WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Union of Benefices Measure, 1923, duly prepared, and laid before His Majesty in Council, a Scheme bearing date the 10th day of 65-33809 December, 1931, in the words and figures following, that is to say:--

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, acting in pursuance of the Union of Benefices Measure, 1923, have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council, the following Scheme for effecting the unions (1) of the Benefice (being a Vicarage) of Neatishead with the Benefice of Irstead (now part of the United Benefice of Irstead with Barton Turf) and (2) of the Benefice (being a Rectory) of Smallburgh with the Benefice of Barton Turf (now part of the said United Benefices are situate in the County of Norfolk and in the Diocese of Norwich:

"Whereas Commissioners appointed at our request by the Right Reverend Bertram, Bishop of Norwich, pursuant to the provisions of the said Union of Benefices Measure, 1923, to inquire into and report upon the unions (1) of the said Benefices of Neatishead and Irstead and (2) of the said Benefices of Smallburgh and Barton Turf duly made their Report to the said Bishop of Norwich and therein recommended the said unions and the terms for effecting the same, and the said Bishop of Norwich signified in writing his approval of the said Report:
