*Contraction of the Worcestershire Foot-and-Mouth Disease Infected Area.*

Substitutes the following Area for the Infected Area described in the Schedule to the Foot-and-Mouth Disease (Infected Areas) Order of 1932 (No. 8):—

An Area comprising:—

*In the county of Worcester.*

The parishes of Little Malvern, Malvern Wells, Great Malvern, Castlemorton, Welland and so much of the parishes of Hanley Castle and Guarlford as lie to the west and south of the road which runs from Welland in a north-north-easterly direction via Hanley Swan and Blackmore Park to Priestfield and thence in a northerly direction to the Rhydd-Guarlford road and thence in a westerly direction via Guarlford to Great Malvern.

*In the county of Hereford.*

The parish of Colwall and so much of the parish of Mathon as lies to the east of the road which runs from Coddington in a northerly direction via Old Country House, Moorend Cross and Hackney Cross, so much of the parish of Ledbury Rural as lies to the east of the road which runs from Ledbury in a north-easterly direction to Little Malvern and so much of the parish of Eastnor as lies to the north of the road which runs from Hollybush in a westerly direction via Eastnor to Ledbury.
