The following Statutes made by the Governing Body of Pembroke College, in the University of Cambridge, on the 16th day of April, 1932, have been submitted for the approval of His Majesty in Council, and notice of their having been so submitted is published in accordance with the provisions of "The Universities of Oxford and Cambridge Act, 1923."

STATUTES to alter and amend the Statutes of the College or Hall of Valence-Mary, commonly called Pembroke College, in the University of Cambridge, which amending Statutes having been duly made at a General Meeting of the Governing Body of the said College or Hall, specially summoned for the purpose, and held on the sixteenth day of April, 1932 (notice of the proposed amending Statutes having been given to the University) and passed at such Meeting by the votes of not less than two-thirds of the number of persons present and voting, are now submitted for the approval of His Majesty the King in Council.

WE, The Master, Fellows and Scholars of the College or Hall of Valence-Mary, commonly called Pembroke College, in the University of Cambridge, do hereby, in pursuance of the power given to us by the 7th Section of the Universities of Oxford and Cambridge Act, 1923, alter and amend the Statutes made under that Act in relation to our said College or Hall in manner following, that is to say:—

CHAPTER I.

Of the House and the Society.

By adding to Section 4 of this Chapter the words "the Election of Master," after the words "and to make College Orders with reference to such business, except".

By deleting in Section 5 of this Chapter the words "the election of Master," and adding at the end of the Section the following words "and the election of Master shall still be made as directed in Chapter II."

CHAPTER II.

Of the Master.

By repealing Section 1 of this Chapter and substituting therefor the following Section to form an amended Section 1:—

"1. Whenever the office of Master is vacant, or is about to become vacant under Sections 17 or 22 of this Chapter, the Fellows for the time being (exclusive of any who have held the office of Master), hereinafter termed the Electors, shall have power to elect a new Master."

By repealing Section 3 of this Chapter and substituting therefor the following Sections to form an amended Section 3 with an additional Section numbered 3A:—

"3. Save as provided in Section 3A of this Chapter, when the office becomes vacant in any term not less than fifteen days before the end of that term, forthwith after the vacancy shall have become known in College a Meeting of the Electors shall be convened for the election of a new Master. It shall be the duty of the senior Elector then present in Cambridge to convene the Meeting within three days, but in the event of his failing to do so within three days, the Meeting may be convened by any other of the Electors in residence. The Meeting shall be convened by seven clear days' written notice sent to each of the Electors. The Meeting shall in either case be held not later than fourteen days after the vacancy becomes known in College.

If the office becomes vacant within the fifteen days preceding the Long Vacation or during the Long Vacation (exclusive of the months of August and September) a Meeting
