The Civil Service Commissioners further give notice that an Open Competitive Examination will be held under the foregoing Regulations, commencing on the 20th May, 1932. The following is a provisional list of the centres at which the examination may be held:—Belfast, Cardiff, Edinburgh, London and Manchester.

The final list of centres will be decided when the number of candidates desiring examination at each centre is known.

The number of vacancies to be filled on the result of this examination cannot be stated in advance; it is not likely to be large, and may be about 20. It is not anticipated that it will be necessary to fill any vacancies for Assistant Examiners in the Estate Duty Office on the result of this examination.
