The following Statutes made by the Governing Body of Downing College, in the University of Cambridge, on the 8th day of July, 1932, have been submitted for the approval of His Majesty in Council, and notice of their having been so submitted is published in accordance with the provisions of "The Universities of Oxford and Cambridge Act, 1923."

DOWNING COLLEGE IN THE UNIVERSITY OF CAMBRIDGE.

Statutes to alter and amend the Statutes in relation to Downing College in the University of Cambridge made under "The Universities of Oxford and Cambridge Act, 1923" (13 and 14 George V, Chapter 33).

We, The Master, Fellows, and Scholars of Downing College in the University of Cambridge, in pursuance of the power given to us by the 7th Section of the Universities of Oxford and Cambridge Act, 1923, do hereby alter and amend the Statutes made under that Act in relation to our said College in manner following, that is to say:—

STATUTE V.

OF THE MASTER.

By repealing the second paragraph of Statute V which commences "The Master",

and substituting therefor the following paragraphs:—

"The Master shall be the person who, having attained the age of thirty years, is in the judgment of the Fellows best qualified to preside over the College as a place of education, religion, learning and research.

"The Master shall receive a fixed salary of five hundred pounds a year in addition to such moduli as he may be entitled to under Statute XXVIII."

By repealing in that paragraph of Statute V which commences "He shall be elected" the words "such day to be not less than three nor more than six weeks from the vacancy", and substituting therefor the words "such day to be not less than one calendar month nor more than six calendar months from the occurrence of the vacancy."

By repealing in the second line of that paragraph of Statute V which commences "In case a Master" the words "from the vacancy", and substituting therefor the words "from the occurrence of the vacancy."

STATUTE XII.

OF THE DISCIPLINE OF THE COLLEGE.

By inserting after the word "Discipline" in the title of Statute XII the words "and Good Government."

By adding at the end of Statute XII the following paragraph:—

"The Members of the Governing Body in residence shall have power to remove from

the College temporarily or finally a member of the College *in statu pupillari* if in their opinion he proves by reason of failure in examination to be an unsatisfactory student."

STATUTE XXIII.

OF LODGES AND ROOMS.

By repealing the first and second paragraphs of Statute XXIII and substituting therefor the two following paragraphs:—

"Every Fellow shall have the right to the use of at least one room in College, and the Governing Body shall assign to each Fellow such room or rooms as may from time to time be considered expedient in his particular case.

"The Lodge of the Master and the rooms of Fellows, as well as the rooms of such Officers and Scholars as the Governing Body shall from time to time determine, shall be enjoyed by them respectively free of rent, rates and taxes."

STATUTE XXVIII.

OF THE CORPORATE INCOME.

By inserting after the word "Members" in the seventh line of the first paragraph of Statute XXVIII the words "the fixed salary of the Master."

By repealing in Statute XXVIII the direction numbered (i) and commencing "The Master", and substituting therefor the following direction:—

"(i) The Master shall receive ten moduli, unless he be at the time of his election or shall thereafter become a University Professor, Reader, or any University Officer whose office qualifies him to hold a Professorial Fellowship, in which case he shall receive such number of moduli, being not less than five and not more than ten, as the Governing Body shall determine at the date of his election to the Mastership or to one of the aforesaid University offices as the case may be. But if, for grave cause to be approved by the five senior Members of the Governing Body excluding himself or the major part of them, he, being a Professor, Reader, or one of the other University Officers above mentioned, shall resign his Professorship, Readership, or other University office, or if he shall be retired from it on the ground of age, he shall receive ten moduli in place of the number of moduli previously determined in his case."

By inserting after the sub-paragraph numbered "4" in the provision of Statute XXVIII respecting surplus revenue the following sub-paragraph:—

"5. make to the Master a grant or grants for entertainment purposes;" and by re-numbering the existing sub-paragraphs "5" and "6" so as to read respectively "6" and "7".

STATUTE XXIX.

OF THE TUITION FUND AND THE CAUTION FUND.

By inserting after the first paragraph of Statute XXIX the following paragraph:—

"Any accumulation resulting from an excess of income of the Tuition Fund over expenditure may be retained in the Fund whether invested or not. The whole or any part of such accumulation or investments may be transferred at any time by the

Governing Body to the Capital or Income of the College."

STATUTE XXXI.

OF LEASES AND OF THE COLLEGE SEAL.

By repealing the first paragraph of Statute XXXI.

By repealing at the end of the second paragraph of Statute XXXI the words "For other purposes besides the execution of leases and conveyances, or any application to The King in Council, the College Seal may be used at a meeting of the Members of the Governing Body in residence", and substituting therefor the words:—

"The Seal shall not be affixed to any writing or document except in pursuance of a resolution passed at a meeting of the Governing Body with the concurrence of the votes of a majority of the members present. If not affixed during the meeting the Seal shall be affixed in the presence of two or more members of the Governing Body who were present at the meeting at which the resolution for affixing the Seal was passed."

TEMPORARY STATUTES.

By adding after Statute E the following Statute entitled F, to read as follows:—

"Notwithstanding the provisions contained in the aforementioned direction (i) of Statute XXVIII, the person who was Master on the eighth day of July, one thousand nine hundred and thirty-two, shall receive (in addition to the fixed salary of five hundred pounds hereinbefore mentioned) such number of moduli, being not less than five nor more than ten, as the Governing Body shall determine at their meeting next after these Statutes shall have received the approval of His Majesty in Council."

Given under our Common Seal this eighth day of July, One thousand nine hundred and thirty-two, in pursuance of a resolution passed at a general meeting of the Governing Body of the College held on the day aforesaid specially summoned for the purpose by the votes of not less than two-thirds of the number of persons present and voting.

And whereas the aforesaid expression "receipts and expenditure in respect of railway working" is defined by section 5 (2) of the Act to mean such receipts and expenditure of a railway company as are required by or under any statute to be shown under that heading in the accounts of the company;

And whereas, for the purposes of the first valuations to be made in pursuance of the Act, the average net receipts which the Joint Authority are required to ascertain are the average net receipts for the accounting years 1928 and 1929;
