**WHEREAS** the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Union of Benefices Measure, 1923, duly prepared, and laid before His Majesty in Council, a Scheme bearing date the 28th day of January, 1932, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

“We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, acting in pursuance of the Union of Benefices Measure, 1923, have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council, the following Scheme for effecting the union of the Parish of Coggeshall and the Parish of Markshall, being the Parishes of the United Benefice of Coggeshall with Markshall, situate in the County of Essex and in the Diocese of Chelmsford:

“Whereas by an Order of Your Majesty in Council dated the 1st day of April, 1922, and published in the London Gazette on the 4th day of the same month, it was ordered and directed that the Benefice of Coggeshall and the Benefice of Markshall should be permanently united together and form one Benefice with Cure of Souls under the style of ‘The United Benefice of Coggeshall with Markshall,’ but that the Parishes of the said Benefices should continue distinct:

“And whereas since the date of the said Order of Your Majesty in Council the union of the said Benefices of Coggeshall and Markshall has become effective:

“And whereas since the date upon which the union of the said Benefices of Coggeshall and Markshall became effective Commissioners appointed at our request by the Right Reverend Henry, Bishop of Chelmsford, pursuant to the provisions of the said Union of Benefices Measure, 1923, to inquire into and report upon the union of the said Parishes of Coggeshall and Markshall have duly made a Report to the said Bishop of Chelmsford recommending the union of the said Parishes of Coggeshall and Markshall and the terms for effecting the union, and the said Bishop of Chelmsford signified in writing his approval of the said Report:

“And whereas we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, have prepared this Scheme for the said union of Parishes based upon the terms recommended in the said Report:

“And whereas the said United Benefice of Coggeshall with Markshall is now full, the Reverend Frank Pickford being the present Incumbent thereof:

“Now, therefore, we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, with the consent of the said Henry, Bishop of Chelmsford (in testimony whereof he has signed this Scheme), and with the consent of the said Frank Pickford (testified by his signing this Scheme), do humbly recommend and propose to Your Majesty as follows, that is to say:—

“1. That upon the day when any Order of Your Majesty in Council affirming this Scheme shall be published in the London Gazette the said Parish of Coggeshall and the said Parish of Markshall shall be united into one Parish for ecclesiastical purposes and for such other purposes as in the said Measure provided.

“2. That the Parish Church of the said Parish of Coggeshall shall be the Parish Church of the United Parish and that the Table of Fees for the said Parish of Coggeshall shall (until revised or altered by proper authority) be the Table of Fees for the United Parish.

“3. That upon the union taking effect the Register Books of Baptisms, Marriages and Burials and other the Records and Muniments deposited in the Church of Markshall shall be transferred to the Church of Coggeshall but the marriage registers in duplicate current at the Church of Markshall shall first be sent by the Incumbent of the said United Benefice of Coggeshall with Markshall to the Registrar General to be closed officially.

“4.—(a) That so soon as conveniently may be after the union has taken effect the Church at Markshall shall be taken down and the materials and site thereof, together with any ground annexed thereto and necessary for the use and enjoyment thereof shall be sold and disposed of by us the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners at such time or times and in such manner in all respects as to us shall seem expedient subject to the conditions and restrictions imposed by the said Union of Benefices Measure, 1923.

“(b) That the net proceeds (if any) to arise from such sale or sales after payment of the expenses attendant upon the sale or sales, the taking down of the Church, the removal of monuments (if any) and all other expenses incidental to these matters, shall be appropriated to the Expenses Fund of the Diocese of Chelmsford.

“(c) That the font, communion table, sacramental plate, bells, organ and other furniture and fittings of the said Church of Markshall or such of them as the Bishop of Chelmsford shall select shall be transferred to the Parish Church of the United Parish and any articles not so transferred shall be transferred to any other Church or Chapel or Churches or Chapels within the Diocese of Chelmsford which the Bishop may select; provided always that any articles that shall not be so transferred or appropriated except the font, communion table and sacramental plate, may be sold and the proceeds shall be added to the fund arising from the sale of the site and materials of the said Church of Markshall as aforesaid.

“Provided always that the provisions herein contained relating to the sale and disposal of the Church of Markshall shall not take effect until the consents and approval which by the said Union of Benefices Measure, 1923, are made requisite to the sale under the powers conferred by that Measure of the site of any
