And whereas one of the Patrons of the Rectory of the said Parish of Saint Paul, Withington, has not signified his assent to the said Scheme:

And whereas a period of more than two calendar months has elapsed since the transmission of the drafts of the said Scheme as aforesaid:

And whereas one of the Patrons of the Rectory of the said Parish of Christ Church, Barlow Moor Road, Didsbury, has offered certain objections to the said Scheme:

And whereas notwithstanding the said objections the said Scheme has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said Scheme, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts.

And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of Manchester.

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Act of the 33rd and 34th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 39, and of the Acts therein mentioned, that is to say, the Act of the 3rd and 4th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 113, the Act of the 4th and 5th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 39, and the Act of the 31st and 32nd years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 114, duly prepared, and laid before His Majesty in Council, a Scheme bearing date the 14th day of July, 1932, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of the Act of the 33rd and 34th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 39, and of the Acts therein mentioned, that is to say, the Act of the 3rd

and 4th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 113, the Act of the 4th and 5th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 39, and the Act of the 31st and 32nd years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 114, have prepared and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council the following Scheme for effecting a transfer of the ownership of the Advowson or perpetual right of Patronage of and presentation to the Church and Cure (hereinafter called 'the said Benefice') of Rattlesden, in the County of Suffolk, and in the Diocese of Saint Edmundsbury and Ipswich:

"Whereas by a Codicil dated the 12th day of December, 1929, to the Will dated the 15th day of February, 1924, of the late Reverend Ernest John Wild, of Saxonhurst, Wadhurst, in the County of Sussex, Clerk in Holy Orders, the Advowson or perpetual right of Patronage of and presentation to the said Benefice of Rattlesden was devised to the Bishop of Saint Edmundsbury and Ipswich for the time being:

"And whereas the said Ernest John Wild died on the 16th day of September, 1931:

"And whereas William Wild, of Number 43, Mincing Lane, in the City of London, Solicitor, and Gladys Lavinia Mary Wild, of Saxonhurst, Wadhurst, in the said County of Sussex, Spinster, are the executors of the said Will in whom but for the hereinbefore recited devise the said Advowson would now be vested, and they are desirous with a view to the confirmation of the said devise that the whole Advowson or perpetual right of Patronage of and presentation to the said Benefice of Rattlesden should be transferred to and be vested in the Bishop of Saint Edmundsbury and Ipswich for the time being in the manner hereinafter recommended and proposed:

"And whereas the Right Reverend Walter Godfrey, now Bishop of Saint Edmundsbury and Ipswich, is willing to accept such transfer, and in token of such his willingness and also in token that the same transfer has that consent of the Bishop of the Diocese which by the hereinbefore mentioned Acts or by some or one of them is made necessary he the said Walter Godfrey, Bishop of Saint Edmundsbury and Ipswich, has executed this Scheme as hereinafter mentioned:

"And whereas the transfer of the Patronage of the said Benefice of Rattlesden which is hereinbefore mentioned and hereinafter recommended and proposed will in our opinion tend to make better provision for the cure of souls in the Parish or District in or in respect of which the right of Patronage or Advowson so recommended and proposed to be transferred as aforesaid arises or exists, that is to say, in the Parish of Rattlesden:

"Now, therefore, with the consent of the said William Wild and Gladys Lavinia Mary Wild (in testimony whereof they have signed and sealed this Scheme) and with the consent of the said Walter Godfrey, Bishop of Saint Edmundsbury and Ipswich (in testimony whereof he has signed this Scheme and sealed the same with his Episcopal Seal), and by way of confirmation of the hereinbefore recited devise by the Will of the said Ernest John Wild, we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, humbly recommend and propose that upon and from the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette
