

WE, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, acting in pursuance of the Act of the twenty-ninth and thirtieth years of Her late Majesty, Queen Victoria, chapter one hundred and eleven, section five, do hereby, subject as hereinafter mentioned, grant to the Incumbent of each of the benefices (all in the county of Middlesex and in the diocese of London) the names whereof are stated in the first column of the Schedule hereto, and to his successors Incumbents of the same benefice, the yearly sum being the interest or dividends arising in respect of a sum of Local Loans three pounds per centum Stock, the amount of which is stated in the second column of the Schedule opposite to the name of the Benefice, or in respect of other the investments for the time being representing the same, such yearly sum to be payable out of the Common Fund under our control, and to be calculated as from the second day of June in the year one thousand nine hundred and thirty-one: Provided always that if at any time lands, tithes, or other hereditaments sufficient in our opinion

to produce the said yearly sum or any part thereof shall be annexed by us to the benefice in substitution for such yearly sum or for such part thereof, our liability for the payment of such yearly sum or of such part thereof, as the case may be, shall thereupon and thereafter cease and determine: Provided further that the yearly sum so granted to the Benefice of Harrow on the Hill, or any portion thereof, shall be payable only upon the production to us, from time to time, of a certificate (in such form as may be required by us) under the hand of the Bishop of London, certifying that, during the period then ended, there has been employed within the Parish of the Benefice and duly licensed by such Bishop a Curate in Charge of the Conventional District of Saint Leonard, Kenton.
