Four Hackney Carriages:

In centre of roadway, commencing at a point twentyfive feet South-west of the building line of St. John's Wood Road, extending South-westward as far as necessary for four carriages.

Front of vehicles toward the North-east.

AT MILLBANK,

WESTMINSTER, S.W.

Ten Hackney Carriages:

On East side of roadway, commencing at a point opposite the Northern side of Main Entrance to the National Gallery of Modern British Art, extending Northward, by kerb, as far as necessary for ten carriages.

Front of vehicles toward the South.

4th August, 1932.

AT ARGYLL ROAD,

KENSINGTON.

Four Hackney Carriages:

In centre of roadway, commencing at a point fortysix feet North of the kerb line on the North side of Kensington High Street, extending Northwards as far as necessary for four carriages.

Front of vehicles toward the South.

Provided that no Hackney Carriage shall be suffered to stand across any street or thoroughfare, or opposite the end of any street or carriage-way, or upon any place where foot passengers usually cross the carriage-way.

## MERCHANDISE MARKS ACT, 1926.

In accordance with the provisions of Section 2, Sub-section (4) of the Merchandise Marks Act, 1926, the Board of Trade give notice that in pursuance of applications received by them for the making of Orders in Council to require imported goods of certain classes and descriptions to bear an indication of origin, they have made a reference to the Standing Committee appointed by them under

the Act in respect of the following classes and descriptions of imported goods:---

(1) Cordage, cables, ropes and twine of vegetable fibres.

(2) Measuring tapes made of cotton or linen.

(3) Stationers' sundries of the following descriptions:—

(1) Drawing Pins;

(2) Arch mechanisms for letter files; Metal fittings for flat folders and files; Perforators for use in connection with arch mechanisms and flat folders and files;

(3) Stapling machines;

(4) Pencil sharpeners.

Attention is called to the fact that, while under the provisions of the above Act, the Committee must in every case referred to them consider whether the goods should bear an indication of origin at the time of sale or exposure for sale, they may also at their discretion consider and report upon the question whether such goods should bear an indication of origin at the time of importation.
