The following Statutes made by the Governing Body of Downing College, in the University of Cambridge, on the 8th day of July, 1932, have been submitted for the approval of His Majesty in Council, and notice of their having been so submitted is published in accordance with the provisions of "The Universities of Oxford and Cambridge Act, 1923."

DOWNING COLLEGE IN THE UNIVERSITY OF CAMBRIDGE.

Statutes to alter and amend the Statutes in relation to Downing College in the University of Cambridge made under "The Universities of Oxford and Cambridge Act, 1923" (13 and 14 George V, Chapter 33).

We, The Master, Fellows, and Scholars of Downing College in the University of Cambridge, in pursuance of the power given to us by the 7th Section of the Universities of Oxford and Cambridge Act, 1923, do hereby alter and amend the Statutes made under that Act in relation to our said College in manner following, that is to say:—

STATUTE V.

OF THE MASTER.

By repealing the second paragraph of Statute V which commences "The Master",

and substituting therefor the following paragraphs:—

"The Master shall be the person who, having attained the age of thirty years, is in the judgment of the Fellows best qualified to preside over the College as a place of education, religion, learning and research.

"The Master shall receive a fixed salary of five hundred pounds a year in addition to such moduli as he may be entitled to under Statute XXVIII."

By repealing in that paragraph of Statute V which commences "He shall be elected" the words "such day to be not less than three nor more than six weeks from the vacancy", and substituting therefor the words "such day to be not less than one calendar month nor more than six calendar months from the occurrence of the vacancy."

By repealing in the second line of that paragraph of Statute V which commences "In case a Master" the words "from the vacancy", and substituting therefor the words "from the occurrence of the vacancy."

STATUTE XII.

OF THE DISCIPLINE OF THE COLLEGE.

By inserting after the word "Discipline" in the title of Statute XII the words "and Good Government."

By adding at the end of Statute XII the following paragraph:—

"The Members of the Governing Body in residence shall have power to remove from
