PRESENT,

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS there was this day read at the Board a Memorial from the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, dated the 29th day of March, 1932 (C.W. 2159/32), in the words following, viz. :—

“Whereas by Section 3 of the Naval and Marine Pay and Pensions Act, 1865, it is

enacted, *inter alia*, that all pay, pensions, or other allowances in the nature thereof payable in respect of services in Your Majesty's Naval or Marine Force to a person being or having been an Officer, Seaman, or Marine therein, shall be paid in such manner and subject to such restrictions, conditions and provisions as are from time to time directed by Order in Council:

“And whereas by Order in Council bearing date the 22nd day of January, 1920, Your Majesty was pleased to sanction, *inter alia*, revised rates of Command Money for Officers in command of Your Majesty's ships and shore establishments and to authorise the payment of Entertaining Allowance to Officers appointed in command:

“And whereas we consider that the Engineer Captain appointed in command of the Mechanical Training Establishment at Chatham should receive Command Money and Entertaining Allowance:

“We beg leave humbly to recommend that Your Majesty may be graciously pleased, by Your Order in Council, to authorise the payment to this Officer, with effect from the 1st day of January, 1932, of Command Money and Entertaining Allowance at the daily rates of 7s. and 5s. respectively.
