At the Court at *Buckingham Palace*, the 7th day of *October*, 1931.

PRESENT,

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS there was this day read at the Board a Memorial from the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, dated the 3rd day of October, 1931 (C.W. 7399/31), in the words following, viz. :—

“Whereas by Section 3 of the Naval and Marine Pay and Pensions Act, 1865, it is enacted, *inter alia*, that all pay, pensions or other allowances in the nature thereof, payable in respect of services in Your Majesty's Naval or Marine Force to a person being, or having been, an Officer, Seaman, or Marine therein, or to the widow or any relative of a deceased Officer, Seaman or Marine, shall be paid in such manner, and subject to such restrictions, conditions and provisions as are from time to time directed by Order in Council:

“And whereas by Order in Council bearing date the 22nd day of February, 1870, regulations were laid down governing the grant to Executive Officers of Your Majesty's Naval Service of a step or steps in rank on or after retirement:

“And whereas by various subsequent Orders in Council the said regulations have been modified and amended and similar regulations have been instituted from time to time em-

powering us to grant a step or steps in rank on or after retirement to Officers, other than Executive Officers, of Your Majesty's Naval Service and to Officers of the Royal Marine Corps:

“And whereas by Your Majesty's Order in Council bearing date the 9th day of March, 1914, we were empowered, *inter alia*, to retire a Captain, whom we had decided not to employ further after his promotion to Flag rank, on his promotion to the rank of Rear Admiral:

“And whereas by Your Majesty's Orders in Council bearing dates the 21st day of December, 1917, and the 18th day of December, 1918, similar powers were conferred on us of retiring an Engineer Officer on the occasion of his promotion to the rank of Engineer Rear Admiral and a Medical Officer on the occasion of his promotion to the rank of Surgeon Rear Admiral, when desirable in the interests of the Service:

“And whereas we consider that, with certain exceptions, the grant of steps in rank on or after retirement should be discontinued and that Officers should retire with and retain the rank last held by them on the Active List:

“And whereas we are of opinion that Captains, Engineer Captains or Captains (E) and Surgeon Captains, whom we have decided not to employ in higher ranks should not be promoted but be retired in their existing ranks as soon as an Officer below them on the list

is promoted, and further that the regulations respecting the retired pay of such Officers and the pensions of their widows should be amended:

"We beg leave humbly to recommend that Your Majesty may be graciously pleased by Your Order in Council to sanction the proposals set forth in the annexed Schedule.

"The Lords Commissioners of Your Majesty's Treasury have signified their concurrence, where necessary, in these proposals.

"SCHEDULE.

"A.—Steps in rank on and after retirement.

The grant of steps in rank on or after retirement to Officers of the Royal Navy and Royal Marines to be discontinued as from the date of these regulations, except as provided hereunder:—

(i) Commissioned Officers from Warrant Rank of all categories, including Schoolmasters and Officers of the Royal Naval Shore Wireless and Shore Signal Services, to remain eligible under existing regulations for the rank or equivalent rank of Lieutenant on retirement.

(ii) All Officers, except Captains on the executive list of seniority of 1926 and below, whether on the active or the retired list at the date of these regulations to retain any privilege of advancement applicable to their existing ranks.

(iii) The changes proposed to be without prejudice to the powers conferred on the Admiralty by Orders in Council of the 24th April, 1902, and the 15th February, 1916, of advancing Officers on the Retired List in special cases, both in peace and war.

"B.—Captains, Engineer Captains or Captains (E) and Surgeon Captains whom it has been decided not to employ in a higher rank.

1. Captains, Engineer Captains or Captains (E) and Surgeon Captains, whom it has been decided not to employ in a higher rank, to be retired in their existing ranks as soon as an Officer below them on their respective lists is promoted.

2. The retired pay of such Captains, Engineer Captains or Captains (E) and Surgeon Captains, if they are qualified for promotion under such regulations as are from time to time in force, to be calculated on the Rear Admiral's scale, but subject to a maximum standard rate of £900 per annum, and no such Officer to be eligible for retired pay at the Rear Admiral's rate of half pay.

3. The widows of Captains, Engineer Captains or Captains (E) and Surgeon Captains, who have been retired with retired pay under rule 2 above, to be eligible for pension at the rate applicable to the widow of a Commodore.

4. These rules to apply to all Engineer and Medical Officers promoted to the ranks of Engineer Captain or Captain (E) and Surgeon Captain after the date of these regulations and to executive Captains of seniority 1926 and below."

His Majesty, having taken the said Memorial into consideration, was pleased, by and with

the advice of His Privy Council, to approve of what is therein proposed.

