A PROCLAMATION REVOKING, SO FAR AS IT RELATES TO BASUTOLAND, THE PROCLAMATION OF 23RD JANUARY, 1911, APPLYING PARTS OF THE COINAGE ACT, 1870, TO THE UNION OF SOUTH AFRICA AND BASUTOLAND.

WHEREAS by virtue of a Proclamation of His Majesty dated the 23rd day of January, 1911 (hereinafter called "the Proclamation"), certain parts of the Coinage Act, 1870, as amended by section two and the schedule of the Coinage Act, 1891, were applied, with the modifications specified in the Proclamation to the Union of South Africa and Basutoland:

And whereas by virtue of the Coinage Act, 1870, it is lawful for Us, with the advice of Our Privy Council, by Proclamation to revoke any Proclamation previously made under that Act:

And whereas under an Order of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria in Council, dated the 2nd day of February, 1884, the High Commissioner for South Africa (hereinafter called "the High Commissioner") is empowered to make by Proclamation such laws as may appear to him necessary for the peace, order, and good government of Basutoland:

And whereas it is expedient that the High Commissioner should be empowered to make further provision by Proclamation respecting the currency of Basutoland, and that, in the event of such further provision being so made, the Proclamation should be revoked so far as it applies to Basutoland:

Now, therefore, We, with the advice of Our Privy Council in pursuance of the said Act and of all other powers enabling Us in that behalf, do hereby proclaim, direct, and ordain, as follows:—

1. The Proclamation shall, as from the date of the commencement of any Proclamation by the High Commissioner making further provision as to the currency of Basutoland, be revoked so far as relates to Basutoland, and accordingly the said Act shall as from that date cease to apply to and to be in force in Basutoland.

2. This Proclamation may be cited as the Basutoland (Coinage) Proclamation, 1932.

Given at Our Court at *Buckingham Palace* this tenth day of *June*, in the year of our Lord One thousand nine hundred and thirty-two, and in the twenty-third year of Our Reign.

AMENDING REGULATIONS REFERRED TO IN THE FOREGOING ORDER.

Short title commencement and extent.

1.—(1) These regulations may be cited as the County Stock Regulations 1932 and the County Stock Regulations 1891 to 1921 and these regulations may be cited together as the County Stock Regulations 1891 to 1932.

(2) These regulations shall come into operation on the day on which they are confirmed by His Majesty by Order in Council and shall extend to any stock to which the County Stock Regulations 1891 to 1921 apply or may be applied which is issued after that day by a county council as defined in these regulations.

(3) These regulations shall apply only to England and Wales.

Interpretation.

2.—(1) The Interpretation Act 1889 applies to the interpretation of these regulations as that Act applies to the interpretation of an Act of Parliament.

(2) In these regulations unless the context otherwise requires—

“county council” means the council of any county by whom the powers conferred by the County Stock Regulations 1891 to 1921 are exercised and does not include the London County Council;

“registrar” means the registrar of the stock appointed by the county council under regulation 18 of the County Stock Regulations 1891.

Transfer to bankers of local authority of proceeds of public issue of stock.

3.—(1) Where stock is offered by or on behalf of a county council to the public for subscription any person by whom moneys which represent subscriptions to the stock are received shall within the period mentioned in this regulation transfer the moneys so subscribed to the ordinary bankers of the county council for credit to a special account to be opened by the county council bearing their name and the name of the stock:

Provided that where the county council are entitled to a part only of the moneys so subscribed the transfer required by the foregoing provisions shall extend only to the part of those moneys to which the county council are entitled.

(2) Moneys paid in advance of allotment which by this regulation are required to be transferred to the ordinary bankers of the county council shall be so transferred within three days after the date of the allotment and any other moneys which by this regulation are required to be transferred to the ordinary bankers of the county council if they are paid by cheque or other instrument shall be so transferred within twenty-four hours after the collection of the proceeds and if they are paid in cash shall be so transferred within twenty-four hours after the receipt of the cash.

(3) No payment shall be debited to a special account opened in pursuance of this regulation unless it is authorised by an order of the county council authenticated in the manner prescribed by subsection (1) of section 80 of the Local Government Act, 1888.

