THE IMPORT DUTIES (IMPERIAL PREFERENCE) No. 1 REGULATIONS, 1932, DATED MARCH 1, 1932, MADE BY THE BOARD OF TRADE UNDER THE IMPORT DUTIES ACT, 1932 (22 GEO. 5. C. 8).

The Board of Trade, in pursuance of the powers conferred upon them by paragraph 1 of the 3rd Schedule to the Import Duties Act, 1932, and of all other powers enabling them in that behalf, hereby make the following regulations:—

(1) These regulations may be cited as the Import Duties (Imperial Preference) No. 1 Regulations, 1932;

(2) Goods shall not be deemed to have been manufactured in a part of the British Empire unless at least 25 per cent. of their value is derived from materials grown or produced or from work done within a part of the British Empire;

(3) Where a number of separate articles are included in one parcel or shipment, each and every article shall be treated separately for the purpose of calculating the proportion of value derived from materials grown or produced or from work done within a part of the British Empire;

(4) For the purpose of these regulations the value of manufactured goods shall be their cost to the manufacturer at the factory or works including the value of containers and other forms of interior packing ordinarily sold with the article when it is sold retail but not including the manufacturer's or exporter's profit or the cost of exterior packing, carriage to port and other charges incidental to the export of the goods subsequent to their manufacture.

(i) To amend Section 59 of the said local Act so as to extend the powers of the Corporation relating to the payment of water rates by owners of small houses and to authorise the Corporation to make allowances by way of discount for the prompt payment of water rates;

(ii) To empower the Corporation to charge additional sums not exceeding twenty-five shillings per annum in respect of the use of water for horses or for washing carriages or motor cars or for other purposes in premises where horses, carriages or motor cars are kept for private use if a hosepipe or other similar apparatus is employed and where more motor cars, carriages or other vehicles than one are ordinarily kept a further sum not exceeding ten shillings per annum for each motor car, carriage or other vehicle beyond the first;

(iii) To enable the Corporation in certain cases where water is used by means of a hosepipe or other similar apparatus for horses, or washing carriages, motor cars or other vehicles or for other purposes in stables, garages or premises where horses, carriages or motor cars or other vehicles are kept to require that all water so used shall be taken by meter and paid for accordingly;

(iv) To provide that where a supply of water for domestic purposes is used for or in connection with a refrigerating apparatus the Corporation shall be entitled to require that all water so used shall—

(a) be taken by meter and paid for accordingly and in that event the Corporation may make a minimum quarterly charge for such water not exceeding five shillings; or

(b) be paid for at such rates as may be agreed between the consumer and the Corporation;

(v) To prescribe a maximum price for a supply of water by meter;

(vi) To enable the Corporation to fix meters in streets to measure water or detect waste;

(vii) To empower the Corporation to repair communication pipes in certain cases;

(viii) To give the Corporation the exclusive right of executing any works on any of their water mains for the purpose of connecting any communication or service pipe with the main;

(ix) To make provision in regard to contributions towards the expenses incurred by the Corporation in the maintenance and repair of common pipes;

(x) To prescribe penalties for the closing of valves and apparatus and for the opening of valves and apparatus by unauthorised persons;

(xi) To make provision in regard to the connection and disconnection of meters;

(xii) To extend the hours during which premises supplied with water may be entered for the purpose of ascertaining

whether there is any waste or misuse of water.

(5) To enable the Corporation to purchase or take on lease or to erect dwellings for persons employed for the purposes of the water undertaking;

(6) To empower the Corporation to enter into agreements with any Local Authorities, Companies, Bodies or persons for the purchase by agreement, of water in bulk;

(7) For the several purposes of the Application or for purposes connected with, incidental to, or consequent on those purposes to make any such alteration or amendment of the said Local Act, or of any other Local Act or of any Act confirming a Provisional Order made in pursuance of any of the Sanitary Acts or of the Public Health Act, 1875, and in force in the said borough as may be necessary or desirable:
