TENDERS FOR TREASURY BILLS.

1. The Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury hereby give notice that Tenders will be received at the Chief Cashier's Office, at the Bank of England, on Friday, the 5th February, 1932, at 1 o'clock, for Treasury Bills to be issued under the Treasury Bills Act, 1877, the National Debt Act, 1889, and the War Loan Acts, 1914-1919, to the amount of £30,000,000.

2. The Bills will be in amounts of £5,000 or £10,000. They will be dated at the option of the Tenderer on any business day from Monday, the 8th February, 1932, to Saturday, the 13th February, 1932, inclusive, and will be payable at three months after date.

3. The Bills will be issued and paid at the Bank of England.

4. Each Tender must be for an amount not less than £50,000, and must specify the date on which the Bills required are to be dated, and the net amount per cent. (being an even multiple of one penny) which will be given for the amount applied for. Separate Tenders must be lodged for Bills of different dates.

5. Tenders must be made through a London Banker, Discount House or Broker.

6. The persons whose Tenders are accepted will be informed of the same not later than the following day, and payment in full of the amounts of the accepted Tenders must be made to the Bank of England by means of Cash or a Banker's Draft on the Bank of England not later than 2 o'clock (Saturday 12 o'clock) on the day on which the relative Bills are to be dated.

7. In virtue of the provisions of Section 1 (4) of the War Loan Act, 1919, Members of the House of Commons are not precluded from tendering for these Bills.

8. Tenders must be made on the printed forms which may be obtained from the Chief Cashier's Office, Bank of England.

9. The Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury reserve the right of rejecting any Tenders.

TREASURY MINUTE DATED THE 28TH
JANUARY, 1932.

My Lords read Section 8 of the Currency and Bank Notes Act 1928.

The Chancellor of the Exchequer informs the Board that the Governor and Company of the Bank of England have represented to him that it is in their opinion expedient that the amount of the fiduciary note issue be maintained at 275 million pounds, to which it was increased under the authority of Treasury Minute dated the 1st August, 1931, and subsequent Minutes concluding with the Minute of the 14th December, 1931. He proposes accordingly that the authority to the Bank to issue fiduciary bank notes to the total amount of 275 million pounds should be further extended until the 30th April, 1932.

My Lords approve and direct that the Bank of England be notified accordingly.

Let a copy of this Minute be laid before both Houses of Parliament under Section 8 sub-section (3) of the Currency and Bank Notes Act 1928.

No. 13. REGULATIONS REGARDING "HELM ORDERS."

DENMARK.

Former Notice.—No. 13 of 1931.

On and after 1st January, 1930, helm orders in the direct sense, i.e., with reference to the position of the rudder, were brought into force on board all vessels sailing under the Danish flag.

The order to "*starboard*" means that the rudder is to be put to starboard, the wheel to starboard, the tiller to port.

The order to "*port*" means that the rudder is to be put to port, the wheel to port, the tiller to starboard.

Note.—This Notice is a repetition of the former Notice quoted above.

BELGIUM.

Former Notice.—No. 1022 of 1931.

From midnight, 30th June, 1931, on board all ships flying the Belgian flag, orders will be given to the helmsman as direct orders; that is to say, that when the ship is going ahead the order DROITE (right) is given to indicate the intention to alter course to the right or starboard, and the order GAUCHE (left) to indicate the intention to alter course to the left or port.

In order to avoid all risk of confusion, navigators are recommended at first to supplement the verbal order by a wave of the arm towards the side to which the ship's course is to be altered. From 1st January, 1932, the orders DROITE and GAUCHE will be replaced, respectively, by the orders "Starboard" and "Port", which will also be understood in the direct sense.

The Belgian pilots at the mouth and lower reaches of the Scheldt, and at the ports of Ostende, Zeebrugge and Nieuport, when carrying out their duties on board ships flying foreign flags will, however, continue to conform with the wishes expressed by their Captains; that is, to use direct or indirect orders as may be required.
