1. The Secretary of State is to be responsible to His Majesty and Parliament for all the business of the Army Council. All business other than business which the Secretary of

State specially reserves to himself is to be transacted in the following principal subdivisions:—

(a) The Parliamentary Under-Secretary of State shall be responsible to the Secretary of State for the administration of business affecting the Territorial Army Associations and War Department Lands, and for so much of the other business of the Army Council as may be assigned to him, from time to time, by the Secretary of State.

(b) The First Military Member of the Army Council (the Chief of the Imperial General Staff), the Second Military Member of the Army Council (the Adjutant-General to the Forces), the Third Military Member of the Army Council (the Quarter-Master-General to the Forces), and the Fourth Military Member of the Army Council (the Master-General of the Ordnance) shall be responsible to the Secretary of State for the administration of so much of the business relating to the organization, disposition, personnel, armament, and maintenance of the Army, as may be assigned to them, or each of them, from time to time, by the Secretary of State.

(c) The Finance Member of the Army Council (Financial Secretary of the War Office) shall be responsible to the Secretary of State for the finance of the Army and

for so much of the other business of the Army Council as may be assigned to him, from time to time, by the Secretary of State.

(d) The Permanent Under Secretary of State shall be a Member, and Secretary, of the Army Council and responsible to the Secretary of State for the preparation of all official communications of the Council and for the interior economy of the War Office: he shall also be responsible, on his appointment as Accounting Officer of Army Votes, Funds and Accounts, for the control of expenditure and for advising the Secretary of State and the Administrative Officers at the War Office and in Commands on all questions of Army expenditure.

He shall further be charged with such other duties as may be assigned to him, from time to time, by the Secretary of State.

2. This Order in Council shall be substituted for the Order in Council dated 1st day of October, 1931.

1. The Powers set out in the first column of the Schedule to this Order are parties to the said Convention.

3. This Order may be cited as the Arbitration (Foreign Awards) No. 4 Order, 1931, and shall come into force on the 18th day of December, 1931.

the consent of the said Edward Frederick Holwell Dunnicliff and Eugene Kirkpatrick Hyslop (testified by their respectively signing this Scheme), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, do humbly recommend and propose to Your Majesty as follows, that is to say:—

“1. That the said Benefice of Ollerton and a part of the said Benefice of Boughton, namely, all that part of the Parish of such Benefice which forms part of the new Colliery Village of Ollerton, including certain cottages lying on the east side of Whinny Lane and Wellow Road and certain other cottages lying on both sides of Retford Road (all which part is set out and delineated upon the Map or Plan annexed hereto and thereon coloured pink) shall be permanently united together and form one Benefice with cure of souls and one Parish for all ecclesiastical purposes under the style of ‘The Benefice of Ollerton’ (hereinafter referred to as the United Benefice).

Provided always that if at any time the Incumbent for the time being of the said Benefice of Boughton shall by any deed duly executed by him under his hand and seal in accordance with the provisions of any statute in that behalf enabling him, grant, convey and annex to the said United Benefice any part or parts of the endowments belonging to the said Benefice of Boughton which shall in the opinion of the Bishop of Southwell for the time being be a just and fair equivalent or not less than an equivalent for the said yearly rentcharge hereby proposed to be created as aforesaid then such yearly rentcharge shall thereupon and thenceforth cease and be no longer payable.

"4. That after the said union has taken effect the Patronage of the United Benefice shall belong wholly to the Patron of the said Benefice of Ollerton.

"Provided always that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them, in accordance with the provisions of the said Measure, or of any other Measure of the National Assembly of the Church of England, or of any Act of Parliament."

And whereas public notice of the certification to His Majesty in Council of the said Scheme and the consent thereto in writing of the Bishop of Southwell has been duly given in the manner and within the time prescribed in the Statutory Rules aforesaid:

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to affirm the said Scheme and to order and direct that the said Scheme and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the date when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Measure.

And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of Southwell.

