IN THE MATTER OF THE LONDON TRAFFIC ACT,  
1924.

Notice is hereby given under the Rules Publication Act, 1893, that it is proposed by the Minister of Transport, after the expiration of at least forty days from this date, in pursuance of the powers conferred upon him by Section 7 of the aforesaid London Traffic Act, to make Regulations amending the London Traffic (Restricted Streets) Regulations.

AGRICULTURAL WAGES (REGULATION)  
ACT, 1924.

Whereas the Agricultural Wages Committee for the area comprising the administrative counties of the Parts of Kesteven and Lindsey Divisions of Lincolnshire, which, for the purposes of the Agricultural Wages (Regulation) Act, 1924, shall be deemed to include the city and county borough of Lincoln, and the county borough of Grimsby, have in pursuance of the above Act, duly cancelled the minimum and overtime rates of wages fixed by them and made effective by an Order of the Agricultural Wages Board dated 23rd February, 1932, and have duly fixed minimum and overtime rates of wages for workers employed in agriculture for time work in that area and the said rates are set out in the Schedule to this Order. Now the Agricultural Wages Board, in pursuance of the said Act, and for the purpose of carrying out the decision of the said Committee, hereby cancel as from 19th March, 1932, the said Order of 23rd February, 1932, and hereby order that the provisions contained in the Schedule to this Order shall become effective on 20th March, 1932.

SCHEDULE.

1. *Waggoners.*—The wages payable for the employment of male workers wholly or mainly as waggoners shall be wages at not less than the following minimum rates:—

per week of:—

- 43½ hours in the week in which Good Friday falls,
- 53 hours in any other week in summer,
- 39½ hours in the week in which Christmas Day falls, and
- 48 hours in any other week in winter,

with in addition such hours as may be required by the employer for the performance of customary duties in connection with the care of horses, but so that the total number of hours shall not exceed:—

- 58 in any week from 14th May to 14th October,
- 52½ in the weeks in which Good Friday and Christmas Day fall, and
- 61 in any other week.

2. *Shepherds.*—The wages payable for the employment of male workers of 21 years of age and over wholly or mainly as shepherds shall be wages at not less than the following minimum rates:—

(a) 35s. per week of:—

- 43½ hours in the week in which Good Friday falls,
- 53 hours in any other week in summer,
- 39½ hours in the week in which Christmas Day falls, and
- 48 hours in any other week in winter,