And the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty are to give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

And whereas the Kingdom of Siam has acceded to the said Convention subject to the reservations mentioned in the Schedule to this Order:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, and by virtue of the authority conferred upon Him by the Copyright Act, 1911, is pleased to order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:—

1. The Principal Order shall extend to Siam as if that country were amongst the Foreign Countries of the Copyright Union therein named, subject to the following modifications:—

(a) The provisions of Article 2, proviso (iii) (b), Article 2, proviso (iii) (c), Article 2, proviso (iii) (d) and Article 2, proviso (iii) (e) shall apply as if Siam were included amongst the Foreign Countries named in those provisions.

(b) In the application of the provisions of Article 3 of the Principal Order to works of which the country of origin is Siam the date of this Order shall be substituted for the commencement of the Act and for the commencement of the Principal Order.

(c) In the application to such works of Sections 1 (2) (d) and 19 of the Copyright Act, 1911, the date of this Order shall be substituted for the commencement of the Act in Sections 19 (7) and 19 (8) wherever that expression occurs, and the 17th day of July, 1931, for the passing of the Act.

(d) In the application to such works of Section 24 of the Copyright Act, 1911, the date of this Order shall be substituted for the commencement of the Act wherever that expression occurs in Sub-section 1 (a) and for the 26th July, 1910, in Sub-section 1 (b).

2. This Order shall not apply to that part of the Mandated Territory of Palestine which is known as Trans-Jordan.

3. This Order may be cited as the Copyright Convention (Siam) Order, 1931.

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, and by virtue of the authority conferred upon Him by the Copyright Act, 1911, is pleased to order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:—

1. The Principal Order shall extend to Liechtenstein as if that country were amongst the Foreign Countries of the Copyright Union therein named, subject to the following modifications:—

(a) The provisions of Article 2, proviso (iii) (a) shall apply as if Liechtenstein were included amongst the Foreign Countries named in those provisions.

(b) In the application of the provisions of Article 3 of the Principal Order to works of which the country of origin is Liechtenstein the date of this Order shall be substituted for the commencement of the Act and for the commencement of the Principal Order.

(c) In the application to such works of Sections 1 (2) (d) and 19 of the Copyright Act, 1911, the date of this Order shall be substituted for the commencement of the Act in Sections 19 (7) and 19 (8) wherever that expression occurs, and the 30th day of July, 1931, for the passing of the Act.

(d) In the application to such works of the provisions of Section 24 of the Copyright Act, 1911, the date of this Order shall be substituted for the commencement of the Act

wherever that expression occurs in Subsection (1) (a) and for the 26th July, 1910, in Subsection (1) (b).

2. This Order shall not apply to that part of the Mandated Territory of Palestine which is known as Trans-Jordan.

3. This Order may be cited as the Copyright Convention (Liechtenstein) Order, 1931.

WHEREAS a Convention on the Execution of Arbitral Awards was, on the twenty-sixth day of September, nineteen hundred and twenty-seven, signed at Geneva on behalf of His Majesty:

And whereas by subsection (1) of section one of the Arbitration (Foreign Awards) Act, 1930, it is provided that Part I of that Act applies to any award made after the twenty-eighth day of July, nineteen hundred and twenty-four—

(a) in pursuance of an agreement for arbitration to which the protocol set out in the Schedule to the Arbitration Clauses (Protocol) Act, 1924, applies; and

(b) between persons of whom one is subject to the jurisdiction of some one of such Powers as His Majesty, being satisfied that reciprocal provisions have been made, may by Order in Council declare to be parties to the said Convention and of whom the other is subject to the jurisdiction of some other of the Powers aforesaid; and

(c) in one of such territories as His Majesty, being satisfied that reciprocal provisions have been made, may by Order in Council declare to be territories to which the said Convention applies:

And whereas His Majesty is satisfied that reciprocal provisions have been made as aforesaid by the Foreign Powers set out in the first column of Part II of the Schedule to this Order and as respects the territories belonging to such Powers set out in the second column of that part:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of the Privy Council, in pursuance of the powers conferred upon Him by the said Act and of all other powers enabling Him in that behalf, is pleased to declare, and it is hereby declared as follows:—

1. The Powers set out in the first column of the Schedule to this Order are parties to the said Convention.

2. The territories set out in the second column of the said Schedule are territories to which the said Convention applies.

3. This Order may be cited as the Arbitration (Foreign Awards) No. 3 Order, 1931, and shall come into force on the 13th day of October, 1931.