That the said Benefice of Euston with Barnham and Fakenham Parva and the said Benefice of Fakenham Magna shall be permanently united together and form one Benefice with cure of souls under the style of 'The United Benefice of Euston with Barnham, Fakenham Parva and Fakenham Magna,' but the Parishes of the said Benefices shall continue distinct in all respects.

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to affirm the said Scheme and to order that the Benefices therein recommended to be united shall be united to the extent and for the purposes recommended in the said Scheme, and further to order and direct that the said Scheme and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the date when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Measure.

And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of Saint Edmundsbury and Ipswich.

"Whereas at certain extremities of the said Parish of Egg Buckland, of the New Parish (sometime Consolidated Chapelry) of Saint Augustine, Plymouth, and of an Extra Parochial Place situate on the western bank of the River Plym, in the said County and Diocese, which said extremities lie contiguous one to another, and are described in the Schedule hereunder written, there is collected together a population which is situate at a distance from the several churches of such Parish and New Parish:

"And whereas it appears to us to be expedient that certain contiguous portions (being the portions containing the population aforesaid) of the said Parish of Egg Buckland, of the said New Parish of Saint Augustine, Plymouth, and of the said Extra Parochial Place,

should be formed into a Consolidated Chapelry for all Ecclesiastical purposes, and that the same should be assigned to the said Church of Saint Mary the Virgin, Laira, situate as aforesaid:

"Now, therefore, with the consent of the Right Reverend Lord William Gascoyne Cecil, Bishop of Exeter, as such Bishop and also as having by virtue of his jurisdiction as Ordinary all the rights (if any) of a Patron in the said Extra Parochial Place, with the consent of the Right Honourable John, Baron Sankey, Lord High Chancellor of Great Britain, acting on behalf of Your Majesty as the Patron of the Vicarage of the said Parish of Egg Buckland and with the consents of the Reverend Robert Carnegie Knox, of Emmanuel Vicarage, Plymouth, in the said County and Diocese, Clerk in Holy Orders, of the Reverend Arthur Murray Thom, of Saint Matthias' Vicarage, Plymouth aforesaid, Clerk in Holy Orders and of the Venerable Francis Whitfield Daukes, of Saint Andrew's Vicarage, Plymouth, aforesaid, Clerk in Holy Orders and Archdeacon of Plymouth, as the Patrons of the Vicarage of the said New Parish of Saint Augustine, Plymouth (in testimony whereof they the said consenting parties have respectively signed and sealed this Representation), we the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, humbly represent, that it would, in our opinion, be expedient that all those contiguous portions of the said Parish of Egg Buckland, of the said New Parish of Saint Augustine, Plymouth, and of the said Extra Parochial Place which are described in the Schedule hereunder written, all which portions, together with the boundaries thereof, are delineated and set forth on the map or plan hereunto annexed, should be united and formed into one Consolidated Chapelry for the said Church of Saint Mary the Virgin, Laira, situate as aforesaid, and that the same should be named 'The Consolidated Chapelry of Saint Mary the Virgin, Laira.'

"THE SCHEDULE to which the foregoing Representation has reference.

"The Consolidated Chapelry of Saint Mary the Virgin, Laira, comprising:—

"I. All that portion of the Parish of Egg Buckland, in the County of Devon and in the Diocese of Exeter, which is bounded upon all sides as follows, that is to say, upon part of the north, upon the east, and upon the south east by the Parish of Plympton Saint Mary, upon the south partly by an Extra Parochial Place situate on the western bank of the River Plym and partly by the New Parish (sometime Consolidated Chapelry) of Saint Augustine, Plymouth, upon the west partly by the said New Parish of Saint Augustine, Plymouth, and partly by the New Parish of Emmanuel, Compton Gifford, all in the said County and Diocese, upon another part of the north by the last mentioned New Parish, and upon the remaining part of the north by an imaginary line commencing at the point where the boundary which divides the said New Parish of Emmanuel, Compton Gifford, from the said Parish of Egg Buckland, diverges northward along the wall or fence forming the western boundary of the Plymouth Corporation Cemetery, and extending thence first southward to and then eastward along the middle of the

