

Ashton in Makerfield, and also the boundary which divides the County Borough of Wigan from the Urban District of Ashton in Makerfield cross the middle of Park Lane, and extending thence southward along the middle of Park Lane, for a distance of 41 chains or thereabouts to its junction with Sougher's Lane, and extending thence south westward along the middle of Sougher's Lane for a distance of 34 chains or thereabouts to its junction with Downall Green Road, and extending thence eastward along the middle of Downall Green Road for a distance of 2½ chains or thereabouts to a point opposite to the northern end of the fence forming the eastern boundary of the premises attached to Moor Lane Farm (that is to say, the close numbered 175 upon the Ordnance Survey Map of the said Urban District of Ashton in Makerfield published in the year 1928 on the scale of 25 inches to a mile and also upon the map or plan annexed to this Representation) and extending thence first southward to and then in various directions along such fence and along the fence forming the southern boundary of the same premises for a distance in all of 8½ chains or thereabouts to the point where the last mentioned fence meets the fence which divides the close numbered 174A upon the said maps from the close numbered 174 upon the same maps, and extending thence first southward and then in various directions along the fences which divide the said close numbered 174A and the closes numbered 221, 178, and 218 upon the said maps from the said close numbered 174 and the close numbered 181 upon the same maps for a distance of 32 chains or thereabouts to the point where the fence which divides the said close numbered 218 from the said close numbered 181 meets the fence forming the north western boundary of the Lancashire Union Line of the London Midland and Scottish Railway, and extending thence south-eastward in a straight line across the said line of railway for a distance of 1½ chains or thereabouts to a point in the middle of the footpath leading along the south eastern side of such railway, and extending thence south westward along the middle of such footpath for a distance of 15 chains or thereabouts to a point opposite to the northern end of the fence which divides the close numbered 261 upon the said maps from the close numbered 262 upon the same maps, and extending thence first southward to and then first southward and then in various directions along the fences which divide the said close numbered 261 and the close numbered 766 upon the said maps from the said close numbered 262 and the closes numbered 765 and 764 upon the same maps for a distance in all of 20 chains or thereabouts to the south eastern corner of the said close numbered 766, and extending thence eastward to and along the middle of Jack Brook for a distance of 10½ chains or thereabouts to the point at Knowles Brook Bridge where it is crossed by the boundary which divides the said Parish of Ashton in Makerfield from the said Parish of Saint Thomas, Ashton in Makerfield.

"II. And also all that contiguous portion of the said Parish of Saint Thomas, Ashton in Makerfield, which is bounded upon the north west and upon the north by the above described portion of the Parish of Ashton in Makerfield and upon the remaining sides, that

is to say, upon the south east and upon the south, by an imaginary line commencing upon the boundary which divides the said Parish of Ashton in Makerfield from the said Parish of Saint Thomas, Ashton in Makerfield, at the junction of Nicol Road with Shaw Street, and extending thence south eastward along the middle of Shaw Street for a distance of 2½ chains or thereabouts to a point opposite to the middle of the footpath leading into Wigan Road, and extending thence south westward to and along the middle of such footpath for a distance of 14 chains or thereabouts to the point where it reaches the eastern side of Wigan Road, and extending thence in a straight line due west (thereby crossing Wigan Road and the close numbered 757 upon the said maps) for a distance of 3½ chains or thereabouts to a point in the middle of Jack Brook, and extending thence westward along the middle of Jack Brook for a distance of 10½ chains or thereabouts to the point at Knowles Brook Bridge where it is crossed by the boundary which divides the said Parish of Saint Thomas, Ashton in Makerfield, from the said Parish of Ashton in Makerfield."

And whereas the said Representation has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said Representation, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts.

And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of Liverpool.

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Union of Benefices Measure, 1923, duly prepared, and laid before His Majesty in Council, a Scheme bearing date the 30th day of July, 1931, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, acting in pursuance of the Union of Benefices Measure, 1923, have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council, the following Scheme for effecting the union of the Benefice (being a Vicarage) of Coddington and the Benefice (being a Vicarage) of Newark upon Trent (Saint Mary Magdalene) both of which Benefices are situate in the County of Nottingham and in the Diocese of Southwell:

"Whereas Commissioners appointed at our request by the Right Reverend Henry, Bishop of Southwell, pursuant to the provisions of the said Union of Benefices Measure, 1923, to inquire into and report upon the union of the
