And whereas His Majesty is satisfied of such incapacity and that the said Bishop has canonically resigned:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, is pleased to declare, and it is hereby declared, that the said Bishopric of Chester shall become vacant on the 15th day of July, 1932, and His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased to direct, and it is hereby directed, that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the Diocese of Chester.

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Union of Benefices Measure, 1923, duly prepared, and laid before His Majesty in Council, a Scheme bearing date the 14th day of April, 1932, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

“ We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, acting in pursuance of the Union of Benefices Measure, 1923, have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council, the following Scheme for effecting the union of the Benefice (being a Vicarage) of East Pennard and the Benefice (being a Rectory) of Pylle, both of which Benefices are situate in the County of Somerset and in the Diocese of Bath and Wells:

“ Whereas Commissioners appointed at our request by the Right Reverend St. John Basil Wynne, Bishop of Bath and Wells, pursuant to the provisions of the said Union of Benefices Measure, 1923, to inquire into and report upon the union of the said two Benefices of East Pennard and Pylle duly made their Report to the said Bishop of Bath and Wells and therein recommended the union of the said two Benefices and the terms for effecting the

union, and the said Bishop of Bath and Wells signified in writing his approval of the said Report:

"And whereas we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, have prepared this Scheme for the union of the said two Benefices based upon the terms recommended in the said Report:

"And whereas both of the said Benefices of East Pennard and Pylle are now full, the Reverend George Augustus Arthur Wright being the present Incumbent of the said Benefice of East Pennard and the Reverend Lewis Elwyn Lewis being the present Incumbent of the said Benefice of Pylle:

"Now, therefore, we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, with the consent of the said St. John Basil Wynne, Bishop of Bath and Wells (in testimony whereof he has signed this Scheme), do humbly recommend and propose to Your Majesty as follows, that is to say:—

"1. That the said Benefice of East Pennard and the said Benefice of Pylle shall be permanently united together and form one Benefice with cure of souls under the style of 'The United Benefice of East Pennard with Pylle' but the Parishes of the said Benefices shall continue distinct in all respects.

"2. That if upon the day when any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme shall be published in the London Gazette both of the said two Benefices shall be vacant, the union of the same two Benefices shall take effect forthwith; and if one only of the said two Benefices shall be then vacant the said union shall also take effect forthwith if the Incumbent of the other of the said two Benefices shall consent to become the first Incumbent of the United Benefice, but, if he shall not so consent then the said union shall take effect upon the next avoidance of his Benefice and the then Incumbent (if any) of the other of the said two Benefices shall be the first Incumbent of the United Benefice; and if neither of the said two Benefices be then vacant then the said union shall take effect on the next avoidance of either of the said two Benefices if the Incumbent at that time of the other of the said two Benefices shall consent to become the first Incumbent of the United Benefice, but if he shall not so consent then the said union shall take effect immediately upon the next vacancy of his Benefice and the then Incumbent (if any) of the other of the said two Benefices shall become the first Incumbent of the United Benefice.

"3. That upon the said union taking effect the Parsonage House at present belonging to the said Benefice of East Pennard shall become and be the house of residence for the Incumbent of the United Benefice and so soon as conveniently may be the Parsonage House at present belonging to the said Benefice of Pylle and the site and appurtenances thereof and the grounds heretofore usually occupied and enjoyed therewith if not previously sold under proper authority shall be sold and disposed of by us the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners at such time or times and in such manner in all respects as to us shall seem expedient and that the net proceeds of such sale shall be held and invested by us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, for the benefit of the United Benefice.

"4. That after the said union has taken effect the course and succession in which the respective Patrons shall present or nominate to the United Benefice from time to time as the same shall become vacant shall be as follows, that is to say, that in every series of three successive turns of presentation or nomination to be made to the United Benefice after the union the Patron of the said Benefice of East Pennard shall have the first and the third turns and the Patron of the said Benefice of Pylle shall have the second turn.

