#### PRESENT,

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

HEREAS there was this day read at the Board a Memorial from the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, dated the 12th day of March, 1932, (V. 380/32), in the words following, viz.:—

(V. 380/32), in the words following, viz.:—
"Whereas by Section 3 of the Naval and Marine Pay and Pensions Act, 1865, it is enacted, inter alia, that all pay, pensions, or other allowances in the nature thereof payable in respect of services in Your Majesty's Naval or Marine Force to a person being, or having been, an Officer, Seaman, or Marine therein shall be paid in such manner and subject to such restrictions, conditions, and provisions, as are from time to time directed by Order in Council:

"And whereas Your Majesty was graciously pleased by Your Orders in Council bearing dates the 10th day of August, 1922, and the 19th day of May, 1931, to sanction the payment of certain allowances to Stewards in Your Majesty's Navy, for the care of mess traps supplied to Flag Officers', Commanding Officers', Ward Room, Gun Room and Warrant Officers' Messes:

"And whereas we consider it desirable that the appropriate allowances should be payable to 65-33811 other selected Naval Ratings, or Royal Marines, when circumstances do not permit of the duty being performed by Stewards:

"We beg leave humbly to recommend that Your Majesty may be graciously pleased, by Your Order in Council, to approve the payment of the appropriate allowances accordingly.

"The Lords Commissioners of Your Majesty's Treasury have signified their concurrence in this proposal."

His Majesty, having taken the said Memorial into consideration, was pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to approve of what is therein proposed.

And the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty are to give the necessary directions herein accordingly.