Provisions to be included in contracts or agreements for the purchase of the whole of an issue of stock.

4. Any contract or agreement made by a county council with a banking or other company or person whereby that company or person undertakes to purchase the whole of an issue of stock of the county council (such company or person in this regulation being called “the purchaser”) shall provide—

(a) that no allotment letter or scrip certificate shall be in such a form as to create a contractual relation between the purchaser and the holder of the document instead of between the county council and the holder of the document;

(b) that before any allotment letter or scrip certificate is issued by or on behalf of the county council the purchaser shall have

paid to the ordinary bankers of the county council for credit to such a special banking account as is required by the preceding regulation all sums which may be due from the purchaser in respect of the amount certified in the allotment letter or scrip certificate to have been paid by the holder of that document.

Supply of information to registrar.

5.—(1) The banking or other company or person by whom any stock of a county council has been offered to the public for subscription or by whom the whole of an issue of such stock has been purchased shall (if the company or person is not the registrar) cause the registrar to be supplied—

(a) as early as practicable with a complete record of the scrip certificates issued by them showing in each case the number and other identification mark of the certificate the amount of stock to which it relates and a description of the manner in which the scrip certificate is authenticated; and

(b) immediately after payment has been made in full for the stock to which the scrip certificate relates with a statement of the date on which payment was so made.

(2) Where the arrangements for the issue of the stock do not provide for the issue of scrip certificates this regulation shall be read as if allotment letters were substituted therein for scrip certificates.

Documents to be furnished before stock registered or inscribed.

6.—(1) A registrar shall not register or inscribe any person as a holder of stock unless and until a fully paid scrip certificate or scrip certificates representing the amount of stock to which that person is entitled shall have been surrendered by him or on his behalf to the registrar:

Provided that if a scrip certificate is lost or destroyed the registrar may register or inscribe the person claiming to be entitled thereunder as a holder of stock to the amount represented by the scrip certificate on that person giving such an indemnity as the county council may agree to accept against the claims of all other persons deriving title under the scrip certificate so lost or destroyed but no such registration or inscription shall be made by the registrar until the first day on which scrip certificates may be lodged for registration or inscription.

(2) Where the arrangements for the issue of the stock do not provide for the issue of scrip certificates this regulation shall apply as if fully paid allotment letters were mentioned therein instead of scrip certificates.

(3) This regulation shall not apply where the county council themselves issue the allotment letters and scrip certificates and an officer of the council is the registrar of the stock.

AMENDING REGULATIONS REFERRED TO IN THE FOREGOING ORDER.

Short title commencement and extent.

1.—(1) These regulations may be cited as the Stock Regulations 1932 and the Stock Regulations 1891 to 1921 and these regulations may be cited together as the Stock Regulations 1891 to 1932.

(2) These regulations shall come into operation on the day on which they are confirmed by His Majesty by Order in Council and shall extend to any stock to which the Stock Regulations 1891 to 1921 apply or may be applied which is issued after that day by a local authority as defined in these regulations.

(3) These regulations shall apply only to England and Wales.

Interpretation.

2.—(1) The Interpretation Act 1889 applies to the interpretation of these regulations as that Act applies to the interpretation of an Act of Parliament.

(2) In these regulations unless the context otherwise requires—

“local authority” means the council of any borough or urban district by whom the powers conferred by the Stock Regulations 1891 to 1921 are exercised and any joint board by whom the powers so conferred are exercised;

“registrar” means the registrar of the stock appointed by the local authority under regulation 24 of the Stock Regulations 1891.

Transfer to bankers of local authority of proceeds of public issue of stock.

3.—(1) Where stock is offered by or on behalf of a local authority to the public for subscription any person by whom moneys which represent subscriptions to the stock are received shall within the period mentioned in this regulation transfer the moneys so subscribed to the ordinary bankers of the local authority for credit to a special account to be opened by the local authority bearing their name and the name of the stock:

Provided that where the local authority are entitled to a part only of the moneys so subscribed the transfer required by the foregoing provision shall extend only to the part of those moneys to which the local authority are entitled.