"Provided always that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them, in accordance with the provisions of the said Measure, or of any other Measure of the National Assembly of the Church of England, or of any Act of Parliament."

And whereas drafts of the said Scheme have been duly published in accordance with the provisions of the said Union of Benefices Measure, 1923, and Notices have been transmitted to the persons or bodies entitled under the same Measure to receive Notice requiring any objections to such draft Scheme to be stated or transmitted in writing to the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners within the time prescribed in the Statutory Rules applicable to proceedings under the said Union of Benefices Measure, 1923:

And whereas the prescribed time has elapsed and no such objections have been so stated or transmitted to the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners:

And whereas public notice of the certification to His Majesty in Council of the said Scheme and the consent thereto in writing of the Bishop of Bath and Wells has been duly given in the manner and within the time prescribed in the Statutory Rules aforesaid:

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to affirm the said Scheme and to order that the Benefices therein recommended to be united shall be united to the extent and for the purposes recommended in the said Scheme, and further to order and direct that the said Scheme and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the date when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Measure.

And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of Bath and Wells.

“ We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, acting under the provisions of the Act of the 7th and 8th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 94, the Act of the 13th and 14th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 94, and the Act of the 32nd and 33rd years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 94, have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council, the following Scheme or Representation for altering the boundaries of the New Parish of Saint Michael, Wood Green, and the New Parish of Saint Benet Fink, Tottenham, both in the County of Middlesex and in the Diocese of London:

“ Whereas by the authority of an Order of Her said late Majesty in Council bearing date the 3rd day of February, 1866, and published in the London Gazette on the 6th day of the same month, a District Chapelry was assigned to the consecrated Church of Saint Michael, Wood Green, situate in the Parish of Tottenham, in the said County of Middlesex and in the said Diocese of London, and such District Chapelry was named ‘ The District Chapelry of Saint Michael, Wood Green ’:

“ And whereas by the authority of an Order of Your Majesty in Council bearing date the 16th day of December, 1912, and published in the London Gazette on the 20th day of the same month, a Consolidated Chapelry was assigned to the consecrated Church of Saint Benet Fink, Tottenham, situate within the New Parish of Christ Church, West Green, Tottenham, in the said County of Middlesex and in the said Diocese of London, and the said Consolidated Chapelry was named ‘ The Consolidated Chapelry of Saint Benet Fink, Tottenham ’:

“ And whereas the said District Chapelry of Saint Michael, Wood Green, and the said Consolidated Chapelry of Saint Benet Fink, Tottenham, have become New Parishes of the character contemplated by the Act of the 6th and 7th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 37, by the Act of the 19th and 20th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 104, and by the above mentioned Act of the 32nd and 33rd years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 94:

“ And whereas it has been represented to us, and it appears to us to be expedient that the boundaries of the said New Parish of Saint Michael, Wood Green, and of the said New Parish of Saint Benet Fink, Tottenham, should be altered in the manner which is hereinafter mentioned:

“ Now, therefore, with the consent of the Right Honourable and Right Reverend Arthur Foley, Bishop of London (in testimony whereof he has signed and sealed this Scheme or Representation), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, humbly represent, recommend and propose that from and after the day of the

date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme or Representation and without any assurance in the law other than such duly gazetted Order the boundaries of the said New Parish of Saint Michael, Wood Green, and of the said New Parish of Saint Benet Fink, Tottenham, shall be altered so that all those portions of the said Parish of Tottenham and of the said New Parish of Saint Michael, Wood Green, which are described in the Schedule hereunder written and are delineated and set forth upon the Map or Plan hereunto annexed and are thereon coloured pink, shall be dissevered from such Parish and New Parish respectively, and shall be annexed to and shall in future form part of the said New Parish of Saint Benet Fink, Tottenham.

