PUBLIC HEALTH ACTS AMENDMENT ACT, 1907.

## RURAL DISTRICT OF HAMBLEDON.

**B**Y an Order dated the fifth day of April, 1932, the Minister of Health has declared that, on and after the sixteenth day of April, 1933, the following provisions shall be in force:—

(a) In all the contributory places comprising the Rural District of Hambledon: Sections 15, 16 and 17 (subject to the provisions of Section 33) comprised in Part II (Streets and Buildings) of the Public Health Acts Amendment Act, 1907.

(b) In all the contributory places comprising the said District other than the contributory place of Hascombe, Section 27 (subject to the provisions of Section 33) comprised in Part II (Streets and Buildings) of the said Act.

Provided that the said Section 27 shall have effect subject to the condition that the following words and figures shall be added to and form part of the section that is to say:—

“(7) Nothing in this section shall apply to any building which shall not be a public building or a building of the warehouse class and shall not be constructed or adapted to be used either wholly or partly for human habitation or as a place of habitual employment for any person in any manufacture trade or business and which if intended for use as a pigsty, stable or cowhouse shall be detached from any dwelling-house.”

“(8) Nothing in this section shall apply to any temporary building erected or set up for use by the Territorial Force.”

[The expenses (except establishment and certain other expenses) payable by the Council

in the execution of the above powers are declared by the order to be special expenses.]