(2) Moneys paid in advance of allotment which by this regulation are required to be transferred to the ordinary bankers of the local authority shall be so transferred within three days after the date of the allotment and any other moneys which by this regulation are required to be transferred to the ordinary bankers of the local authority if they are paid by cheque or other instrument shall be so transferred within twenty-four hours after the collection of the proceeds and if they are paid in cash shall be so transferred within twenty-four hours after the receipt of the cash.

(3) The local authority shall not allow a special account opened in pursuance of this regulation to be drawn upon by any person who is not a person authorised to draw upon an ordinary banking account of the local authority.

Provisions to be included in contracts or agreements for the purchase of the whole of an issue of stock.

4. Any contract or agreement made by a local authority with a banking or other company or person whereby that company or person undertakes to purchase the whole of an issue of stock of the local authority (such company or person in this regulation being called "the purchaser") shall provide—

(a) that no allotment letter or scrip certificate shall be in such a form as to create a contractual relation between the purchaser and the holder of the document instead of between the local authority and the holder of the document;

(b) that before any allotment letter or scrip certificate is issued by or on behalf of the local authority the purchaser shall have paid to the ordinary bankers of the local authority for credit to such a special banking account as is required by the preceding regulation all sums which may be due from the purchaser in respect of the amount certified in the allotment letter or scrip certificate to have been paid by the holder of that document.

Supply of information to registrar.

5.—(1) The banking or other company or person by whom any stock of a local authority has been offered to the public for subscription or by whom the whole of an issue of such stock has been purchased shall (if the company or person is not the registrar) cause the registrar to be supplied—

(a) as early as practicable with a complete record of the scrip certificates issued showing in each case the number and other identification mark of the certificate the amount of stock to which it relates and a description of the manner in which the scrip certificate is authenticated; and

(b) immediately after payment has been made in full for the stock to which the scrip certificate relates with a statement of the date on which payment was so made.

(2) Where the arrangements for the issue of the stock do not provide for the issue of scrip

certificates this regulation shall be read as if allotment letters were substituted therein for scrip certificates.

Documents to be furnished before stock registered or inscribed.

Provided that if a scrip certificate is lost or destroyed the registrar may register or inscribe the person claiming to be entitled thereunder as a holder of stock to the amount represented by the scrip certificate on that person giving such an indemnity as the local authority may agree to accept against the claims of all other persons deriving title under the scrip certificate so lost or destroyed but no such registration or inscription shall be made by the registrar until after the first day on which scrip certificates may be lodged for registration or inscription.

(2) Where the arrangements for the issue of the stock do not provide for the issue of scrip certificates this regulation shall apply as if fully paid allotment letters were mentioned therein instead of scrip certificates.

(3) This regulation shall not apply where the local authority themselves issue the allotment letters and scrip certificates and an officer of the local authority is the registrar of the stock.

And whereas it appears to His Majesty that Acetyldihydrocodeinone and its salts and any preparation, admixture, extract or other substance containing any proportion of Acetyldihydrocodeinone are productive, if improperly used, of ill effects substantially of the same character or nature as or analogous to those produced by morphine or cocaine:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, in pursuance of the powers conferred upon Him by Section 8 (2) of the Dangerous Drugs Act, 1920, is pleased by and with the advice of His Privy

Council, to declare and it is hereby declared, that Part III of the Dangerous Drugs Act, 1920, shall henceforth apply to Acetyldihydrocodeinone and its salts and any preparation, admixture, extract or other substance containing any proportion of Acetyldihydrocodeinone.

WHEREAS by Section 659 of the Merchant Shipping Act, 1894 (which is a Section in Part XI of that Act) it is (among other things) enacted that His Majesty may, by Order in Council, fix the establishments to be maintained by each of the General Lighthouse Authorities, on account of the services of lighthouses, buoys and beacons, or the annual or other sums to be paid out of the Mercantile Marine Fund in respect of these establishments, and that an increase of any establishment or part of an establishment so fixed shall not be made without the consent of the Board of Trade:

And whereas by Section 1 of the Merchant Shipping (Mercantile Marine Fund) Act, 1898, it is (among other things) provided that references in Part XI of the Merchant Shipping Act, 1894, to the Mercantile Marine Fund shall be construed as references to the General Lighthouse Fund by the now reciting Act constituted:

