Minehead, Feb. 5.

Ere are lately come into this Port the Samaritan, [ Fortune, and several other small ships from Ireland, informing us, that the Thomas and the Fohn, two Barks which went out from hence the 2d of January 1sft with several Passengers bound for that Kingdom, flenderly victualled, were by force of il-weather carried off to sea into the Bay of Bifcay; where their provisions failing, and being refused a charitable supp y by a French ship which passed by them; they were reduced to great wants, and had undoubtedly perished, had not a Dutch Merchant ship accidentally coming by, supplied them with an Hogstead of Wine, another of Water, and some Bread, in the strength whereof they after 15 or 16 dayes beating it out at Sea, happily at last arrived at their Port at Youghall.

Eriftol, Feb. 6. This Week in the late stormy weather a small Scottish ship coming up the Channel, and in much danger to be cast away, the Master and Company betook themselves to their Boat, which tis believed is fince cast away, and all the persons in it lost. The Vessel struck afterwards on ground, whole Goods are fince preferved, with one Boy, who was left on board her.

Vienna, fan. 27 The Prince of Lorrain having ftrongly recommended to His Imperial Majesties guidance and alfistance, his Pretensions to the Crown of Poland; is again returned to the Borders of that Kingdom; intending to continue in the Neighbouring Parts of Silefia, that he may not by his too great distance be wanting to the encourage-ment of his Party. Prince Leopold of Baden has accept-ed of the Government of Warralin in Sclavonia, but its believed will be easily induced to give up his Command of the Regiment and Company of Archers of the Emperours Guard, which may be conferred upon Prince de Sta Gregory, Son in Law to the Marquis de Castel Rodrigo, late Governour of the Spanish Netherlands.

The 25th instant returned hither the Sieur Hoffman, Secretary to the Council of War, and has given His Imperial Majefly an account of the state of all Affairs of Concernment in the Kingdom of Hungary, and particularly of the effect of his Negotiation with the Bassa at Buda, Turks still continue to pre s the Hungarians to a submission and homage. Prince Abassi has summoned together the IStates of Transitvania, but the greatest matter which is its to be offered to their consideration, is a Method of Rui Jing money for him for the payment of the arrears of Tribute due from him to the Turkish Emperour.

Upon confideration of the Troubles which feem to threaten the Upper Hungary, the Regiments of Foot belonging to the Prince de St. Gregory and the Baron de Testi are ordered to march thither, with one Regiment of Horse and another of Dragoons. The Comm naivy of that Countrey, which were formerly suspected to have had some inclinations to close with the Turks, have given His Imperial Majesty full affurance of their firm resolution to continue constant in their Obedience to Him, and to reject any Proposition? how fair and promising for ver, which shall be thrown out to tempt them from their outy,

Rome, Fan. 29. On Sunday the 13th instant the Count de St. Segundo Ambassadour Extraordina y from the Duke of Parma, came with a great Train to his Publick Audience, and in a Latine Speech delivered his Embassy of Obedience, and was afterwards with many Persons of Honour of his Train, admitted to kiss His Holinesses

The next day was held a Private Confistory, wherein were proposed several Vacant Bishopricks by their respective Cardinal Protectors; which ended, the Pope the same day disposed of the several Offices of the Consistory for the year

Here is lately departed this life Segnior Leone Alatio, the Keeper of the Vatican Library, but as yet his Employment

is not disposed of.

The Pope is still intent upon the relief of Candia, and has already given Order to his Nephew Don Vincenzo Bayly Rospiglioff to order the speedy fitting up his Gallica for that fervice.

Danzig, Jan. 29. The Primate having as he intended, given Audience to the Envoye from Tartary, received from him à Letter from the Sultan Galga, giving him an account that he intended to enter upon the possession of all Ukraniz by right of Conquest, upon the late happy success of his Arms; and in order treteunte, was resolved to send this ther one hundred thousand men to take up their Winter Quarters; he farther sollicited the Crown of Polands approbation of the Coffacks late election of one Suchomitz for their General in the room of their old Commander Dorosensko, and at last, pur them in mind of the promise formerly made to send him some Present, but as yet, nothing is refolv'd on to be returned by way of answer.

The Heer Gasiewhy sent some time since from Paland as Ambasiador to the Court of Muscowy, has by his Letters unify'd his fase arrival, but that the Czar would not admit him to his Audience, till he had first sent him the Leters which were directed by him i, that he was afterwards admitted to his Audience in prefence of the See nators, who were placed on each hand of the Great Duke. and was fince treated with much kindness and respect.
