The following Statutes made by the Governing Body of Queens' College, in the University of Cambridge, on the 5th day of May, 1932, have been submitted for the approval of His Majesty in Council, and notice of their having been so submitted is published in accordance with the provisions of "The Universities of Oxford and Cambridge Act, 1923."

STATUTES to alter and amend the Statutes of the Queen's College of St. Margaret and St. Bernard, commonly called Queens' College, in the University of Cambridge, which amending Statutes having been duly made at a General Meeting of the Governing Body of the said College, specially summoned for the purpose, and held on the fifth day of May, 1932 (notice of the proposed amending Statutes having been given to the University), and passed at such Meeting by the votes of not less than two-thirds of the number of persons present and voting, are now submitted for the approval of His Majesty the King in Council.

We, the President and Fellows of the Queen's College of St. Margaret and St. Bernard,

commonly called Queens' College, in the University of Cambridge, do hereby in pursuance of the power given to us by the 7th Section of the Universities of Oxford and Cambridge Act, 1923, alter and amend the Statutes made under that Act in relation to our said College in manner following, that is to say:—

CHAPTER 11.

Of the Vice-President.

By deleting in this Chapter the words "or until the resignation or death of the President who appointed him.", and substituting therefor the following words "or, in the event of the resignation, removal or death of the President who appointed him, until the election of the new President."

CHAPTER 19.

Of the Scholarship Fund, Scholarships and Exhibitions, Scholars and Exhibitioners.

By deleting in Paragraph 2 of this Chapter the words "by open examination held by the College acting either singly or as a member of a group of Colleges.", and substituting therefor the following words "by the College, acting either singly or as a member of a group

of Colleges, either by open examination or after examination in the Higher Certificate Examinations of the recognised Examining Bodies."

By substituting in Paragraph 6 the sum of "£30" in place of the sum of "£20" as a room allowance.

CHAPTER 34.

Of the Preservation of Existing Interests and of Temporary Provisions.

By deleting Paragraph 4 of this Chapter.

The following are the Regulations to be observed:—

1. Peers, Bishops, His Majesty's Lieutenants of Counties, Deputy Lieutenants of Counties, Members of Parliament, Officials connected with the Houses of Parliament, Clergy of all Denominations, and all gentlemen other than those mentioned in the following Regulations, should communicate with the Comptroller, Lord Chamberlain's Office, St. James's Palace. No applications can be received from gentlemen in the foregoing categories wishing to be presented. Their names must be forwarded by the gentleman making the presentation.

2. All gentlemen referred to in the following Regulations, wishing to attend or be presented at a Levée, should make a written application as directed below.

3. All Officers, whether on the active or retired lists of the Royal Navy, Royal Marines, Royal Naval Reserve and Royal Naval Volunteer Reserve, will communicate with and obtain their cards, whether for attendance or presentation, from the Private Secretary to the First Lord of the Admiralty.

4. All Officers on the active, retired, and reserve lists of the Regular Army and Territorial Army, except Officers of the Household Cavalry and the Brigade of Guards, and

except Officers of the Indian Services and Indian Army and Colonial Service and Colonial Forces, will communicate with and obtain their cards, whether for attendance or presentation, from the Under-Secretary of State, War Office.

All Officers on the active, retired and reserve lists of the Household Cavalry and the Brigade of Guards will communicate, through their Regimental Headquarters, with the Comptroller, Lord Chamberlain's Office, St. James's Palace, to obtain their cards for attendance or presentation.

5. All Officers on the active list of the Royal Air Force and Officers of the Special Reserve and Auxiliary Air Force will obtain their cards, for attendance or presentation, through the usual channels. Officers of the Reserve of Air Force Officers and Officers on the retired list of the Royal Air Force will communicate with and obtain their cards, whether for attendance or presentation, from the Secretary, Air Ministry, Kingsway, W.C.2.

6. All Officers of His Majesty's Civil Service will communicate with and obtain their cards for attendance or presentation from the Department under which they serve.

7. All Officers of the Indian Services and of the Indian Army, whether on the active or retired lists, will communicate with and obtain their cards, for attendance or for presentation, from the Political A.D.C. to the Secretary of State at the India Office, Whitehall.

8. All Officers of the Colonial Service and Colonial Forces, whether on the active or retired lists, will communicate with and obtain their cards, whether for attendance or presentation, from the Ceremonial and Reception Secretary, Colonial Office, Whitehall, with the exception of Officers of the local Forces of the self-governing Dominions, who will apply to the Under-Secretary of State, the War Office, for their cards for attendance or for presentation, supporting their application in all cases by a credential from the Governor-General, Governor, Officer commanding the local Forces, or the representative in London of the Dominion concerned.

9. Gentlemen connected with the Treasury, the Foreign Office, and other Government Departments will make their applications, whether for attendance or for presentation, through the Private Secretaries to the Ministers of the respective Departments.

10. Lord Mayors and Mayors, High Sheriffs, Sheriffs, Recorders, Chairmen of Quarter Sessions, Metropolitan Police Magistrates and other Stipendiary Magistrates, and gentlemen connected with the Home Office, will make their applications, whether for attendance or for presentation, through the Ceremonial and Reception Secretary, Home Office.

11. Lord Provosts and Provosts and Conveners of County Councils will make their applications for attendance or for presentation through the Private Secretary to the Secretary of State for Scotland, at the Scottish Office, Whitehall.

Scottish Judges, Law Officers, King's Counsel and Legal Officials in Scotland should make their applications through the Legal Secretary to the Lord Advocate.

12. Chairmen of County Councils, and gentlemen connected with the Ministry of Health, will similarly make their applications through the Private Secretary to the Minister of Health.

13. Judges, Law Officers, King's Counsel, and all Legal Officials holding appointments under the Crown, other than those already mentioned, will similarly make their applications through the Private Secretary to the Lord Chancellor.

14. The names both for attendance and presentation must be received at the various Offices above indicated as soon as possible, and in any case not later than ten days prior to the date of the Levée.
