14. To provide that subject to the provisions of the intended Order the Company shall have and may exercise within the added area all powers, rights and privileges which they have within their existing limits of supply.

15. To authorise the Company to hold and use for the purposes of their undertaking the lands hereinafter mentioned and on the said lands to erect, maintain, alter, improve and renew gasholders with all necessary machinery and apparatus and do all such acts as may be proper for storing gas and for supplying gas within their limits of supply.

The lands above referred to are:—

In the County of Berks.

A triangular piece of land containing 3 acres 3 roods and 29 perches or thereabouts situate in the parish of East Hagborne, in the County of Berks and being the enclosure numbered 31 in the said parish on the $\frac{1}{2500}$ Ordnance Map (Edition of 1912) Berkshire Sheet XV.8.

In the County of Oxford.

(1) A triangular piece of land containing 12 acres and 4 perches or thereabouts situate in the parish of Cutteslowe in the County of Oxford but formerly in the parish of Wolvercote and being the enclosures numbered 4 and 4a respectively in the said parish of Wolvercote on the $\frac{1}{2500}$ Ordnance Map (Edition of 1913) Oxfordshire Sheet XXXIII. 2.

(2) A triangular piece of land containing 3 acres and 30 perches or thereabouts situate in the parish of Littlemore in the County of Oxford and being the enclosure numbered 9 in the said parish on the $\frac{1}{2500}$ Ordnance Map (Edition of 1921) Oxfordshire Sheet XL. 5.

16. To make provisions as to the price or prices which may be charged by the Company for gas supplied within the added area or some part or parts thereof and to provide that such prices shall not be taken into account in determining the dividends payable by the Company.

17. To make special provisions as to the supply of gas to premises abutting on streets forming the boundary of the limits of supply of the Company and as to the breaking up of streets for the purpose of affording such supply.

18. To make new provisions with respect to the holding and use of patent rights by the Company and with respect to the grant of patents to the Company jointly with other persons and the rights and remedies of the joint grantees.

19. To make new or further provisions for the prevention of the improper use of gas, the giving of a supply of gas where the consumer has a separate supply and the inspection and testing of meters.

20. To authorise the Company and any local authority, company or person to enter into and carry into effect agreements and arrangements as to the supply to or by the Company of gas in bulk.

21. The Order will vary or extinguish all rights and privileges which would impede or interfere with its purposes and confer other rights and privileges.

22. To repeal alter or amend all or any of the provisions of the Oxford Gas Acts and Orders 1869 to 1930 and any other Act or Order relating to the Company or their undertaking.

23. To incorporate with the Order, with or without modification, or to render inapplicable all or some of the provisions of the Gasworks Clauses Act, 1847, the Gasworks Clauses Act, 1871, and the Companies Clauses Acts, 1845, 1863 and 1869.

Any local or other public authority, company or person desiring to bring before the Board of Trade any objection to the draft Order may do so by registered letter addressed to the Director of Gas Administration, Board of Trade, Great George Street, London, S.W. 1, and despatched on or before the 22nd day of March, 1932.

Any such objection shall state:—

(a) The specific grounds of objection; and

(b) The omissions, additions or modifications asked for.

A copy of the objection must at the same time be forwarded to the undermentioned Solicitors or Parliamentary Agents.

A copy of the draft Special Order, an Ordnance Map showing the situation of the existing and proposed works of the Company and the boundaries of the existing area of supply and of the added area and an Ordnance Map showing the land to be used for the storage of gas have been deposited for public inspection with the Clerk of the Peace for the County of Oxford at his office at the County Hall, New Road, Oxford, and with the Clerk of the Peace for the County of Berks at his office at the Shire Hall, Reading, and at the offices of the Company at York House, St. Aldate's, Oxford.