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS by the Saint Lucia (Legislative Council) Order in Council, 1924, it was ordered that there should be in and for the Island of Saint Lucia a Legislative Council which should be constituted as is therein mentioned:

And whereas by the said Order His Majesty reserved to Himself, His heirs and successors, full power and authority from time to time to revoke, alter or amend the said Order as to Him or them should seem fit:

And whereas it is expedient to make other provision than is contained in the Second, Fourth, Fifth, Sixth, Eighth, Ninth, Tenth, Twelfth, Fourteenth and Thirty-sixth Clauses of the said Order:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by virtue and in exercise of all the powers enabling Him in that behalf, is pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:—

I. This Order may be cited as the Saint Lucia (Legislative Council) Amendment Order in Council, 1931.

II. As from the date of the coming into operation of this Order the Second, Fourth, Fifth, Sixth, Eighth, Ninth, Tenth, Twelfth, Fourteenth and Thirty-sixth Clauses of the Saint Lucia (Legislative Council) Order in Council, 1924, are hereby revoked, but without prejudice to anything lawfully done thereunder, and from and after such date the said Saint Lucia (Legislative Council) Order in Council, 1924, shall be read and construed as if, instead of the Second, Fourth, Fifth, Sixth, Eighth, Ninth, Tenth, Twelfth and Fourteenth

Clauses thereof, the following Clauses had been inserted therein:—

“ II. In this Order ‘ His Majesty ’ includes His Majesty's heirs and successors; ‘ Secretary of State ’ means one of His Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State; ‘ Governor ’ means the Governor and Commander-in-Chief for the time being of the Windward Islands and includes every person for the time being administering the Government of the Windward Islands; ‘ the Island ’ and ‘ Saint Lucia ’ mean the Island of Saint Lucia and its Dependencies; ‘ the Council ’ means the Legislative Council in and for the Island of Saint Lucia and its Dependencies, which Council shall be known as the Legislative Council of Saint Lucia; words importing the masculine gender shall, unless the context otherwise requires, include the feminine.”

“ IV. The Council shall consist of the Governor, of three *ex officio* Members, of three Nominated Official Members, of three Nominated Unofficial Members and of three Elected Members.

“ The *ex officio* Members shall be the persons for the time being lawfully discharging the functions of the respective offices of Colonial Secretary, of Attorney-General, and of Treasurer.

“ The Nominated Official Members shall be such persons holding office in the public service of the Island, and not exceeding three in number at any one time, as His Majesty may from time to time appoint by any Instruction or Warrant under His Sign Manual and Signet, or as the Governor in pursuance of instructions from His Majesty through a Secretary of State may from time to time appoint under the Public Seal of the Island.

“ Any person holding office in the public service of the Island may be required to

serve as a Nominated Official Member of the Council, and if any such person having been appointed by His Majesty or by the Governor to be a Member shall decline to act in that capacity he shall *ipso facto* vacate his office.

"The Nominated Unofficial Members shall be such persons not holding any office in the public service of the Island, and not exceeding three in number at any one time, as His Majesty may from time to time appoint by any Instruction or Warrant under His Sign Manual and Signet, or as the Governor in pursuance of instructions from His Majesty through a Secretary of State may from time to time appoint under the Public Seal of the Island.

"The Elected Members shall be persons to be elected as hereinafter provided."

"V. The Members of the Council shall take precedence as His Majesty may specially assign, and in default thereof, first the *ex officio* Members in the order in which their respective offices are above mentioned, secondly the Nominated Official Members according to the priority of their respective appointments to the Council, or if appointed by the same instrument, according to the order in which they are named therein, thirdly the Nominated Unofficial Members according to the priority of their respective appointments to the Council, or if appointed by the same instrument, according to the order in which they are named therein, and fourthly the Elected Members who shall rank among themselves in the order of date of their election, and in the case of any two or more of them being elected on the same day according to the number of votes obtained by each, and in the case of any two or more of them receiving the same number of votes, in the alphabetical order of their names."

"VI. No person shall be capable of being elected a Member of the Council, or, having been elected, shall sit or vote in the Council, who—

- (1) Is the holder of any office of emolument under the Crown, or under a Municipal Corporation within the Island; or,
- (2) Is a minister of religion; or,
- (3) Is the returning officer of the district for which the election is held; or,
- (4) Is not entitled to vote at the election of a Member of the Council for some electoral district.

"The term 'Minister of Religion' in this clause and in clause VIII means any clergyman, minister, priest, or other person who exercises spiritual functions or performs the offices of religion for or in respect to any Christian or other church, community, or body within Saint Lucia.

"The term 'office of emolument' in this clause does not include a pension or other allowance to an officer who has ceased to be in the service of the Crown or of a Municipal Corporation.

"No person shall be capable of being elected a Member of the Council for any electoral district, or having been elected shall sit or vote in the Council, unless he possesses a clear annual income of £200, and either has resided in that electoral district for twelve months immediately preceding the day of election, or is the owner of real property

situate in that electoral district of the value of at least £500 above all charges and encumbrances affecting the same."

"VIII. If any Elected Member of the Council shall, by writing under his hand, addressed to the Governor, resign his seat in the Council, or shall cease to possess an income or property qualification as required by clause VI of this Order, or shall, without leave of the Governor previously obtained, be absent from the sittings of the Council for three months, or shall make any declaration or acknowledgment of allegiance to any Foreign State or Power, or shall become a citizen or subject of any Foreign State or Power, or shall be adjudicated a bankrupt, or shall be sentenced in any part of His Majesty's dominions to death, penal servitude, or imprisonment with hard labour or for a term exceeding twelve months, or shall accept any office or emolument under the Crown or under a Municipal Corporation within Saint Lucia, or shall become a minister of religion, his seat in the Council shall thereupon become vacant.

