IN THE MATTER OF THE LONDON TRAFFIC ACT, 1924.

Notice is hereby given under the Rules Publication Act, 1893, that it is proposed by the Minister of Transport after the expiration of at least forty days from this date, in pursuance of the powers conferred upon him by Section 7 of the aforesaid London Traffic Act, to make Regulations amending the London Traffic (Restricted Streets) Regulations.

And notice is hereby further given that on account of urgency the Minister of Transport has under Section 2 of the Rules Publication Act, 1893, made the London Traffic (Restricted Streets) Amendment (Route No. 506A) Provisional Regulations, 1932, to come into operation forthwith as Provisional Regulations to continue in force until Regulations have been made in accordance with the provisions of Section 1 of that Act.

These Regulations provide for the operation of an additional omnibus journey on Route No. 506A (Uxbridge and Harmondsworth).

ORDER OF THE MINISTER OF AGRICULTURE AND FISHERIES.

FOOT-AND-MOUTH DISEASE (INFECTED AREAS) ORDER OF 1932 (No. 6).

The Minister of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in him under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1927, and of every other power enabling him in this behalf, hereby orders as follows:— Further contraction of the Kent Foot-and-

Further contraction of the Kent Foot-and-Mouth Disease Infected Area.

1. The Foot-and-Mouth Disease (Infected Areas) Order of 1932 (No. 3) as amended by the Foot-and-Mouth Disease (Infected Areas) Orders of 1932 (Nos. 4 and 5) shall be read and have effect as if the Area described in the Schedule to this Order were substituted for the Infected Area described in the Schedule to the Foot-and-Mouth Disease (Infected Areas) Order of 1932 (No. 5). Short Title and Commencement.

2. This Order may be cited as the FOOT-AND-MOUTH DISEASE (INFECTED AREAS) ORDER OF 1932 (No. 6) and shall come into operation on the twenty-fourth day of May, nineteen hundred and thirty-two.

SCHEDULE.

An Area comprising :---

In the county of Kent.

The parishes of Dymchurch, Burmarsh, Eastbridge, Blackmanstone and Ogarswick; and so much of the borough of Hythe, and of the parishes of Saltwood, Lympne, Aldington, Hurst, Bonnington, Bilsington, Newchurch, St. Mary's in the Marsh and Hope All Saints (including any detached parts of the said parishes) as lies within the following boundary, namely:—

Commencing at the sea at a point opposite Stade Street, Hythe, thence due north along that street to High Street, Hythe, via Bank Street; thence in a generally westerly direc-tion along High Street, Military Road, and Ashford Road as far as Pedlinge Court; thence due south along the road to its junction with the road that runs to Lympne and Ham Street; thence westerly along the Lympne-Ham Street road via Lympne, Court-at-Street, Bonnington Cross to Bilsington cross roads; thence due south along the Newchurch road to a point immediately south of Peartree Farm; thence in a southerly direction along Will's Farm Lane to its junction with the Ivychurch-Newchurch Road; thence easterly along the Ivychurch-Newchurch road for a short distance to Brookers Farm; thence due south along Norwood Road to St. Mary's-Ivychurch Road via Popton Bridge; thence easterly along St. Mary's Road to the school; thence in an easterly and southerly direction to Winford Bridge on New Romney road via Old Honeychild and Slinches; thence following the new sewer in an easterly direction to the sea and thence along the line of Low Water Mark to the point of commencement.