And whereas by Order in Council made on the 14th day of December, 1922, in pursuance of the above recited powers, the clerical and engineering establishments which might be maintained by the Corporation of Trinity House of Deptford Strond (hereinafter referred to as "the Corporation") being one of the General Lighthouse Authorities referred to in the Merchant Shipping Act, 1894, and the amount of the salaries to be paid to the officers of the said establishments were duly fixed:

And whereas by the Trinity House (Increase of Establishment) Order, 1930, the Clerical Establishment of the Corporation was varied and increased in manner therein appearing:

And whereas it is expedient that the engineering establishment of the Corporation should be increased in manner hereinafter appearing:

And whereas it has been made to appear to His Majesty that the Board of Trade have consented to such increase:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by virtue of the power vested in Him by the Merchant Shipping Act, 1894, and of any other powers Him thereunto enabling, and by and with the advice of His Privy Council, is pleased to order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:—

1. This Order may be cited as the Trinity House (Increase of Establishment) Order, 1932.

2. In addition to the posts specified in the second Schedule to the before-mentioned Order in Council of 14th December, 1922, as varied and increased by the Trinity House (Increase of Establishment) Order, 1930, there shall, as

from the 20th April, 1931, be included in the engineering establishment of the Corporation a post of Inspector of Shipping on a scale of salary of £150 per annum, rising by annual increments of £10 to a maximum of £250 per annum.

3. The salary payable under the provisions of this Order shall be paid out of the General Lighthouse Fund.

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of the Act of the 5th and 6th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 108, and of the Act of the 21st and 22nd years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 57, which Acts are known as 'The Ecclesiastical Leasing Acts,' have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council, the following Scheme relating to the Benefice of Yardley, in the County of Worcester and in the Diocese of Birmingham:

"Whereas the annual value of the said Benefice of Yardley has been improved by means of certain sales of glebe lands belonging to the said Benefice, which sales were carried out under the authority of the said Acts with the concurrence of us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, by former Incumbents and by the present Incumbent of the said Benefice of Yardley:

"And whereas the proceeds of the said sales have been paid to us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, and have been invested in accordance with the provisions in that behalf contained in the said Acts and in respect of such investments there is standing in the name of us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, a sum of £25,205 8s. 2d. Local Loans £3 per centum per annum Stock, which said sum of Stock is now held by us in trust to pay the Vicar or Incumbent for the time being of the said Benefice the annual interest or dividends from time to time arising or accruing therefrom or thereupon, but subject nevertheless to the provisions contained in the said Acts with respect to making a certain portion of the improved value arising to the said Benefice from the said sales payable to us for the benefit of our Common Fund to be applied as in the Acts mentioned:

"And whereas the improvement in the annual value of the said Benefice arising from or by means of the said sales exceeds the annual sum of £150 and after the appropriation

hereinafter recommended to us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, for the benefit of our Common Fund, the average annual income of the said Benefice will still be considerably in excess of £600:

"And whereas the Reverend Edmund Lewis Cochrane, an Honorary Canon of the Cathedral Church of Birmingham, is the present Incumbent of the said Benefice of Yardley:

"Now, therefore, we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, humbly recommend and propose that as from the day on which the said Benefice shall from whatsoever cause next become vacant the interest or dividends arising in respect of a sum of £5,000 Os. 0d. Local Loans £3 per centum per annum Stock forming part of the aforesaid sum of £25,205 8s. 2d. Local Loans £3 per centum per annum Stock, or in respect of any securities or investments from time to time representing the said sum of £5,000 Os. 0d. Local Loans £3 per centum per annum Stock shall cease to be held by us for the benefit of the Vicar or Incumbent of the said Benefice of Yardley and shall be held by us for the benefit of our Common Fund to be applied as in the said Acts mentioned.

"And we further recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them, in accordance with the provisions of the said Acts or of either of them, or of any other Act of Parliament."

And whereas the Notice of the foregoing Scheme, which is required by the hereinbefore mentioned Acts, has been given by the said Commissioners to the Patrons of the said Benefice of Yardley and the said Patrons have not made any objection to the said Scheme:

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said Scheme, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts.

And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of Birmingham.