"Whenever it shall be shown to the satisfaction of the Governor that the seat of an Elected Member has become vacant, the Governor shall, as soon as possible issue a writ for the election of a new member in the place of the member whose seat has become vacant, but if any question shall arise as to the fact of such vacancy, it shall be referred to and decided by the Royal Court of Saint Lucia."

"IX. The Nominated Members of the Council shall hold their seats until the next dissolution of the Council after their appointment, unless previously removed by His Majesty by virtue of an Instruction or Warrant under His Sign Manual and Signet or through a Secretary of State or suspended by the Governor under the power for that purpose hereby vested in him, or unless they shall previously resign their seats. The Nominated Members may again be appointed in the same manner as aforesaid to the next Council after a dissolution or to any subsequent Council.

"Provided that if any Nominated Official Member of the Council shall cease to hold office in the public service of the Island, his seat in the Council shall thereupon become vacant."

"X. If any Nominated Unofficial Member of the Council shall, without the leave of the Governor previously obtained, be absent from the sittings of the Council for three months, or shall make any declaration or acknowledgment of allegiance to any Foreign State or Power, or shall become a citizen or subject of any Foreign State or Power, or shall be adjudicated a bankrupt, or shall be sentenced in any part of His Majesty's dominions to death or penal servitude, or to imprisonment with hard labour or for a term exceeding twelve months, his seat in the Council shall thereupon become vacant."

"XII.—1. Whenever any person sitting as an *ex officio* Member of the Council shall be administering the Government of the Island, or whenever any person shall be lawfully discharging the functions of more than one of the offices the holders of which are *ex officio* Members of the Council, the Governor

may by an instrument under the Public Seal of the Island, appoint some other person holding office in the public service of the Island to be provisionally a Member of the Council during the period of such administration, or for so long as the functions of the said offices continue to be discharged by one person as aforesaid, as the case may be.

"2. Whenever the seat of a Nominated Official Member shall become vacant from any cause other than a dissolution of the Council, or whenever any Nominated Official Member shall, by writing under his hand, resign his seat in the Council, or shall die or be suspended from the exercise of his functions as a Member of the Council, or be declared by the Governor, by an instrument under the Public Seal of the Island, to be incapable of exercising his functions as a Member of the Council, or be temporarily absent from Saint Lucia or be on leave of absence granted by the Governor from his office in the public service of the Island, or shall either permanently or temporarily become an *ex officio* Member of the Council, the Governor may by an instrument under the Public Seal of the Island, appoint in the place of such Member, some other person holding office in the public service of the Island to be provisionally a Member of the Council. Any persons so provisionally appointed under this sub-clause or the preceding sub-clause shall have precedence in the Council next after the Nominated Official Members and amongst themselves according to the date of their appointment to be provisionally Members of the Council.

"3. Whenever the seat of a Nominated Unofficial Member shall become vacant from any cause other than a dissolution of the Council, or whenever any Nominated Unofficial Member shall, by writing under his hand, resign his seat in the Council, or shall die or be suspended from the exercise of his functions as a Member of the Council, or be declared by the Governor by an instrument under the Public Seal of the Island to be incapable of exercising his functions as a Member of the Council, or be temporarily absent from Saint Lucia, or shall by reason of his being appointed either permanently or temporarily to an office in the public service of the Island become disqualified to sit as a Nominated Unofficial Member, the Governor may, by an instrument under the Public Seal of the Island appoint in the place of such Member some other person not holding any office in the public service of the Island to be provisionally a Member of the Council. Any persons so provisionally appointed shall have precedence in the Council next after the Nominated Unofficial Members and amongst themselves according to the date of their appointment to be provisionally Members of the Council.

"4. Every such provisional appointment may be disallowed by His Majesty through a Secretary of State, or may be revoked by the Governor by any such instrument as aforesaid."

"XIV. Every person provisionally appointed as hereinbefore provided shall be to all intents and purposes a Member of the Council until his appointment shall be disallowed or revoked, or superseded by the permanent appointment of a Nominated Official or Unofficial Member of the Council,

as the case may be, or until the person in whose place he has been appointed, shall cease to administer the Government of the Island or shall cease to discharge the functions of more than one of the offices the holders of which are *ex officio* Members of the Council, or shall be relieved from suspension or declared by the Governor by an instrument under the Public Seal of the Island to be capable of exercising the functions of a Member of the Council, or shall return to Saint Lucia, or shall resume the duties of his office in the public service of the Island, or shall cease to be an *ex officio* Member, or shall cease to be disqualified as aforesaid, as the case may be."

