

National Debt Act, 1889, and the War Loan Acts, 1914-1919, to the amount of £45,000,000.

2. The Bills will be in amounts of £5,000 or £10,000. They will be dated at the option of the Tenderer on any business day from Monday, the 4th April, 1932, to Saturday, the 9th April, 1932, inclusive, and will be payable at three months after date.
