WHEREAS it is enacted by section 5 of the County Courts Act, 1903, that His Majesty may by Order in Council provide that actions in which the plaintiff claims a sum exceeding £50 by virtue of the said Act shall be tried in any Court where His Majesty is satisfied that due provision has been made for the trial of such actions without interference with the ordinary jurisdiction of the Court:

And whereas His Majesty is satisfied that due provision has been made in every County Court for the trial of such actions as aforesaid without interference with the ordinary jurisdiction of the Court:

Now, therefore, His Majesty is pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:—

1. Actions in which the plaintiff claims a sum exceeding £50 by virtue of the County Courts Act, 1903, shall be tried in the Court in which the action was commenced.

2. The following Orders shall be revoked:—

The County Courts Order in Council, 1924.

The County Courts (Extended Jurisdiction) Order in Council, 1927.

The County Courts (Extended Jurisdiction) Order in Council, 1928.

The County Courts (Extended Jurisdiction) Order in Council, 1930.

The County Courts (Extended Jurisdiction) Order in Council, 1931.

The County Courts (Extended Jurisdiction No. 2) Order in Council, 1931.

3. Nothing in this Order shall affect any power to transfer an action from one Court to another under any provision of the County Courts Act, 1888, or of the County Courts Act, 1919.

4. This Order may be cited as the County Courts (Extended Jurisdiction) Order in Council, 1932, and shall come into operation on the 1st day of November, 1932.

WHEREAS by Section 20 of the Finance Act, 1894, as modified by Article 14 of the Government of Ireland (Adaptation of the Taxing Acts) Order, 1922, and by Article 2 of

the Irish Free State (Consequential Adaptation of Enactments) Order, 1923, it is enacted that His Majesty The King may, by Order in Council, apply that section to any British Possession where His Majesty is satisfied that, by the Law of such Possession, either no duty is leviable in respect of property situate in Great Britain when passing on death, or that the Law of such Possession as respects any duty so leviable is to the like effect as the foregoing provisions of that Section:

And whereas His Majesty is satisfied that the Law of the Province of Quebec as respects the duty leviable in respect of property situate in Great Britain when passing on death is to the like effect as the provisions of sub-section (1) of the aforesaid Section 20 of the Finance Act, 1894:

And whereas it is expedient that Section 20 of the Finance Act, 1894, should be applied to the Province of Quebec:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by virtue and in exercise of the power by the aforesaid Act in His Majesty vested is pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council to order, and it is hereby ordered, that Section 20 of the Finance Act, 1894, shall apply to the Province of Quebec as from the date on which this Order is made.

And the Right Honourable James Henry Thomas, His Majesty's Principal Secretary of State for Dominion Affairs, is to give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Act of the 6th and 7th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 37, and of the Act of the 19th and 20th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 104, duly prepared, and laid before His Majesty in Council, a Scheme, bearing date the 14th day of July, 1932, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of the Act of the 6th and 7th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 37, and of the Act of the 19th and 20th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 104, have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council, the following Scheme for constituting a separate District for spiritual purposes to be taken partly out of the Parish (sometime District under the Parish of Manchester Division Act, 1850), of Saint Paul, Withington, and partly out of the Parish (sometime District) of Christ Church, Barlow Moor Road, Didsbury, both within the original limits of the Parish of Manchester, in the County of Lancaster and in the Diocese of Manchester:
