#### PRESENT,

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS there was this day read at the Board a Memorial from the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, dated the 12th day of March, 1932, (V 380/32) in the words following viz:—

(V. 380/32), in the words following, viz.:—
"Whereas by Section 3 of the Naval and Marine Pay and Pensions Act, 1865, it is enacted, inter alia, that all pay, pensions, or other allowances in the nature thereof payable in respect of services in Your Majesty's Naval or Marine Force to a person being, or having been, an Officer, Seaman, or Marine therein shall be paid in such manner and subject to such restrictions, conditions, and provisions, as are from time to time directed by Order in Council:

"And whereas Your Majesty was graciously pleased by Your Orders in Council bearing dates the 10th day of August, 1922, and the 19th day of May, 1931, to sanction the payment of certain allowances to Stewards in Your Majesty's Navy, for the care of mess traps supplied to Flag Officers', Commanding Officers', Ward Room, Gun Room and Warrant Officers' Messes:

"And whereas we consider it desirable that the appropriate allowances should be payable to 65-33811 other selected Naval Ratings, or Royal Marines, when circumstances do not permit of the duty being performed by Stewards:

"We beg leave humbly to recommend that Your Majesty may be graciously pleased, by Your Order in Council, to approve the payment of the appropriate allowances accordingly.

"The Lords Commissioners of Your Majesty's Treasury have signified their concurrence in this proposal."

His Majesty, having taken the said Memorial into consideration, was pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to approve of what is therein proposed.

And the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty are to give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

#### PRESENT,

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

HEREAS by the Dockyard Ports Regulation Act, 1865, it is enacted that it shall be lawful for His Majesty in Council from time to time, by Order in Council, to define the limits of a Dockyard Port for the purposes

of that Act, and to make regulations in relation to any Dockyard Port for all or any of the purposes in the said Act particularly mentioned, and for such other purposes as from time to time seem necessary, with a view to the proper protection of His Majesty's vessels, dockyards, or property, or to the requirements of His Majesty's Naval Service:

And whereas by the same Act it is also enacted that in relation to any Dockyard Port it shall be lawful for His Majesty in Council from time to time, by Order in Council, on the joint recommendation of the Admiralty and the Board of Trade, to make rules concerning the Lights or Signals to be carried or used, and the steps for avoiding collision to be taken by His Majesty's vessels and other vessels navigating the waters of the Port and of the approaches thereto:

And whereas in pursuance of the said Act certain Regulations and Rules were made by Order in Council, dated the 29th day of June, 1931, with reference to the two Dockyard Ports of Plymouth and Devonport:

And whereas it appears expedient to amend such Rules as hereinafter provided:

And whereas the provisions of section 1 of the Rules Publication Act, 1893, have been complied with:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by virtue of the powers in this behalf by the said Act or otherwise in Him vested, on the joint recommendation of the Admiralty and the Board of Trade, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, is pleased to order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:—

#### PRELIMINARY.

- 1. This Order shall take effect from one calendar month from the date hereof.
- 2. Clause 14 of the Second Schedule to the said Order in Council dated the 29th day of June, 1931, is hereby repealed.
- 3. The following Rule shall have effect in relation to the Dockyard Port of Plymouth and shall be read and construed as though inserted in the Second Schedule to the said Order in Council dated the 29th day of June, 1931, in the position indicated by the number prefixed thereto:—

Prohibition of Trawling and Net Fishing in Certain Areas.

14. No trawling or fishing by nets, whether drift nets or set nets, shall be at any time carried on in the main fairways to, or in the centre portion of Plymouth Sound, the prohibited area of which shall be limited as follows:—

On the western side by a straight line drawn from Eastern King Point to the position marked by the Melampus buoy; thence to the position marked by the Queen's Grounds buoy; and thence in the direction of the position marked by the Draystone buoy;

On the eastern side by a straight line drawn from Fisher's Nose to the outermost extremity of Mount Batten Breakwater; thence to Rams Cliff; thence to Duke Rock buoy; thence to Bovisand pierhead; and thence to Shagstone.

Net fishing shall, however, be permitted around the breakwater, inside the area bounded as follows:—

South of the breakwater, by a straight line passing from the western extremity of the breakwater, successively through the positions marked by the following buoys, namely, the Knap buoy and Tinker buoy, to the eastern extremity of the breakwater;

North of the breakwater, by a straight line passing from the eastern extremity of the breakwater to a position one hundred and fifty yards North (true) of the breakwater fort; and thence to the western extremity of the breakwater.

4. On the chart accompanying this Order are marked all the limits of the said areas, and this chart shall replace the chart which accompanied the aforesaid Order in Council dated the 29th day of June, 1931.

#### TENDERS FOR TREASURY BILLS.

1. The Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury hereby give notice that Tenders will be received at the Chief Cashier's Office, at the Bank of England, on Friday the 1st April, 1932, at 1 o'clock, for Treasury Bills to be issued under the Treasury Bills Act, 1877, the

National Debt Act, 1889, and the War Loan Acts, 1914-1919, to the amount of £45,000,000.

- 2. The Bills will be in amounts of £5,000 or £10,000. They will be dated at the option of the Tenderer on any business day from Monday, the 4th April, 1932, to Saturday, the 9th April, 1932, inclusive, and will be payable at three months after date.
- 3. The Bills will be issued and paid at the Bank of England.
- 4. Each Tender must be for an amount not less than £50,000, and must specify the date on which the Bills required are to be dated, and the net amount per cent. (being an even multiple of one penny) which will be given for the amount applied for. Separate Tenders must be lodged for Bills of different dates.
- 5. Tenders must be made through a London Banker, Discount House or Broker.
- 6. The persons whose Tenders are accepted will be informed of the same not later than the following day, and payment in full of the amounts of the accepted tenders must be made to the Bank of England by means of Cash or a Banker's Draft on the Bank of England not later than 2 o'clock (Saturday 12 o'clock) on the day on which the relative Bills are to be dated.
- 7. In virtue of the provisions of Section 1 (4) of the War Loan Act, 1919, Members of the House of Commons are not precluded from tendering for these Bills.
- 8. Tenders must be made on the printed forms which may be obtained from the Chief Cashier's Office, Bank of England.
- 9. The Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury reserve the right of rejecting any Tenders.

In both the foregoing services a call may be booked either:-

- (a) as an ordinary call, i.e. for a specified telephone station, in which case only the telephone number of the station required should be given, or
- (b) as a "person-to-person" call, i.e. from a particular person to a particular person, in which case the name of the person calling should be given as well as the name of the person required. In addition, the usual telephone number of the person required, and if possible the name associated with that number in the Telephone Directory, should be given. Where the telephone number is not known by the caller an effort will be made to trace it, if the name and address of the person required is Calling subscribers should, if possible, intimate at the time of booking a person-to-person" call, the name of an acceptable substitute at the receiving station.

In the case of a "person-to-person" call, when communication with the number required is established but further efforts to complete the call are abandoned, owing to the particular person required, and the substitute (if specified), being unobtainable, or owing to the refusal to speak by or on behalf of the called person and specified substitute, a "report charge" will be made in place of the normal charge. The caller will be notified of the impracticability of completing the call. When a "person-to-person" call matures, no "report charge" will be made.

Note.—The hours during which calls may be connected vary according to the season; at present they are (British time) 2 p.m. to 2 a.m. daily in the service with Bermuda and 6.30 to 2.30 a.m. daily in the service with the Sandwich Islands.
