—

(i) that the sheep have within 56 days before the movement been double-dipped

under the supervision of an Inspector of the Local Authority; and

(ii) that the sheep, since the second dipping, have been kept isolated from sheep which have not been so dipped, and have not been exposed in any market, fairground or saleyard. For the purpose of the aforesaid certificate exposure at the special sale of Kerry Hill Sheep on the 4th September, 1931, at Kerry (Montgomeryshire) shall not be regarded as exposure in a market, fairground or saleyard.

(b) Such Certificate shall on the arrival of the sheep at the said special Sales, be delivered up to the Inspector of the Ministry.

(c) The sheep may be moved from the said special Sales only if accompanied by a licence granted by an Inspector of the Ministry authorising movement of the sheep to a specified destination in Great Britain and subject to such conditions, if any, as may be specified in the licence.

(d) All sheep exposed at the said special Sales shall be kept separate from all other sheep during movement to and from the Sales and whilst being exposed thereat.

Interpretation.

3. The expression "double-dipped" in this Order has the same meaning as in the principal Order.
