

a distance of 4 chains or thereabouts to the centre of the bridge which carries such railway across the Pensnett Canal, and extending thence northward along the middle of the Pensnett Canal for a distance of 3 chains or thereabouts to the boundary which divides the said New Parish of Saint Augustine, Holly Hall, Dudley, from the said New Parish of Saint Luke, Dudley.

"The Seventh Schedule.

"The territory to be dissevered from the said New Parish of Saint Luke, Dudley, and to be annexed to the said New Parish of Saint Augustine, Holly Hall, Dudley, being:—

"All that portion of the said New Parish of Saint Luke, Dudley, which is bounded upon the west, upon the south, and upon the south east by the said New Parish of Saint Augustine, Holly Hall, Dudley, and upon the remaining sides, that is to say, upon the east and upon the north east, by an imaginary line commencing upon the boundary which divides the said New Parish of Saint Augustine, Holly Hall, Dudley, from the said New Parish of Saint Luke, Dudley, at the centre of the bridge which carries the roadway leading from Thornleigh Collieries to Woodside across the Pensnett Canal, and extending thence northward along the middle of the Pensnett Canal for a distance of 1 chain or thereabouts to a point opposite to the middle of the roadway leading past the south western side of Blacking Mill, and extending thence north westward to and along the middle of such roadway for a distance of 9 chains or thereabouts to its junction with the roadway leading from Woodside to Scott's Green upon the boundary which divides the said New Parish of Saint Luke, Dudley, from the said New Parish of Saint Augustine, Holly Hall, Dudley."

And whereas drafts of the said Scheme or Representation have been transmitted to the Patrons and to the Incumbents of the Cures affected by the arrangements which are contemplated by such Scheme or Representation and such Patrons and Incumbents have, with the exception hereinafter mentioned, respectively signified their assent thereto:

And whereas the Incumbent of the Vicarage of the New Parish of Saint Edmund, Dudley, has not signified his assent to the said Scheme or Representation:

And whereas a period of more than one calendar month has elapsed since drafts of the said Scheme or Representation were transmitted to the said Patrons and Incumbents:

And whereas the said Scheme or Representation has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said Scheme or Representation, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts.

And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrars of the said Diocese of Lichfield and of the said Diocese of Worcester respectively.

UNIVERSITY OF OXFORD.

STATUTE APPROVED BY CONGREGATION ON
TUESDAY, 3RD NOVEMBER, 1931.

WHEREAS it is expedient to amend § 4 of Section I of Title IV of the Statutes of the University of Oxford in order that it may conform with alterations in the Statutes made by the University establishing a Chair of Geography:

NOW THE SAID UNIVERSITY in exercise of the powers in that behalf conferred upon it by the Universities of Oxford and Cambridge Act, 1923, and of all other powers enabling it, ENACTS, subject to the approval of His Majesty in Council, AS FOLLOWS:—

In Statt. Tit. IV. Sect. 1, in the Schedule annexed to § 4 (Statuta, ed. 1930, p. 66), immediately before the words "Whitley Professor of Biochemistry" the words "Professor of Geography" shall be inserted.
