REPORT OF THE STANDING COMMITTEE.

RUBBER BOOTS, SHOES AND SLIPPERS.

With reference to the notice which was published in the London, Edinburgh and Belfast Gazettes of the 22nd May, 1931, regarding a reference made by the Board of Trade to the Standing Committee under the Merchandise Marks Act, 1926, in respect of the following classes and descriptions of imported goods:—

(1) Boots, shoes and slippers made wholly or mainly of rubber;

(2) overshoes (including goloshes and snow-boots) with or without heels, made of rubber

or rubber in combination with textile materials;

(3) rubber soled footwear with uppers made wholly or mainly of textile materials (including paper) where the soles are not stitched to the uppers;

(4) footholds made wholly or mainly of rubber;

the Board of Trade hereby give notice, in accordance with the provisions of Section 2, Sub-section 7, that a Report has been made by the Committee in respect of the aforesaid classes and descriptions of goods.
