The following Statute made by the University of Oxford, on the 24th day of November, 1931, has been submitted for the approval of His Majesty in Council, and notice of its having been so submitted is published in accordance with the provisions of "The Universities of Oxford and Cambridge Act, 1923."

UNIVERSITY OF OXFORD.

STATUTE APPROVED BY CONGREGATION ON TUESDAY, 24TH NOVEMBER, 1931.

WHEREAS it is expedient to provide that any allowance made by the Governing Body of Christ Church to the Regius Professor of Medicine under the provisions of the Will of Lady Osler or any benefit accruing thereunder shall not be treated as part of the emoluments

of his Chair the University, in exercise of the powers in that behalf conferred upon it by the Universities of Oxford and Cambridge Act, 1923, and all other powers enabling it, enacts, subject to the approval of His Majesty in Council, as follows.

- 1. In Statt. Tit. IV. Sect. 1. § 4, after cl. 2 (Statuta, ed. 1931, p. 65, at end of l. 15) insert the following new clause:—
 - "3. Any allowance made by the Governing Body of Christ Church to the Regius Professor of Medicine under the provisions of the Will of Lady Osler or any benefit accruing thereunder shall not be treated as part of the emoluments of his Chair for the purposes of this sub-section."

RATES OF INTEREST ON LOCAL LOANS.

TENDERS FOR TREASURY BILLS.

1. The Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury hereby give notice that Tenders will be received at the Chief Cashier's Office, at the Bank of England, on Friday, the 11th December, 1931, at 1 o'clock, for Treasury Bills to be issued under the Treasury Bills Act, 1877, the National Debt Act, 1889, and the War Loan Acts, 1914-1919, to the amount of £40,000,000.

2. The Bills will be in amounts of £5,000 or £10,000. They will be dated at the option of the Tenderer on any business day from Monday, the 14th December, 1931, to Saturday, the 19th December, 1931, inclusive, and will be payable at three months after date.