III. His Majesty hereby reserves to Himself, His heirs and successors, full power and authority from time to time to revoke, alter or amend this Order as to Him or them shall seem fit.

IV. This Order shall be published in the Saint Lucia Gazette and shall thereupon come into operation.

And the Right Honourable Lord Passfield, one of His Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, is to give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

And whereas by the said Order His Majesty reserved to Himself, His heirs and successors, full power and authority from time to time to revoke, alter or amend the said Order as to Him or them should seem fit:

And whereas it is expedient to make other provision than is contained in the Second, Fourth, Fifth, Sixth, Eighth, Ninth, Tenth, Eleventh, Twelfth, Fourteenth and Thirty-sixth Clauses of the said Order:

Now, therefore, in pursuance of the powers in His Majesty vested in virtue of the said Acts, and of the powers reserved to His Majesty by the said Order, it is hereby ordered by His Majesty, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, as follows:—

I. This Order may be cited as the Saint Vincent (Legislative Council) Amendment Order in Council, 1931.

II. As from the date of the coming into operation of this Order the Second, Fourth, Fifth, Sixth, Eighth, Ninth, Tenth, Eleventh, Twelfth, Fourteenth and Thirty-sixth Clauses

of the Saint Vincent (Legislative Council) Order in Council, 1924, are hereby revoked, but without prejudice to anything lawfully done thereunder, and from and after such date the said Saint Vincent (Legislative Council) Order in Council, 1924, shall be read and construed as if, instead of the Second, Fourth, Fifth, Sixth, Eighth, Ninth, Tenth, Eleventh, Twelfth and Fourteenth Clauses thereof, the following Clauses had been inserted therein:—

“ II. In this Order ‘ His Majesty ’ includes His Majesty’s heirs and successors; ‘ Secretary of State ’ means one of His Majesty’s Principal Secretaries of State; ‘ Governor ’ means the Governor and Commander-in-Chief for the time being of the Windward Islands and includes every person for the time being administering the Government of the Windward Islands; ‘ the Island ’ and ‘ Saint Vincent ’ mean the Island of Saint Vincent and its Dependencies; ‘ the Council ’ means the Legislative Council in and for the Island of Saint Vincent and its Dependencies, which Council shall be known as the Legislative Council of Saint Vincent; words importing the masculine gender shall, unless the context otherwise requires, include the feminine.”

“ IV. The Council shall consist of the Governor, of three *ex officio* Members, of one Nominated Official Member, of one Nominated Unofficial Member, and of three Elected Members.

“ The *ex officio* Members shall be the persons for the time being lawfully discharging the functions of the respective offices of Colonial Secretary, of Attorney-General, and of Treasurer.

“ The Nominated Official Member shall be such a person holding office in the public service of the Island, as His Majesty may from time to time appoint by any Instruction or Warrant under His Sign Manual and Signet, or as the Governor in pursuance of instructions from His Majesty through a Secretary of State may from time to time appoint under the Public Seal of the Island.

“ Any person holding office in the public service of the Island may be required to serve as a Nominated Official Member of the Council, and if any such person having been appointed by His Majesty or by the Governor to be a Member shall decline to act in that capacity he shall *ipso facto* vacate his office.

“ The Nominated Unofficial Member shall be such a person, not holding any office in the public service of the Island, as His Majesty may from time to time appoint by any Instruction or Warrant under His Sign Manual and Signet, or as the Governor in pursuance of instructions from His Majesty through a Secretary of State may from time to time appoint under the Public Seal of the Island.

“ The Elected Members shall be persons to be elected as hereinafter provided.”

“ V. The Members of the Council shall take precedence as His Majesty may specially assign, and in default thereof, first the *ex officio* Members in the order in which their respective offices are above mentioned, secondly the Nominated Official Member, thirdly the Nominated Unofficial Member, fourthly the Elected Members who shall rank among themselves in the order of date

of their election, and in the case of any two or more of them being elected on the same day according to the number of votes obtained by each, and in the case of any two or more of them receiving the same number of votes, in the alphabetical order of their names.”

“ VI. No person shall be capable of being elected a Member of the Council, or, having been elected shall sit or vote in the Council, who—

(1) Is the holder of any office of emolument under the Crown, or under a Municipal Corporation within the Island; or

(2) Is a minister of religion; or,

(3) Is the returning officer of the district for which the election is held; or,

(4) Is not entitled to vote at the election of a Member of the Council for some electoral district.

“ The term ‘ Minister of Religion ’ in this clause and in clause VIII, means any clergyman, minister, priest, or other person who exercises spiritual functions or performs the offices of religion for or in respect of any Christian or other church, community, or body within Saint Vincent.

“ The term ‘ office of emolument ’ in this clause does not include a pension or other allowance to an officer who has ceased to be in the service of the Crown or of a Municipal Corporation.

