**TREASURY MINUTE DATED THE
30TH NOVEMBER, 1931.**

My Lords read Section 8 of the Currency and Bank Notes Act, 1928.

The Chancellor of the Exchequer informs the Board that the Governor and Company of the Bank of England have represented to him that it is in their opinion expedient that the amount of the fiduciary note issue be maintained at 275 million pounds, to which it was increased under the authority of Treasury Minutes dated the 1st August, 1931, the 21st August, 1931, the 11th September, 1931, the 2nd October, 1931, and the 30th October, 1931. He proposes accordingly that the authority to the Bank to issue fiduciary bank notes to the total amount of 275 million pounds should be further extended until the 14th December, 1931.

My Lords approve and direct that the Bank of England be notified accordingly.

Let a copy of this Minute be laid before both Houses of Parliament under Section 8 subsection (3) of the Currency and Bank Notes Act, 1928.

3. To make provision with respect to the debts and liabilities of, and moneys due or accruing due to, the Elsecar Company and the recovery thereof, and all such other provisions as may be necessary or convenient for the purpose of enabling the said transfer and vesting to be carried into effect and to provide for the

winding-up and dissolution of the Elsecar Company.

4. To repeal the Elsecar Wentworth and Hoyland Gas Act, 1863, and the Elsecar Wentworth and Hoyland Gas (Charges) Order, 1929.

5. To extend the limits of supply of the Company to include:—

(i) the limits within which the Elsecar Company are now authorised to supply gas (hereinafter referred to as "the Elsecar limits") viz.:—

The whole of the urban district of Hoyland Nether.

The whole of the parish of Wentworth in the rural district of Rotherham.

The parish of Brampton Bierlow in the rural district of Rotherham except the portion thereof which lies to the north-east and north of the following boundary viz.:—A line commencing on the western boundary of the parish at Smithy Bridge and drawn thence in an easterly direction along the centre line of Smithy Bridge Lane to the central point of the four cross roads at the Counting Houses thence in a southerly direction along the centre line of Coaley Lane to its junction with Hooper Hall Lane and thence in an easterly direction along the centre line of Hooper Hall Lane to the eastern boundary of the parish in Packman Road, and
