

the amount of such advance with interest out of the net proceeds of such sales as aforesaid.

(c) That when a Church for such District has been built it shall be dedicated to Saint Andrew and the patronage thereof shall be vested in the Patron of the said Benefice of Marylebone, Saint Andrew.

(d) That the font, communion table, sacramental plate, bells, organ and other furniture and fittings of the said Church of Saint Andrew, Marylebone, or such of them as the Bishop of London shall select, shall be transferred to the Parish Church of the United Benefice, and any articles not so transferred shall be appropriated by the Bishop of London for use in the proposed Church of the said District or be transferred to any other Church or Chapel or Churches or Chapels within the Diocese of London which the Bishop may select: provided always that any articles that shall not be so transferred or appropriated except the font, communion table and sacramental plate, may be sold and the proceeds shall be added to the fund arising from the sale of the site and materials of the said Church of Saint Andrew, Marylebone, as aforesaid.

" 9. That upon the union taking effect a part of the endowment of the Benefices hereinbefore recommended and proposed to be united, that is to say, an annual sum of £160 at present payable by us the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners to the Incumbent for the time being of the said Benefice of Marylebone, Saint Andrew, shall be excepted out of the union and shall be held and applied by us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, for the endowment of the proposed new Church and District hereinbefore referred to, and pending the formation of such District the said annual sum shall be accumulated in our hands for the same object.

" 10. That upon the union taking effect (a) the leasehold property comprising the hereditaments and premises on the west side of and Numbered 70 and 71, Wells Street, in the Parish of Saint Marylebone in the County of London and now held by the London Diocesan Fund upon certain trusts in connection with the said Church of Saint Andrew, Marylebone, shall be transferred from the said London Diocesan Fund to us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, and (b) the leasehold property known as the Church House adjoining the said Church of Saint Andrew, Marylebone, and now held by the Incumbent of the said Benefice of Marylebone, Saint Andrew, and his successors shall also be transferred to us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, and both the said leasehold properties shall be sold and the net proceeds of such sales shall be added to the fund arising from the proceeds of sale of the Church site referred to in Clause 8 hereof and be applied as recommended in that clause.

" Provided always that the provisions herein contained relating to the sale and disposal of the Church of Saint Andrew, Marylebone, shall not take effect until the consents and approval which by the said Union of Benefices Measure, 1923, are made requisite to the sale under the powers conferred by that Measure of the site of any Church shall be obtained to the sale and disposal hereby proposed of the said Church of Saint Andrew, Marylebone, and of the site thereof together with any ground annexed or belonging thereto.

" And provided further that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them, in accordance with the provisions of the said Measure, or of any other Measure of the National Assembly of the Church of England, or of any Act of Parliament."

And whereas drafts of the said Scheme have been duly published in accordance with the provisions of the said Union of Benefices Measure, 1923, and Notices have been transmitted to the persons or bodies entitled under the same Measure to receive Notice requiring any objections to such draft Scheme to be stated or transmitted in writing to the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners within the time prescribed in the Statutory Rules applicable to proceedings under the said Union of Benefices Measure, 1923:

And whereas certain objections have been so stated or transmitted to the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners within the time prescribed in the same Rules:

And whereas the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, after giving full consideration to such objections, have deemed right to make no alterations in such draft Scheme:

And whereas public notice of the certification to His Majesty in Council of the said Scheme and the consent thereto in writing of the Bishop of London has been duly given in the manner and within the time prescribed in the Statutory Rules aforesaid:

And whereas an appeal against the said Scheme was made to His Majesty in Council by E. H. Holthouse, Esquire, and others, and such appeal was referred to the Judicial Committee of the Privy Council by Order in Council of the 12th day of February, 1931:

And whereas the Lords of the said Committee, having taken the said appeal into consideration, reported to His Majesty in Council their opinion that the appeal ought to be dismissed and the said Scheme be affirmed:

And whereas His Majesty was pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, by Order of the 11th day of February, 1932, to approve the said Report:

And whereas the said Scheme has been laid before both Houses of Parliament for the space of two calendar months:

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to affirm the said Scheme and to order that the Benefices therein recommended to be united shall be united to the extent and for the purposes recommended in the said Scheme, and further to order and direct that the said Scheme and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the date when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Measure.

And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of London.
