"Whereas by the Will dated the 28th day of July, 1930, of the late John Maurice Wingfield, of Tickencote Hall, in the said County of Rutland, D.S.O., a Lieutenant-Colonel (retired) in Your Majesty's Foot Guards, two one-third parts or shares of and in the Advowson or perpetual right of Patronage of and presentation to the said United Benefice of Market Overton with Thistleton (that is to say every turn or right of nomination or presentation to the said United Benefice which shall occur or arise on a vacancy of the said United Benefice happening after the date hereof for ever with the exception of the first such turn or right of nomination or presentation and of every third succeeding turn in right of nomination or presentation thereafter) were devised to the Bishop of Peterborough for the time being:

"And whereas the said John Maurice Wingfield died on the 27th day of April, 1931:

"And whereas the Midland Bank Executor and Trustee Company Limited, and George Ernest Shrimpton, of Number 10, Little College Street, in the City of Westminster, Solicitor, are the Executors of the said Will in whom but for the hereinbefore recited devise the said two one-third parts or shares of and in the said Advowson would now be vested, and they are desirous with a view to the confirmation of the said devise that the said two one-third parts or shares of and in the said Advowson or perpetual right of Patronage of and presentation to the said United Benefice of Market Overton with Thistleton should be transferred to and be vested in the Bishop of Peterborough for the time being in the manner hereinafter recommended and proposed:

"And whereas the Right Reverend Claude Martin, now Bishop of Peterborough, is willing to accept such transfer, and in token of such his willingness and also in token that the same transfer has that consent of the Bishop of the Diocese which by the hereinbefore mentioned Acts or by some or one of them is made necessary he, the said Claude Martin, Bishop of Peterborough, has executed this Scheme as hereinafter mentioned:

"And whereas the transfer of the Patronage of the said United Benefice of Market Overton with Thistleton, which is hereinbefore mentioned and hereinafter recommended and proposed will in our opinion tend to make better provision for the cure of souls in the Parishes or Districts in or in respect of which the right of Patronage or Advowson so recommended and proposed to be transferred as aforesaid arises or exists, that is to say, in the Parishes of Market Overton and Thistleton:

"Now, therefore, with the consent of the said Midland Bank Executor and Trustee Company Limited (in testimony whereof they have caused their Common or Corporate Seal to be affixed to this Scheme), with the consent of the said George Ernest Shrimpton (in testimony whereof he has signed and sealed this Scheme) and with the consent of the said Claude Martin, Bishop of Peterborough (in testimony whereof he has signed this Scheme and sealed the same with his Episcopal Seal), and by way of confirmation of the hereinbefore recited devise by the Will of the said John Maurice Wingfield, we, the said Ecclesiastical

Commissioners for England, humbly recommend and propose that upon and from the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme and without any conveyance or assurance in the law other than such duly gazetted Order the said two onethird parts or shares of and in the Advowson or perpetual right of Patronage of and pre-sentation to the said United Benefice of Market Overton with Thistleton (that is to say every turn or right of nomination or presentation to the said United Benefice which shall occur or arise on a vacancy of the said United Benefice happening after the date hereof for ever with the exception of the first such turn or right of nomination or presentation and every third succeeding turn or right of nomination or presentation thereafter) shall be transferred to the said Claude Martin, Bishop of Peterborough, and his successors in the same Bishopric, and shall thereupon and thenceforth become and be absolutely vested in and shall and may from time to time be exercised by the said Claude Martin, Bishop of Peterborough, and by his successors in the same Bishopric for ever.

"And we further recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any further or other measures relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them, in accordance with the provisions of the said Acts, or of any of them, or of any other Act of Parliament."

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said Scheme, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts.

And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of Peterborough.