“ No person shall be capable of being elected a Member of the Council for any electoral district, or having been elected shall sit or vote in the Council, unless he possesses a clear annual income of £200, and either has resided in that electoral district for twelve months immediately preceding the day of election, or is the owner of real property situate in that electoral district of the value of at least £500 above all charges and encumbrances affecting the same.”

“ VIII. If any Elected Member of the Council shall, by writing under his hand, addressed to the Governor, resign his seat in the Council, or shall cease to possess an income or property qualification as required by clause VI of this Order, or shall, without leave of the Governor previously obtained, be absent from the sittings of the Council for three months, or shall make any declaration or acknowledgment of allegiance to any Foreign State or Power, or shall become a citizen or subject of any Foreign State or Power, or shall be adjudicated a bankrupt, or shall be sentenced in any part of His Majesty’s dominions to death, penal servitude, or imprisonment with hard labour or for a term exceeding twelve months, or shall accept any office of emolument under the Crown or under a Municipal Corporation, within Saint Vincent, or shall become a minister of religion, his seat in the Council shall thereupon become vacant.

“ Whenever it shall be shown to the satisfaction of the Governor that the seat of an Elected Member has become vacant, the Governor shall, as soon as possible issue a writ for the election of a new member in the place of the member whose seat has become vacant, but if any question shall arise as to the fact of such vacancy, it shall be referred to and decided by the Supreme Court.”

"IX. The Nominated Members of the Council shall hold their seats until the next dissolution of the Council after their appointment, unless previously removed by His Majesty by virtue of an Instruction or Warrant under His Sign Manual and Signet or through a Secretary of State or suspended by the Governor under the power for that purpose hereby vested in him, or unless they shall previously resign their seats. The Nominated Members may again be appointed in the same manner as aforesaid to the next Council after a dissolution or to any subsequent Council.

"Provided that if any person serving as the Nominated Official Member of the Council shall cease to hold office in the public service of the Island, his seat in the Council shall thereupon become vacant."

"X. If the Nominated Unofficial Member of the Council shall, without the leave of the Governor previously obtained, be absent from the sittings of the Council for three months, or shall make any declaration or acknowledgment of allegiance to any Foreign State or Power, or shall become a citizen or subject of any Foreign State or Power, or shall be adjudicated a bankrupt, or shall be sentenced in any part of His Majesty's dominions to death or penal servitude, or to imprisonment with hard labour or for a term exceeding twelve months, his seat in the Council shall thereupon become vacant."

"XI. The Governor may, by an instrument under the Public Seal of the Island suspend any Nominated Member from the exercise of his functions as a Member of the Council. Every such suspension shall be forthwith reported by the Governor to His Majesty through a Secretary of State, and shall remain in force unless and until either it shall be removed by the Governor by an instrument under the said Seal or it shall be disallowed by His Majesty through a Secretary of State, and such disallowance shall be published in the Saint Vincent Government Gazette."

"XII.—1. Whenever any person sitting as an *ex officio* Member of the Council shall be administering the Government of the Island, or whenever any person shall be lawfully discharging the functions of more than one of the offices the holders of which are *ex officio* Members of the Council, the Governor may, by an instrument under the Public Seal of the Island, appoint some other person holding office in the public service of the Island to be provisionally a Member of the Council during the period of such administration, or for so long as the functions of the said offices continue to be discharged by one person as aforesaid, as the case may be.

"2. Whenever the seat of the Nominated Official Member shall become vacant from any cause other than a dissolution of the Council, or whenever the Nominated Official Member shall, by writing under his hand, resign his seat in the Council, or shall die or be suspended from the exercise of his functions, as a Member of the Council, or be declared by the Governor, by an instrument under the Public Seal of the Island, to be incapable of exercising his functions as a Member of the Council, or be temporarily absent from Saint Vincent or be on leave of

absence granted by the Governor from his office in the public service of the Island, or shall either permanently or temporarily become an *ex officio* Member of the Council, the Governor may, by an instrument under the Public Seal of the Island, appoint in the place of such Member, some other person holding office in the public service of the Island to be provisionally a Member of the Council. Any persons so provisionally appointed under this sub-clause or the preceding sub-clause shall have precedence in the Council next after the Nominated Official Member and amongst themselves according to the date of their appointment to be provisionally Members of the Council.

"3. Whenever the seat of the Nominated Unofficial Member shall become vacant from any cause other than a dissolution of the Council, or whenever the Nominated Unofficial Member shall, by writing under his hand, resign his seat in the Council, or shall die or be suspended from the exercise of his functions as a Member of the Council, or be declared by the Governor, by an instrument under the Public Seal of the Island, to be incapable of exercising his functions as a Member of the Council, or be temporarily absent from Saint Vincent, or, shall by reason of his being appointed either permanently or temporarily to an office in the public service of the Island become disqualified to sit as a Nominated Unofficial Member, the Governor may, by an instrument under the Public Seal of the Island, appoint in the place of such Member, some other person not holding any office in the public service of the Island to be provisionally a Member of the Council. The person so provisionally appointed shall have in the Council the precedence assigned to the Nominated Unofficial Member.