“ And we further represent, recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from representing, recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them, in accordance with the provisions of the hereinbefore mentioned Acts, or of any of them, or of any other Act of Parliament.

“ THE SCHEDULE to which the foregoing Scheme or Representation has reference.

“ The territory to be annexed to the New Parish of Saint Benet Fink, Tottenham, in the County of Middlesex and in the Diocese of London, comprising:—

“ I. All that portion of the Parish of Tottenham, in the said County and Diocese, which is bounded upon the south by the said New Parish of Saint Benet Fink, Tottenham, upon the west by the New Parish of Saint Michael, Wood Green, upon part of the north by the Consolidated Chapelry of Saint Cuthbert, Chitts Hill, both in the said County and Diocese, and upon the remaining sides, that is to say, upon the remaining part of the north and upon the east, by an imaginary line commencing upon the boundary which divides the said Consolidated Chapelry of Saint Cuthbert, Chitts Hill, from the said Parish of Tottenham at the junction of White Hart Lane with Rivulet Road, and extending thence eastward along the middle of Rivulet Road for a distance of 30½ chains or thereabouts to its junction with Jellicoe Road and Great Cambridge Road, and extending thence southward along the middle of Great Cambridge Road for a distance of 4 chains or thereabouts to its junction with the road called Roundway, and extending thence south eastward along the middle of Roundway for a distance of 14 chains or thereabouts to its junction with Henningham Road, and extending thence south westward along the middle of Henningham Road for a distance of 4 chains or thereabouts to its junction with De Quincey Road, and extending thence first south eastward and then southward along the middle of De Quincey Road for a distance of 7½ chains or thereabouts to its junction with Risley Avenue opposite to the northern entrance to Tower Gardens, and extending thence southward in a straight line across Tower Gardens for a distance of 6 chains or thereabouts to the northern end of the wall or fence forming the boundary between the houses and premises

known as Number 149 and Number 151, Tower Gardens Road, and extending thence southward along such wall or fence for a distance of $1\frac{1}{2}$ chains or thereabouts to its southern end on the northern side of Tower Gardens Road, and extending thence southward across Tower Gardens Road for a distance of 13 yards or thereabouts to the northern end of the wall or fence forming the boundary between the houses and premises known as Number 178 and Number 180, Tower Gardens Road, and extending thence southward along such wall or fence and along the wall or fence forming the boundary between the houses known as Number 248 and Number 250, Lordship Lane for a distance in all of $2\frac{1}{2}$ chains or thereabouts to the point where the last mentioned wall or fence reaches the northern side of Lordship Lane, and extending thence southward for a distance of 7 yards or thereabouts to the middle of Lordship Lane upon the boundary which divides the said Parish of Tottenham from the said New Parish of Saint Benet Fink, Tottenham.

"II. And also all that contiguous portion of the said New Parish of Saint Michael, Wood Green, which is bounded upon the north by the said Consolidated Chapelry of Saint Cuthbert, Chitts Hill, upon the east partly by the above described portion of the said Parish of Tottenham and partly by the said New Parish of Saint Benet Fink, Tottenham, upon the south by the New Parish of Saint Mark, Noel Park, in the said County and Diocese, and upon the remaining side, that is to say, upon the west, by an imaginary line commencing upon the boundary which divides the said New Parish of Saint Mark, Noel Park, from the said New Parish of Saint Michael, Wood Green, at the junction of Lordship Lane with Perth Road, and extending thence northward along the middle of Perth Road for a distance of 36 chains or thereabouts to its junction with White Hart Lane upon the boundary which divides the said New Parish of Saint Michael, Wood Green, from the said Consolidated Chapelry of Saint Cuthbert, Chitts Hill."

And whereas drafts of the said Scheme or Representation have been transmitted to the Patrons and to the Incumbents of the Cures affected by the arrangements which are contemplated by such Scheme or Representation and such Patrons and Incumbents have respectively signified their assent thereto:

And whereas the said Scheme or Representation has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said Scheme or Representation, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts.

