NORTHERN IRELAND LAND ACT, 1925.

EXPLOSIVES IN COAL MINES ORDER.

The Secretary for Mines gives notice that on the 14th July, 1932, the Board of Trade made an Order in pursuance of Section 61 of the Coal Mines Act, 1911, adding to the First Schedule to the Explosives in Coal Mines Order of the 1st September, 1913, the explosive Ammonite No. 1 P, manufactured by The Miners' Safety Explosive Company, Limited, and adding to the Second Schedule to that Order the explosive Lumpit (L.D.) manufactured by The Colliery Explosives Company, Limited.