"4. Every such provisional appointment may be disallowed by His Majesty through a Secretary of State, or may be revoked by the Governor by any such instrument as aforesaid."

"XIV. Every person provisionally appointed as hereinbefore provided shall be to all intents and purposes a Member of the Council until his appointment shall be disallowed or revoked, or superseded by the permanent appointment of a Nominated Official or Unofficial Member of the Council, as the case may be, or until the person in whose place he has been appointed, shall cease to administer the Government of the Island or shall cease to discharge the functions of more than one of the offices the holders of which are *ex officio* Members of the Council, or shall be relieved from suspension or declared by the Governor by an instrument under the Public Seal of the Island to be capable of exercising the functions of a Member of the Council, or shall return to Saint Vincent, or shall resume the duties of his office in the public service of the Island, or shall cease to be an *ex officio* Member, or shall cease to be disqualified as aforesaid, as the case may be."

III. His Majesty hereby reserves to Himself, His heirs and successors, full power and authority from time to time to revoke, alter or amend this Order as to Him or them shall deem fit.



IV. This Order shall be published in the Saint Vincent Government Gazette and shall thereupon come into operation.

And the Right Honourable Lord Passfield, one of His Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, is to give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

The Minister of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in him under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1927, and of every other power enabling him in this behalf, hereby orders as follows:—

*Further Contraction of the Huntingdon Foot-and-Mouth Disease Infected Area.*

1.—(1) The Foot-and-Mouth Disease (Infected Areas) Order of 1931 (No. 52) as amended by the Foot-and-Mouth Disease (Infected Areas) Order of 1931 (No. 54) shall be read and have effect as if the Area described in the First Schedule to this Order were substituted for the Infected Area described in the Schedule to the Foot-and-Mouth Disease (Infected Areas) Order of 1931 (No. 54).

(2) This Article shall come into operation on the twenty-sixth day of October, nineteen hundred and thirty-one.

*Release of Infected Area from Restrictions.*

2. The Area described in the First Schedule to this Order shall cease to be a Foot-and-Mouth Disease Infected Area for the purposes of the Foot-and-Mouth Disease (Infected Areas Restrictions) Order of 1925 on the second day of November, nineteen hundred and thirty-one, on which day this Order and the Orders described in the Second Schedule to this Order shall be and are hereby revoked.

All employment in excess of 5½ hours on Saturday or on such other day (not being Sunday) in every week as may be agreed between the employer and the worker except employment in connection with the feeding and care of animals.

(c) In the case of male workers employed wholly or mainly as horsemen:

(i) All employment in excess of 5½ hours on Saturday or on such other day (not



being Sunday) in every week as may be agreed between the employer and the worker.

(ii) All employment in any week in excess of 50 hours in summer or 48 hours in winter excluding from those 50 or 48 hours respectively :—

employment which under sub-paragraph (i) above is to be treated as overtime employment,

employment in connection with the feeding and immediate care of animals,

employment on the hay, corn and the late potato harvests,

but so that no employment in connection with the feeding and immediate care of animals or employment on the hay, corn or late potato harvests shall rank as overtime employment.

For the purpose of this Order employment in winter shall be deemed to be employment during the period commencing on 1st November, 1931, and terminating on 27th March, 1932, and employment in summer shall be deemed to be employment during the period commencing on 28th March, 1932, and terminating on 29th October, 1932.

This Order shall come into operation on 1st November, 1931, and shall remain in force until 29th October, 1932.

The West Riding of Yorkshire Agricultural Wages Committee, in pursuance of the powers vested in them by the Agricultural Wages (Regulation) Act, 1924, and the Regulations made thereunder, do by this Order vary, as from 24th November, 1931, their Order of 22nd October, 1928, defining the employment which is to be treated as overtime employment for the purpose of the application of any differential rate of wages for overtime fixed by the said Committee for the area comprising the administrative county of the West Riding of Yorkshire, which, for the purposes of the said Act shall be deemed to include the cities and county boroughs of Bradford, Leeds, Sheffield, Wakefield and York, and the county boroughs of Barnsley, Dewsbury, Doncaster, Halifax, Huddersfield and Rotherham so as to provide that such employment shall be as follows:—

1. In the case of male workers employed as defined in clauses 1 and 2 of the Order of the Agricultural Wages Board for the time being in force fixing minimum and overtime rates of wages for workers employed in agriculture in the said area:—

(a) All employment in any week (excluding all hours which are to be treated as hours of overtime employment) in excess of 48 hours in Winter and 52½ hours in Summer, and also in excess of the additional 12 hours on weekdays and 3 hours on Sundays for work in connection with the care of and attention to stock.

(b) All employment except one hour for work in connection with the care of and attention to stock after 12 noon on a Saturday or on such other day (not being Sunday) in any week as may be agreed between the employer and the worker.