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Act of the 3rd and 4th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 113, of the Act of the 6th and 7th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 37, and of the Act of the 19th and 20th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 104, duly prepared, and laid before His Majesty in Council, a Scheme, bearing

date the 14th day of April, 1932, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of the Act of the 3rd and 4th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 113, of the Act of the 6th and 7th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 37, and of the Act of the 19th and 20th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 104, have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council, the following Scheme for constituting a separate District for spiritual purposes to be taken partly out of the Parish of Saint Peter in Eastgate, Lincoln, and partly out of the Parish of Saint Margaret in the Close, Lincoln, both in the County of Lincoln and in the Diocese of Lincoln:

"Whereas we are satisfied that the said Parish of Saint Peter in Eastgate, Lincoln, and the said Parish of Saint Margaret in the Close, Lincoln, are Cures wherein or in parts whereof the provision for public worship and for pastoral superintendence is insufficient for the spiritual wants of the inhabitants thereof and it has been made to appear to us that it would promote the interests of religion that the particular portions of the said Parish of Saint Peter in Eastgate, Lincoln, and of the said Parish of Saint Margaret in the Close, Lincoln, which are hereinafter mentioned and described should be constituted a separate District in the manner which is hereinafter set forth:

"And whereas there is not at present within the limits of the said proposed separate District any consecrated Church or Chapel in use for the purposes of Divine worship:

"And whereas we have agreed to make and pay out of the Common Fund created by the firstly herein mentioned Act a grant of £200 per annum to the Minister of the said proposed separate District so soon as a Minister shall have been duly licensed in accordance with the provisions of the secondly herein mentioned Act and to his successors:

"And whereas the said grant of the said yearly sum of £200 will, after the publication in the London Gazette of an Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme, be made and secured by an Instrument to be executed by us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, under our Common Seal, in accordance with the provisions of the Act of the 29th and 30th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 111:

"And whereas a plot of land situate within the said proposed separate District has been conveyed to us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, as the site for a permanent Church for such District and a sum of £1,450 towards the cost of erecting such permanent Church has been partly paid and partly guaranteed to our satisfaction:

"And whereas the said plot of land has been conveyed and the said sum of £1,450 has been contributed as aforesaid upon the understanding and condition that (such arrangement appearing to us to be expedient) the whole right of Patronage of the said proposed District, and, when such District shall have become a New Parish, then of the said New Parish, and the nomination of the Minister or Incumbent thereof should be assigned in the manner which is hereinafter set forth:

or on so much thereof as shall from time to time remain unpaid. "We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, acting in pursuance of the Union of Benefices Measure, 1923, have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council, the following Scheme for effecting the union of the Benefice (being a Vicarage) of Carlisle, Christ Church, and the Benefice (being a Vicarage) of Carlisle, Saint Aidan, both of which Benefices are situate in the County of Cumberland and in the Diocese of Carlisle:

"Whereas Commissioners appointed at our request by the Right Reverend Herbert, Bishop of Carlisle, pursuant to the provisions of the said Union of Benefices Measure, 1923, to inquire into and report upon the union of the said two Benefices of Carlisle, Christ Church, and Carlisle, Saint Aidan, duly made their Report to the said Bishop of Carlisle and therein recommended the union of the said two Benefices and the terms for effecting the union, and the said Bishop of Carlisle signified in writing his approval of the said Report:

"And whereas we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, have prepared this Scheme for the union of the said two Benefices based upon the terms recommended in the said Report:

"And whereas the said Benefice of Carlisle, Christ Church, is now full, the Reverend Marmaduke Haddon Banister being the present Incumbent thereof and the said Benefice of Carlisle, Saint Aidan, is at present vacant:

"Now, therefore, we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, with the consent of the said Herbert, Bishop of Carlisle (in testimony whereof he has signed this Scheme), and with the consent of the said Marmaduke Haddon Banister (testified by his signing this Scheme), do humbly recommend and propose to Your Majesty as follows, that is to say:—

That upon the said union taking effect the Parsonage House at present belonging to the said Benefice of Carlisle, Saint Aidan, shall become and be the house of residence for the Incumbent of the United Benefice and so soon as conveniently may be the Parsonage House at present belonging to the said Benefice of Carlisle, Christ Church, and the site and appurtenances thereof and the grounds heretofore usually occupied and enjoyed therewith shall be sold and disposed of by us the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners at such time or times and in such manner in all respects as to us shall seem expedient and that the net proceeds of such sale shall constitute and form part of the Expenses Fund established pursuant to the 32nd Section of the said Union of Benefices Measure, 1923.