And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of London.

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of the Act of the 59th year of His late Majesty King George the Third, Chapter 134, of the Act of the 2nd and 3rd years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 49, and of the Act of the 19th and 20th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 55, have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council, the following Representation as to the assignment of a District Chapelry to the consecrated Church of Saint Philip, situate at Upper Stratton, in the Parish of Stratton Saint Margaret, in the County of Wilts and in the Diocese of Bristol:

"Whereas it appears to us to be expedient that a District Chapelry should be assigned to the said Church of Saint Philip, situate at Upper Stratton as aforesaid:

"Now, therefore, with the consent of the Right Reverend George, Bishop of Bristol (testified by his having signed and sealed this Representation), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, humbly represent, that it would, in our opinion, be expedient that all that part of the said Parish of Stratton Saint Margaret which is described in the Schedule hereunder written, all which part, together with the boundaries thereof, is delineated and set forth on the map or plan hereunto annexed, should be assigned as a District Chapelry to the said Church of Saint Philip, situate at Upper Stratton as aforesaid, and that the same should be named 'The District Chapelry of Saint Philip, Upper Stratton'.

"And with the like consent of the said George, Bishop of Bristol (testified as aforesaid), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, further represent, that it appears to us to be expedient that banns of matrimony should be published, and that marriages, baptisms, churchings, and burials should be solemnized or performed at the said Church of Saint Philip situate at Upper Stratton as aforesaid, and that the fees or dues to be received in respect of the publication of banns and of the solemnization or performance of marriages, churchings and burials should be paid and belong to the minister of the same church for the time being. Provided always that so long as the Reverend Charles Louis Malaher the present Vicar or Incumbent of the Vicarage of the said Parish of Stratton Saint Margaret shall continue to be such Vicar or Incumbent all the fees or dues which may be received in respect of such publication, solemnization or performance at the said Church of Saint Philip, Upper Stratton, shall be paid over by

the Minister thereof to the said Charles Louis Malaher.

"THE SCHEDULE to which the foregoing Representation has reference.

"The District Chapelry of Saint Philip, Upper Stratton, being:—

"All that part of the Parish of Stratton Saint Margaret, in the County of Wilts and in the Diocese of Bristol, which is bounded upon the south and upon part of the south west by the New Parish of Saint Barnabas, Gorse Hill, New Swindon, upon the remaining part of the south west and upon the west by the Parish of Rodbourne Cheney, upon the north partly by the Parish of Blunsdon and partly by the Parish of Stanton Fitzwarren, all in the said County and Diocese, and upon the remaining side, that is to say, upon the east, by an imaginary line commencing at the point where the boundary which divides the said Parish of Stanton Fitzwarren from the said Parish of Stratton Saint Margaret crosses the middle of the Swindon and Highworth Line of the Great Western Railway near the northern side of the Bridge which carries Kingsdown Lane across such line of railway, and extending thence southward along the middle of the said line of railway for a distance of 1 mile and 75 chains or thereabouts to the boundary which divides the said Parish of Stratton Saint Margaret from the said New Parish of Saint Barnabas, Gorse Hill, Swindon."

And whereas the said Representation has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said Representation, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts.

And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of Bristol.

WHEREAS the Minister of Health, after giving to the Incumbent and Churchwardens of the Parish of Warmington, in the County of Northampton, 10 days' previous notice of his intention in that behalf, has, under the provisions of the Burial Act, 1853, as amended by subsequent enactments, made a Representation to His Majesty in Council that for the protection of the Public Health, the opening of any new burial ground in the Civil Parish of Warmington, in the said County of Northampton, save with the previous approval of the Minister of Health, should be prohibited, and that, except as hereinafter provided, burials should be discontinued therein as follows, viz. :—

WARMINGTON.—Forthwith and entirely in the Parish Church of Saint Mary the Virgin,

in the said Parish, and in the Churchyard attached thereto.