(c) All employment on Sundays in excess of 3 hours for work in connection with the care of and attention to stock.

2. In the case of all other male workers:—

(a) All employment in any week (excluding all hours which are to be treated as hours of overtime employment) in excess of 48 hours in Winter and 52½ hours in Summer.

(b) All employment after 12 noon on Saturday or such other day (not being Sunday) in any week as may be agreed between the employer and the worker.

(c) All employment on a Sunday.

3. In the case of female workers:—

(a) All employment in excess of 44 hours per week (excluding all hours which are to be treated as hours of overtime employment).

(b) All employment after 12 noon on Saturday or such other day (not being Sunday) in any week as may be agreed between the employer and the worker.

(c) All employment on a Sunday.

4. For the purpose of this Order employment in Summer shall be deemed to be employment during the period commencing on the first Monday in February and terminating on the last Saturday in October, and employment in

Winter shall be deemed to be employment during the rest of the year.

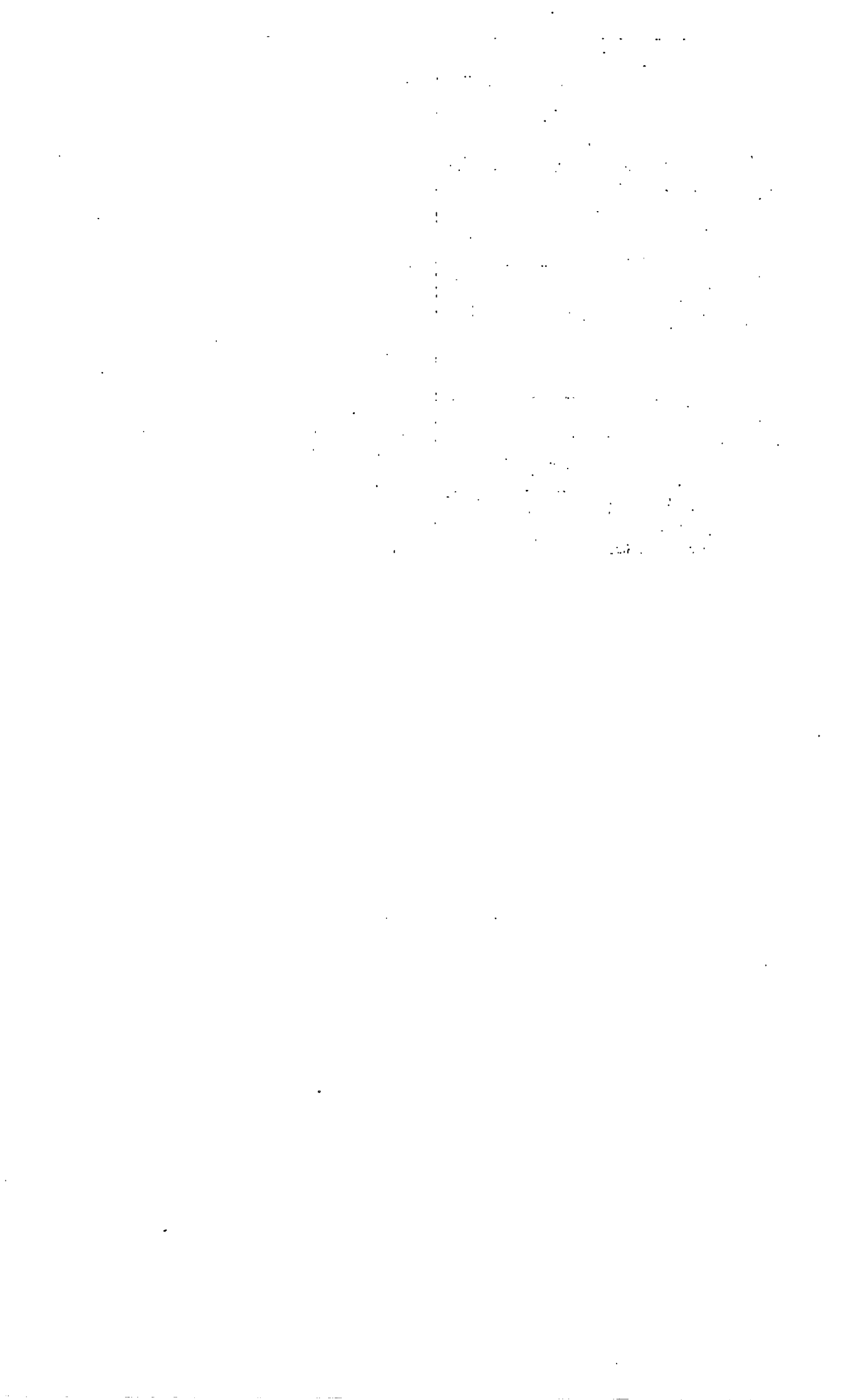