That a Curate be appointed to assist the Incumbent in performing the duties of the United Benefice and that the stipend to be assigned to the Curate out of the revenues of the United Benefice shall be of such amount not exceeding £200 per annum as the Bishop may from time to time determine, this recommendation and proposal being made to the intent that the Bishop shall have the power of requiring the appointment of a Curate in accordance with and subject to the conditions and provisions of Subsection (b) of Section 18 of the said Union of Benefices Measure, 1923.

"7. And whereas the said Scheme has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to affirm the said Scheme and to order that the Benefices therein recommended to be united shall be united to the extent and for the purposes recommended in the said Scheme, and further to order and direct that the said Scheme and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the date when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Measure.

STATUTE to alter and amend the Statutes of the College of the Holy and Undivided Trinity within the Town and University of Cambridge of King Henry the Eighth's Foundation, commonly called Trinity College, in the University of Cambridge, which amending Statute having been duly made at a General Meeting of the Governing Body of the said College, specially summoned for the purpose, and held on the 21st day of May, 1932 (notice of the proposed amending Statute having been given to the University) and passed at such Meeting by the votes of not less than two-thirds of the number of persons present and voting, is now submitted for the approval of His Majesty The King in Council.

WE, The Master, Fellows and Scholars of the College of the Holy and Undivided Trinity within the Town and University of Cambridge of King Henry the Eighth's Foundation, commonly called Trinity College, in the University of Cambridge, do hereby, in pursuance of the power given to us by the 7th Section of the Universities of Oxford and Cambridge Act, 1923, alter and amend the Statutes made under that Act in relation to our said College in manner following, that is to say:—

Any moneys (not being capital moneys arising under the Universities and College Estates Acts) which are held by the College for the general purposes of the College and not on specific trusts, and of which the investment is not governed by any clause in the will, deed of gift, or other instrument, under which the College became possessed of the same, or by any other provision of these Statutes, may at the discretion of the Council be applied to any purpose to which capital moneys arising under the Universities and College Estates Acts may be applied.

2. Such moneys may also at the discretion of the Council be invested in any of the following ways, that is to say:—

(a) in or upon any stocks, funds or securities for the time being authorised by law for the investment of trust funds in any part of the United Kingdom, or

(b) in or upon the public stocks or funds or Government securities (including Provincial securities) of any British Dominion, Colony or Dependency, or

(c) in or upon the stocks, funds, debentures or securities of any public municipal or local body or authority in the United Kingdom or India or any British Dominion, Colony or Dependency, or

(d) in or upon the public stocks or funds or securities of such foreign Governments, provinces, departments, and municipalities as the Council may from time to time approve for this purpose, or

(e) in or upon the bonds, debentures, debenture or rentcharge stock or other obligations of any Railway Company in the United Kingdom or India or any British Dominion, Colony or Dependency or any foreign country, or

(f) in or upon the bonds, debentures or debenture or rentcharge stock or mortgages of any canal, dock, harbour, gas, water, electric supply or other company incorporated by special Act of the Imperial Parliament or of the legislature of any British Dominion, Colony or Dependency or of India or by Royal Charter, or

4. Provided also that the following conditions shall govern the purchase and custody of any securities to bearer or securities transferable by mere delivery or by delivery and endorsement, namely,

(a) payment for any such securities purchased shall be made only upon their delivery to a bank or banks approved by the Council, and

(b) the Council shall from time to time prescribe instructions to be given to such bank or banks which shall ensure that no order for the sale or removal of any of the securities from their custody shall be carried out save under a mandate signed by at least three members of the Council, and

(c) on the occasion of the purchase of any such securities the Senior Bursar shall produce to the Council a receipt signed by an officer of the bank having custody thereof acknowledging that the securities are held by the bank upon the instructions aforementioned.”