the east, upon the north, and upon the west by the above described portion of the Parish of Egg Buckland, and upon the remaining side, that is to say, upon the south, by an imaginary line commencing at the point near Laira Farm where the boundary which divides the said Parish of Egg Buckland from the said New Parish of Saint Augustine, Plymouth, crosses the middle of the main line of the Great Western Railway, and extending thence north eastward along the middle of the said line of railway (thereby crossing the boundary which divides the said New Parish of Saint Augustine, Plymouth, from the said Extra Parochial Place) for a distance of 23½ chains or thereabouts to the boundary which divides the said Extra Parochial Place from the said Parish of Egg Buckland."

And whereas the said Representation has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said Representation, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts.

And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of Exeter.

"Whereas Commissioners appointed at our request by the Right Reverend George, Bishop of Chichester, pursuant to the provisions of the said Union of Benefices Measure, 1923, to inquire into and report upon (1) the union of the said two Benefices of Cocking and Bepton and (2) the union of the said two Benefices of Midhurst and West Lavington, duly made their respective Reports to the said Bishop of Chichester and therein recommended the union of the said two Benefices of Cocking and Bepton and the terms for effecting the

union and also recommended certain alterations of the boundaries of the Parishes of the said Benefices of Cocking, Bepton, Linch, Linchmere, Midhurst, West Lavington and Easebourne and the said Bishop of Chichester signified in writing his approval of the said Reports:

"And whereas we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, have prepared this Scheme for the said union and alterations of boundaries based upon the terms recommended in the said Reports:

"And whereas all of the said Benefices of Cocking, Bepton, Linch, Linchmere, Midhurst, West Lavington and Easebourne are now full, the Reverend Arthur Kennedy Cobb being the present Incumbent of the said Benefice of Cocking, the Reverend Frederick Reginald Evans being the present Incumbent of the said Benefice of Bepton, the Reverend Henry Gibbon being the present Incumbent of the said Benefice of Linch, the Reverend Walter Astley Purton being the present Incumbent of the said Benefice of Linchmere, the Reverend Frank Tatchell being the present Incumbent of the said Benefice of Midhurst, the Reverend Edward Harold Johnston being the present Incumbent of the said Benefice of West Lavington and the Reverend Charles Edward Hoyle being the present Incumbent of the said Benefice of Easebourne:

Whereas it is provided by sub-section (5) of Section 10 of the Finance Act, 1926 (16 & 17 Geo. 5. c. 22), that the Treasury may by order exempt from the duty imposed by Section one of the Safeguarding of Industries Act, 1921 (11 & 12 Geo. 5. c. 47), as amended by the Finance Act, 1926, for such period as may be specified in the Order, any article in respect of which the Board of Trade are satisfied on a representation made by a consumer of that article that the article is not made in any part of His Majesty's Dominions in quantities which are substantial having regard to the consumption of that article for the time being in the United Kingdom, and that there is no reasonable probability that the article will within a reasonable period be made in His Majesty's Dominions in such substantial quantities:

And whereas the Board of Trade are satisfied on representations made by consumers of the article specified in this Order that this article is not made in any part of His Majesty's Dominions in quantities which are substantial having regard to the consumption of this article for the time being in the United Kingdom and that there is no reasonable probability that this article will within a reasonable period be made in His Majesty's Dominions in such substantial quantities.

Now therefore we, the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury in pursuance of the powers conferred on Us by the said Section 10

His Majesty The KING has been graciously pleased to award the Edward Medal to William James Rudd, in recognition of his gallantry in the following circumstances:—