Provided that—

(a) In the walled grave now existing in the said Churchyard and belonging or reputed to belong to Katherine Turnill, the burial may be allowed of the body of the said Katherine Turnill at her decease subject to the condition that the coffin buried in such grave be separately enclosed by stonework or brickwork properly cemented.

(b) In earthen graves now existing in the said Churchyard the burial may be allowed of the bodies of the following persons at their decease, viz. Elizabeth Kidd, Elizabeth Harbour, Fanny Pelpoe, Ellen Harriet Oakley, Louisa Howell, Rachael Burdett, Mary Ann Gilder, Sarah Lines, Fanny Bartlett, Sarah Annie Howell, and Eric Mildmay Turnill, subject to the condition that no part of the coffin containing the body shall in any case be at a depth less than three feet below the level of the surface of the ground adjoining the grave:

Now, therefore, His Majesty in Council is pleased hereby to give Notice of such Representation and to order that the same be taken into consideration by a Committee of the Privy Council on the 4th day of June next.

And His Majesty is further pleased to direct that this Order be forthwith published in the London Gazette, and that copies thereof be affixed on the doors of the Churches or Chapels of, or on some conspicuous places within, the Parish affected by such Representation one month before the said 4th day of June.

TREASURY MINUTE DATED THE
28TH APRIL, 1932.

My Lords read Section 8 of the Currency and Bank Notes Act, 1928.

The Chancellor of the Exchequer informs the Board that the Governor and Company of the Bank of England have represented to him that it is in their opinion expedient that the amount of the fiduciary note issue be maintained at 275 million pounds, to which it was increased under the authority of Treasury Minute dated the 1st August, 1931, and subsequent Minutes concluding with the Minute of the 28th January, 1932. He proposes accordingly that the authority to the Bank to issue fiduciary bank notes to the total amount of 275 million pounds should be further extended until the 30th June, 1932.

My Lords approve and direct that the Bank of England be notified accordingly.

Let a copy of this Minute be laid before both Houses of Parliament under Section 8 subsection (3) of the Currency and Bank Notes Act, 1928.

(iv) All employment in excess of 48 hours (excluding all hours which are treated as overtime employment) in any week in winter, except as provided in sub-clause (iii) above.

(v) All employment in excess of 42 hours (excluding all hours which are treated as overtime employment) in the weeks in which Good Friday, Whit Monday and August Bank Holiday fall.

(vi) All employment in excess of 51 hours (excluding all hours which are treated as overtime employment) in any week in summer, except as provided in sub-clause (v) above.

B. In the case of female workers:—

(i) All employment in excess of 5½ hours on a Saturday or on such other day (not being Sunday, Christmas Day, Good Friday, Whit Monday or August Bank Holiday) in every week as may be agreed between the employer and the worker.

(ii) All employment on a Sunday, Christmas Day, Good Friday, Whit Monday and August Bank Holiday.

(iii) All employment in excess of 8 hours on any other day.

For the purpose of this Order employment in summer shall be deemed to be all employment during the period commencing on the first day of March and terminating on the last day of October following, and employment in winter shall be deemed to be all employment during the period commencing on the first day of November and terminating on the last day of February following.

Provided that this provision shall not apply where the worker has agreed with the employer to take time off without pay.

(b) In the case of other workers of 21 years of age and over less than 54, or

(c) In the case of all workers under 21 years of age less than 60,

the rate of wages applicable to that worker shall be such as to secure to the worker the wages which would have been payable if the agreed hours had been the full number of hours mentioned above in the case of that worker.

3. For the purpose of the above rates the hours of work shall not include meal times, but shall include any time during which, by reason of weather conditions, an employer has prevented from working a worker who was present at the place of employment and ready to work.

(ii) that excepting employment on Christmas Day, no employment in connection with the feeding and cleaning of stock shall rank as overtime employment.
