#### LAND DRAINAGE ACT, 1930.

##### NOTICE OF THE MAKING OF AN ORDER BY THE MINISTER OF AGRICULTURE AND FISHERIES.

Notice is hereby given that the Minister of Agriculture and Fisheries has settled and made an Order under the Land Drainage Act, 1930, confirming a scheme submitted to him by the River Stour (Essex and Suffolk) Catchment Board under Section 4 (1) (a) of the Act, for the transfer to the Catchment Board of all rights, powers, duties, obligations and liabilities over or in connection with the main river as were immediately before the commencement of the said Act vested in or to be discharged by any drainage authority, and of any property held by the authority for the purpose of, or in connection with, any functions so transferred.

A copy of the Order may be seen at all reasonable hours at the office of the Clerk of the Catchment Board, J. O. Steed, Esq., 6, Gainsborough Street, Sudbury, Suffolk, and also at the Offices of the Ministry of Agriculture and Fisheries, 10, Whitehall Place, London, S.W.1.

By Part III of the Second Schedule to the said Act, it is provided that if any person aggrieved by an Order desires to question its validity on the ground that it is not within the powers of the Act, or that any requirement of the Act has not been complied with, he may, within six weeks after the publication of this notice, make an application for the purpose to the High Court, and if any such application is duly made, the Court, if satisfied that the Order is not within the powers of the Act, or that the interests of the applicant have been substantially prejudiced by any requirements of the Act not having been complied with, may quash the Order either generally or in so far as it affects the applicant.

##### *River Kent Catchment Area.*

The Minister of Agriculture and Fisheries hereby gives notice that the River Kent Catchment Board have made application under subsection (3) of section 5 of the Land Drainage

##### NORFOLK RIVERS CATCHMENT BOARD. CLEY AND WIVETON INTERNAL DRAINAGE DISTRICT.

Notice is hereby given that the Minister of Agriculture and Fisheries has settled and made an Order under the Land Drainage Act, 1930, confirming a scheme submitted to him by the North Norfolk Rivers Catchment Board under Section 4 (1) (b) of the Act, making provision for the alteration of the boundaries of the Cley and Wiveton Internal Drainage District, the re-constitution of the Internal Drainage Board for the District, and for certain matters supplemental thereto: and that the Order will become final and have effect as an Act of Parliament, unless within thirty days from the date of this notice a memorial that the Order shall not become law without confirmation by Parliament is presented to the Minister by some person or body affected by the Order, and having an interest sufficient for the presentation of a memorial.