On the 14th October, 1931, William James Rudd, a charge hand in the ferrous metal department at the works of the Whitecross Company, Limited, at Warrington, instructed Albert Meakin, a labourer, to slack the fire of the furnace. Meakin, with another labourer named Nock, descended an eight-rung iron ladder to the furnace pit, which is six feet six inches below the floor level, and entirely covered by grating except at the point of descent. Meakin withdrew the firebars from the furnace before inserting dummy bars; this allowed the red hot coke of the fire to fall into the water sump under the furnace, filling the fire pit with steam. Rudd heard screams from the furnace pit and running to the spot saw Nock on the ladder and clouds of steam issuing from the grating over the pit. He immediately went to the rescue, assisted Nock out and laid him on the grating. Then wrapping his coat over his head, he descended the whole length of the ladder into the pit. His leg was grabbed by Meakin, who was apparently groping for the ladder, and Rudd managed to get hold of Meakin's arm, only to find the skin come away in his hand. He succeeded, however, in getting Meakin up the ladder out of the pit and at once started first aid. Both Meakin and Nock were severely scalded and died as the result of their injuries.

Rudd's action in going to the rescue of Nock and then going down the ladder to rescue Meakin was a very gallant one. Although the danger was greatest immediately after the hot ashes fell into the water sump and thereafter the risk to life in descending into the pit was not so great, Rudd, who had no knowledge of what had happened in the pit, had no means of estimating the danger he was incurring. He saw that Nock was badly burned and he thought that a steam pipe working an injector had burst or that molten metal had leaked into the fire hole. Either of these occurrences would have involved serious risks as the scalding steam would have been incessant, and Rudd faced what he thought were these risks and effected the rescue of both men single-handed without regard to his own safety.

ORDER DEFINING THE BENEFITS OR ADVANTAGES WHICH MAY BE RECKONED AS PAYMENT OF WAGES IN LIEU OF CASH.

The Cornwall and Isles of Scilly Agricultural Wages Committee in pursuance of the powers vested in them by the Agricultural Wages (Regulation) Act, 1924, and the Regulations made thereunder do by this Order vary as from 20th December, 1931, their Order of 6th December, 1926, defining the benefits or advantages (not being benefits or advantages prohibited by law) which may be reckoned as payment of wages in lieu of payment in cash for the purpose of the application of any minimum rate of wages fixed by the said Committee for the area comprising the administrative counties of Cornwall and Isles of Scilly so as to provide that such benefits or advantages and the values at which they are to be reckoned shall be as follows:—

1. Benefits or Advantages.

(a) Milk.

(b) *Potato ground*, provided that the employer supplies 2 cwt. of potato manure per 20 yards and cultivates the land, and provided also that the worker supplies 2 cwt. of seed potatoes per 20 yards (i.e. one-eighth of a statute acre).

(c) *Lodging*, except in any case in which the Agricultural Wages Committee shall have determined that the lodging accommodation provided is so defective as to be injurious to health.

(d) *Board*, including any meals but not including intoxicating drink.

(e) *Cottage*, including any garden hitherto given or let with the cottage, except where the cottage is one in regard to which the Medical Officer of Health has reported that it is in a state so dangerous or injurious to health as to be unfit for human habitation.

2. Values.

(a) *Milk*.—New Milk 3d. per quart.
Skimmed or scalded milk,
1½d. per quart.

(b) *Potato ground*.—1s. per week per 20 yards, provided that, in the event of the contract of service between employer and worker being terminated before the crop is lifted, the employer shall refund to the worker (i) an amount equal to that by which his cash wages have been reduced on account of this benefit or advantage since the previous Michaelmas, and (ii) an amount equal to the price of the seed potatoes (if any) which have been sown.

(d) Cottage including any garden provided with the cottage except where the cottage is one in regard to which the Medical Officer of Health has reported that it is in a state so dangerous or injurious to health as to be unfit for human habitation.

(vi) (1) In the case of a worker who is given a clear day's holiday on Easter Monday, all employment in excess of 41 hours (excluding all hours which are to be treated as overtime employment) in the week in which that holiday falls.

(2) In any other case, all employment in excess of 41 hours (excluding all hours which are to be treated as overtime employment) in the week in which Good Friday falls.

(vii) All employment in excess of 50 hours per week (excluding all hours which are to be treated as overtime employment) except as provided in sub-clauses (v) and (vi) above.
