the said Robert Henry Bigg during the remainder of his life subject, however, to the same conditions as to suspension and forfeiture, as a pension assigned to a retiring Incumbent under the provisions of the Incumbents' Resignation Acts, 1871 and 1887, and the provisions of those Acts as to recovery in case of non-payment and as to such conditions as aforesaid shall apply to the said annual sum and to the said Robert Henry Bigg as if the said annual sum were a pension awarded under the said Resignation Acts and the said Robert Henry Bigg had resigned the said Benefice of Finsbury, Bunhill Row, Saint Paul, under those Acts, provided however that the said annual sum shall not be liable to cease or be diminished by reason only of the said Robert Henry Bigg taking Sunday Duty or occasional Duty for remuneration elsewhere than within his former Benefice.

"6. That upon the union taking effect the register books of baptisms, marriages and burials and other the records and muniments deposited in the Church of Finsbury, Bunhill Row, Saint Paul, shall be transferred to the Church of Saint Mary, Charterhouse, but the marriage registers in duplicate current at the Church of Finsbury, Bunhill Row, Saint Paul, shall first be sent to the Registrar General to be closed officially.

"7. That at any time and from time to time after the union has taken effect the Incumbent of the United Benefice shall employ such clerical or lay assistance in the performance of the duties of the United Benefice as the Bishop may require and towards the remuneration of clergy or lay workers so required to be employed the Incumbent of the United Benefice shall be liable to provide out of the income of the United Benefice such sum as may be necessary not exceeding the sum of £80 in any one year. Provided always that in the event of any pension becom-ing payable to the said Robert Henry Bigg out of the revenues of the United Benefice as contemplated by Clause 5 of this Scheme then during the continuance of such pension and so long as the said Arthur Tildesley shall continue to be Incumbent of the United Benefice no part of the income of the United Benefice shall be applicable towards the cost of obtaining clerical or lay assistance, and for the period (if any) between the date of the avoidance of the United Benefice by the said Arthur Tildesley and the date of the cessation of the said pension the amount which the Incumbent of the United Benefice shall be liable to provide as aforesaid shall be reduced to a sum not exceeding £15 in any one year.

"8. That the Parsonage House at present belonging to the said Benefice of Finsbury, Bunhill Row, Saint Paul, shall become and be the house of residence for the Incumbent of the United Benefice but in the event of the said Arthur Tildesley becoming the first Incumbent of the United Benefice as hereinbefore recommended and proposed then during the period of his Incumbency the said Arthur Tildesley shall be permitted to reside in the Parsonage House at present belonging to the said Benefice of Charterhouse, Saint Mary, with Charterhouse, Saint Thomas, and so soon

as conveniently may be after the union has taken effect or after the avoidance of the United Benefice by the said Arthur Tildesley if he shall become the first Incumbent of the United Benefice as aforesaid the Parsonage House at present belonging to the said Benefice of Charterhouse, Saint Mary, with Charter-house, Saint Thomas, and the site and appurtenances thereof and the grounds heretofore usually occupied and enjoyed therewith shall be sold and disposed of by us the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners at such time or times and in such manner in all respects as to us shall seem expedient and that the net proceeds of such sale shall be held and accumulated by us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, for and towards the cost of the provision of a Parsonage House for the proposed new District contemplated by this Scheme.

"9. That with the consent (testified as aforesaid) of the said Philip Davenport Ellis as Patron of the said Benefice of Finsbury, Bunhill Row, Saint Paul, and with the con-sent (testified as aforesaid) of the said Dean and Chapter of the Cathedral Church of Saint Paul in London as Patrons of the said Benefice of Charterhouse, Saint Mary, with Charterhouse, Saint Thomas, upon the union taking effect a portion of the endowments and property of the Benefices hereinbefore recommended and proposed to be united, that is to say a sum of £235 per annum, being part of a larger annual sum at present payable by us the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners to the Incumbent for the time being of the said Benefice of Finsbury, Bunhill Row, Saint Paul, shall be severed or diverted from the endowments of the said Benefice of Finsbury, Bunhill Row, Saint Paul, and shall not be transferred to the United Benefice or be payable to the Incumbent thereof but shall be paid by us the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners. into a fund to be accumulated towards the endowment of the proposed new Church and District contemplated by this Scheme: and upon the constitution of such new District the said fund with its accumulations shall be appropriated by us the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners to the endowment of the said new District. Provided always that in the event of any pension becoming payable to the said Robert Henry Bigg in pursuance of the provision hereinbefore contained the sever-ance and diversion as aforesaid of the said annual sum of £235 per annum shall be postponed until the said pension ceases, and if the said pension ceases while the said Arthur Tildesley is still Incumbent of the United Benefice then for the period between the date of the cessation of the said pension and the date of the avoidance of the United Benefice by the said Arthur Tildesley the sum to be severed and diverted as aforesaid shall be reduced to £220 per annum.

"10. That upon the union taking effect the grant of £120 per annum at present payable by us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners out of our Common Fund to the Incumbent for the time being of the said Benefice of Finsbury, Bunhill Row, Saint Paul, conditionally upon the employment of an Assistant Curate within the Parish of that Benefice, shall cease and be no longer
